INTRODUCTION

This Parks and Recreation Plan is a general, long-range development tool used to achieve and maintain a high-quality park, recreation, and open-space system. It evaluates the needs of the community and makes strategic recommendations for recreation, beautification, and economic development to be implemented over the next five years.

The City of Allegan has established the importance of recreation to the area's quality of life by maintaining up-to-date Recreation Plans and the active Public Spaces Commission. This plan represents the ideas of city officials and residents through meetings and public input. This plan should be a working document that is frequently used for guidance and updated if necessary. The next complete update of the plan should occur in 2028.

COMMUNITY DESCRIPTION

REGIONAL CONTEXT

Allegan was founded in 1838 as a village and incorporated into a city in 1907. The City of Allegan is the county seat of Allegan County and is in the south-central portion of the county. It is located 30 minutes from Grand Rapids, Kalamazoo, and The Lake Michigan Shoreline.

AREA TO BE SERVED

The service area of this parks and recreation plan in confined to the Allegan City Limits, covering approximately 4.62 square miles.



PLAN FOCUS


The recreation plan was prepared for the City of Allegan. The plan focuses on providing recreation opportunities to residents of the City of Allegan through the acquisition, development, and maintenance of community-owned parks. While the primary focus is on providing the area's residents with recreation opportunities, improvements to the area's park system will benefit adjoining townships and nearby communities, schools, and visitor experiences.

ADMINISTRATIVE STRUCTURE

STRUCTURES AND FUNCTIONS

The following section identifies the administrative structure for the City of Allegan. It also describes the functions regarding parks and recreation for the city. The City of Allegan is a Home Rule City with a Council/Manager form of government. The City Council is the highest elected body and consists of a mayor and six council members. The Public Spaces Commission is an advisory body to the City Council and consists of nine members.

FUNDING SOURCE

The funding for the Parks and Recreation budget is provided by the City of Allegan and does not have any outside sources of funding for their recreational park improvements. They expect to receive funding from private sources to match state funds. They also have a sinking fund and foundations.

VOLUNTEER PROGRAMS & COMMUNITY RELATIONSHIPS

The city utilizes volunteer efforts and community relationships when possible but does not currently have a specific group of volunteers.

CITY OWNED RECREATION FACILITIES

Below is a list of recreation facilities owned by the City of Allegan.

Cook Street Park

Cook Street Park is 0.2 acres in size and is located between Cook and River Streets. The park includes a flowing open drain through it as well as the following facilities:

- Paved pathway
- Picnic table



Water Street Riverfront Park is 0.9 acres in size and is located north of Water Street along the Kalamazoo River, behind several businesses on Water Street. The pathway starts at the intersection of Locust Street and Water Street with a pavilion and follows the Kalamazoo River southeast to the 7-acre Mill District at the intersection of Mill District Road and Water Street. The park includes the following facilities:

- Pavilion
- Picnic table
- Benches
- Drinking Fountain
- Decorative lighting
- Boardwalk
- Paved sidewalks with brick pavers
- Accessible parking

Allegan Dam Access Point

Allegan Dam Access Point Park is .68 acres in size and is in the Mill District by the city owned dam near the Second Street Bridge. The park includes the following facilities:

- Accessible parking
- Paved walkways
- Bench
- Canoe/kayak launch







James E. Mahan Park

James E. Mahan Park is 0.7 acres in size and is located to the east of Riverfront Park. The park includes the following facilities:

- Gazebo
- Amphitheater-style seating
- Picnic tables
- Plaques
- Paved sidewalks
- Lighting



Proposed improvements in 2024 include replacing the gazebo with a steel band shell structure, installing more accessible seating areas, and additional landscaping.

