
Captain Kenneth Moorefield, <u>Deputy Chief</u>




Investigator & Corporals

Corporal Gary Wilson



When not at work, Corporal Pugh enjoys casting a fishing line, kayaking, or sitting in the woods hunting.




APD Officers

was sworn in by Mayor Mattox in October 2022, as a Certified Officer coming from another agency.









Police Intern Jolie Hewitt

Shop-With-A-Cop