Allegan Wellness and Sports Complex

Allegan Wellness and Sports Complex, located at 29th street and 114th Avenue, is 63 acres in size and is the area's primary area for active recreation activities. Although the park is located east of the City in Allegan Township it is owned and maintained by the City of Allegan. The park includes the following facilities:

- 4 Baseball fields
- 2 Softball fields
- Crushed gravel/dirt parking lot with paved accessible parking spots
- Batting cage
- Football field
- 4 Soccer fields
- Picnic shelter (30'x60') with picnic tables
- Additional benches throughout
- Restroom facilities with water and electricity
- Signage with rules
- Concession building with benches and picnic tables
- Playground equipment
- Maintenance shed
- A paved 10' wide, 1-mile pathway the circles the perimeter of the park and provides a connection to a 0.6-mile trail Eastern Avenue through the woods.





Rossman Esplanade

Rossman Esplanade is 2.5 acres in size and is located at the intersection of Marshall and Fifth Streets. The park is composed of four quadrants that are separated by two streets. The park includes the following facilities:

- Picnic tables (north & west quadrants)
- 2 fenced in pickleball courts (east quadrant)
- Labyrinth Park with benches (south quadrant)



Improvements in 2024 include resurfacing the pickleball courts, installing new benches, a drinking fountain, and outdoor games to include cornhole and ping pong tables.

Sue Lange Memorial Park

Sue Lange Memorial Park is 0.4 acres in size and is a small formal garden located at the corner of Bond Street and Marshall Street. The park includes the following facilities:

- · Decorative fountain
- Park benches
- Decorative lighting



Riverfront Park

Riverfront Park is 1.3 acres in size and is a large part of Allegan's identity, since it is very visible to travelers on M-89 and showcases Downtown and the City's location on the Kalamazoo River. The park includes 600 linear feet of boardwalk along the riverfront which links Hanson Park on the west end and James E. Mahan Park on the east end. There are views of downtown Allegan, the historic Second Street bridge, M-89, and a lily pond from the boardwalk. The park includes the following facilities:

- Fountains in the Kalamazoo River
- Fishing pier
- Decorative lights
- Benches
- Picnic tables
- Stage and sculpture
- Veteran's Monument with flagpole
- Plaza and outdoor fireplace
- Seating and landscaping



Hanson Park

Hanson Park is 1.2 acres in size and is located at the west end of Riverfront Park behind Griswold Auditorium and the Library. The park includes the following facilities:

- Gazebo
- Paved parking (shared with Auditorium and Library)
- Paved walkway leading to the playground and connecting to the west end of Riverfront Park
- Decorative streetlights
- Tables (including one accessible table)
- Benches
- Porta-Potty (there are also restrooms available at the adjacent public facilities)
- ADA accessible canoe and kayak launch
- Canoe and kayak storage
- Hammock grove



Allegan Mountain Bike & Hiking Trail

Allegan Mountain Bike & Hiking Trail is approximately 3 miles long and is located on the south side of Hooker Road to the east of Eastern Avenue. The park includes the following facilities:

- Signage
- Parking
- Mountain bike trails and suspension bridge







Jaycee Park


Jaycee Park is 6.2 acres in size and is located on the north side of Monroe Street on the Kalamazoo River. The park is woven into the City's growing network of trails, including the Trestle Trail. The park includes the following facilities:

- Skatepark
- Leash-free dog park
- Full basketball court
- General purpose field with lights
- Picnic shelter (15' x 40')
- Picnic tables
- Restroom facilities
- Signage
- Paved parking lot & walkways
- Grills
- Benches
- Drinking fountain
- Lighting
- Open space areas
- "Kid Kingdom" playground, a 9,700 square foot community-built playground as well as swings, slides, and spring toys.
- 9-Hole disc golf course

RECREATION INVENTORY ACCESSIBILITY EVALUATION

An accessibility assessment was conducted at the time of the recreation inventory. The City of Allegan has worked to increase accessibility to the parks as they are updated and further developed. A brief description of the park's accessibility is below along with a rating based on the following guidelines criteria.

- 1 = none of the facilities/park areas meet accessibility guidelines
- 2 = some of the facilities/park areas meet accessibility guidelines
- 3 = most of the facilities/park areas meet accessibility guidelines
- 4 = the entire park meets accessibility guidelines
- 5 = the entire park was developed/renovated using the principals of universal design

Hanson Park

This park has designated accessible parking adjacent to it and has paved pathways throughout the facility. The recently updated playground is accessible; however, the playground mulch edging is raised and limits entrance and exit opportunities for some. The newly installed swings could include a wheelchair swing. Picnic areas are accessible, and one table is accessible. The canoe/kayak launch is also accessible. Rating: 3

Jaycee Park

This park has paved pathways throughout and ramped linkages to adjacent pathways. This park also has designated accessible parking. Picnic areas are accessible. The small fishing pier is not accessible. Entrance to the pavilion can be challenging due to the raised concrete pad it sits on. The fishing pier is currently not accessible to all. Rating: 3

James E. Mahan Park

This park is very accessible and has a nearby designated car park. However, the park could use ADA seating options.

Rating: 3

Riverfront Park

This park is very accessible and has designated parking along its course. Grades, lack of steps, handrails along the water and other features make it very accessible feature. Rating: 4

Rossman Esplanade

This park is underdeveloped and in need of attention. The sidewalks interior to the park are in poor condition and there is no designated parking (accessible or general parking). The fact that the park is divided by a busy street makes it even less accessible. Rating: 2

Sue Lange Memorial Park

This park is a small garden park, and the only real accessibility issue relates to the lack of any on-site parking. Due to the quiet nature of the park and lack of crowds, creating a designated accessible parking space on the street is probably not necessary but could be considered.

Rating: 4

Trestle Trail Park

This park is very accessible and has a nearby designated car park.

Rating: 5

Allegan Wellness and Sports Complex

This park has nine designated accessible parking spaces on pavement (the remaining parking areas are gravel). The park has paved pathways leading to all areas of the park and grading is not an issue. Accessible picnic tables at the concession area could be added to increase accessibility.

Rating: 4

Water Street Riverfront Park

This park is very accessible and designated parking is included in the nearby joint parking for the park and adjacent businesses.

Rating: 5

Allegan Dam Access Point

The area by the dam provides access to the water for fishing or viewing with adequate railing and ramps at the lower pier. A railing at the upper pier near the dam could be added to increase accessibility.

Rating: 3

Cook Street Park

This park is a small pocket park, and the only real accessibility issue relates to the lack of any on-site parking. Due to the quiet nature of the park and lack of crowds, creating a designated accessible parking space on the street is probably not necessary, but could be considered. An ADA picnic table could also be added. Rating: 3

Allegan Mountain Bike & Hiking Trail

The trail itself is purpose built for mountain biking. The parking lot meets ADA requirements but does not have a designated parking spot.
Rating: 1

The City of Allegan will look to continued public comment throughout the implementation process, especially from those with special needs. Their suggestions play a key role in developing and implementing proposed barrier-free improvements.

DNR RECREATION GRANT INVENTORY

Jaycee Park, 1990, #TF90-235, \$173,900

Construction of a canoe launch, basketball court, play area, site furnishings, restroom building, sitework, ballfields improvements, roads and parking, and landscaping on the Kalamazoo River.

Riverfront Boardwalk, 2002, #TF02-13, \$300,000

Construct 850 feet of riverfront boardwalk and walkways to connect existing boardwalk and rustic park.

Veterans Memorial Park, 2010, #TF10-096, \$45,000

Construction to include fishing platform, paved event space, landscaping, site furniture, interpretive signage, rain garden and parking lot reconfiguration.

Kalamazoo River Canoe/Kayak Launch, 2014, #26-01740, \$100,000

The project centers on the development of a new kayak/canoe launch along the Kalamazoo River. The launch project is the first step in the City's multi-phase plan to deliver more recreation opportunities to its residents and visitors. The launch will be built as a universally accessible floating launch anchored to the shore area via a hinged gangplank allowing it to adjust to varying water levels.

Rossman Park Pickleball Court Renovation, 2023, #RP22-0059, \$112,000

The project centers on the resurfacing of the pickleball courts as Rossman Park and the addition of several park amenities including a new drinking fountain, benches, accessible parking, and outdoor game areas.

OTHER CITY OWNED FACILITIES

The Griswold Auditorium

The Griswold provides meeting rooms and a 600-seat auditorium. The facility is adjacent to Hanson Park and the Allegan District Library on Hubbard Street.

The Regent Theatre

The Regent is a single screen movie theater that has 340 seats and shows first run movies as well as classic showings.

Oakwood Cemetery

The 40-acre cemetery located on Western Avenue is on the National Register of Historic Places and serves some of the same passive recreation functions as the City's Parks.

RECREATION FACILITIES NOT OWNED BY THE CITY OF ALLEGAN

A variety of significant recreational resources are either owned privately, owned by a non-profit organization, or owned by another governmental unit that are located within or near the City of Allegan. The following is a brief description of some nearby parks and recreation opportunities.

Allegan District Library

The library is located on Hubbard Street next to the Griswold Auditorium and Hanson Park on Hubbard Street. The library services the area of Allegan Intermediate School District and provides access to books, periodicals, videos, DVDs, CDs, and audio books, as well as an on-staff reference librarian. The library also has a children's area and librarian who provides programming and cooperative resources with area schools. The Allegan District Library has internet stations available and a fully computerized card catalog system.

Dumont Lake Park

Dumont Lake Park is in Monterey Township, 5 miles north of the city of Allegan, on the northeast shore of Dumont Lake. The park is 18.6 acres in size and provides a place for picnicking, swimming, boating, and fishing.

Littlejohn Lake Park

Littlejohn Lake Park is located on Littlejohn Lake just 3 miles southwest of the city of Allegan. Littlejohn Park encompasses 113 acres of mostly wooded natural public land. Approximately 13 acres of the park is developed with picnic areas, nature trails, a playground, a basketball court, volleyball court, horseshoe court and a swimming beach.

Ely Lake Park and Campground

The park is located within the Allegan State Game Area in Clyde Township, 9 miles from Allegan. Ely Lake Park and Campground offers camping and a swimming beach on Ely Lake. The Park also provides equestrian camping and day riding.

Silver Creek Park and Campground

Silver Creek Park is located within Heath Township, 10 miles from the City of Allegan. The park is primarily an equestrian park and has both day use facilities and a primitive campground. Silver Creek Park is 320 acres in size and connects to 30 miles of horseback riding trails. The park also provides fishing and picnic areas.

Allegan County Fairgrounds

The Allegan County Fairgrounds are approximately 85 acres in size. They are located on the north side of Allegan and surrounded on the east, north and west by the Kalamazoo River. The fair runs during the first week of September.

Allegan Public Schools

The Allegan Public School District serves the City of Allegan and portions of 9 townships. The schools all have a wide variety of outdoor and indoor recreation facilities. These facilities include up to date playgrounds, an aquatic center, and indoor field house.

Boat Launch Sites

There are numerous public boat launch sites near the City of Allegan that are maintained by the Michigan Department of Natural Resources, the launch sites include:

PLANNING & PUBLIC INPUT PROCESS

Planning Process

The Allegan City Council is comprised of 7 residents of Allegan, who are elected to four-year terms by citizens of Allegan. Of the 7 elected council members, a Mayor and Mayor Pro Tem is appointed for a one-year term. The Allegan City Council meets every second and fourth Monday night of each month. Meetings are held at the Allegan City Hall located at 231 Trowbridge Street and start at 7:00 pm. Meeting dates, times and locations are subject to change, but are always posted at City Hall and the city website. The Public Spaces Commission consists of 7 residents of Allegan, a representative of the City Council and a representative of the Downtown Development Authority for a total compensation of 9 members. The commission meets the second Wednesday of every month at 6:30 pm at the Allegan City Hall.

The planning process for this recreation plan update began in 2023. City Staff put together a citizen survey which included questions about age and recreational interest to name a few to gain information about recreational needs and interests of the city. Along with the community input gathered, city staff collected detailed recreation inventories and deficiencies. City Staff used a systems approach to planning which incorporated the information gained from the various forms of public input and the detailed recreation inventories and deficiencies to determine the recreation needs of the city.


Public Input Survey

An online survey of 25 questions was open from September 19, 2023, to October 3, 2023, to gain insight from the City of Allegan residents. The City received 234 responses to the public survey, the largest group of the responses were from citizens of the City of Allegan (39.32%). The survey was posted on the City's website, shared on the City's Facebook page and in local Facebook groups. Through the survey, the city aimed to gather public opinion regarding various parks and recreation opportunities in the City of Allegan. As part of the survey, the city also aimed to collect limited demographic information to better understand the respondents and the lens in which they viewed survey questions.

Over the next several pages the results of the survey are listed and where appropriate additional information is provided. As you will see most of the answers are represented as a bar graph and table while others are just represented by a table; this was done for presentation purposes.


Q1 Where is your primary household located?







Q2 Which of the following age groups does your household consist of? Please select all that apply.







Q4 Does anyone in your household have special needs for park amenities?





Q5 Do you think the City of Allegan Parks are accessible to everyone, including those requiring special needs for accessibility?





Q6 Which of the following would you like to see as an addition to the Allegan Dam, Canoe Portage, and Surrounding Park?









Q9 Which of the following would you like to see as an addition to Cook Street Park?







Q11 Which of the following would you like to see as an addition to James E. Mahan Park?



















Jaycee playground needs to be repaired (too many things broken to list) and cleaned (drug paraphernalia and trash 19 everywhere) before someone's child gets majorly hurt Doing a great job with the river walk programs during friday night, really appreciate the bands and entertainment 20 offered, wish it lasted through out the year, especially for families . I would like to see at least 1 playground be truly accessible. This mean having rubber poured-in-place as the ground covering, wood chips are not accessible. It also means having inclusive equipment. ADA requirements do not make 21 playgrounds truly accessible. I encourage you to look at accessible playground net for more information about what makes a playground truly inclusive for all. I would like to see a permanent Food Truck Park, perhaps in the parking lot where the Thursday Farmers Market is held, a dedicated area in the Mills District, or in one of the unused parking lots off Brady Street. If the food trucks were in one central area it would be so much more convenient for families to enjoy offerings from various trucks at the same time, instead of running from truck-to-truck which is a nuisance. There should be adjacent picnic tables as there are few places nearby to actually eat your food truck offerings. If the food truck area also provided electricity for the vendors, we would not have to shout over noisy, smelly generators. (The city could charge vendors to plug in at a nominal fee.) I would also like to see the area open to food trucks any day of the week so it is not relegated to Mondays between 5-8. In my observation, Food Trucks do not enhance actual retail business during those hours, so permitting them to operate on a more flexible schedule may actually bring revenue into the city. Look to see how other communities operate Food Truck Parks with dining, social and play areas. This could be added to the existing Social District, offering dining, outdoor ping pong, corn hole, giant Jenga, kids sand pit and the like. Wow! I'm sure you are concerned about the few restaurants downtown, but there are some I never go to because they are unimaginative or have limited hours; one that is an occasional treat but has predictable menu; one that I only go to 22 mainly on Trivia Nights; and one that is fun for pinball and ice cream. Food Trucks do not keep me from patronizing restaurants elsewhere; they just give me another reason to come into the city. Finally, thank you for the opportunity to complete this questionnaire. I live a scant mile from the city limits; I shop, play and eat in Allegan, yet I have always gotten the impression that my thoughts so not matter. I contacted the former Mayor about some suggestions and was told, not nicely, that my opinion did not matter as I was not a city taxpayer. When I tell people where I am from it is the same as my address: I am from Allegan not Allegan Township. I love a city that does not love me back. I know I said finally, but it is nice to see new blood in Allegan. Murals like at the Sassy Olive and in the alley behind the business are young and vibrant and that energy is the future of the area. Do not allow 20th century habits prevent you from seeking 21st century outside-the-box innovation. Perhaps the critical mass inside the city limits is limiting, and a permanent community board needs to be formed to make the city and her surrounding area more cohesive.
