

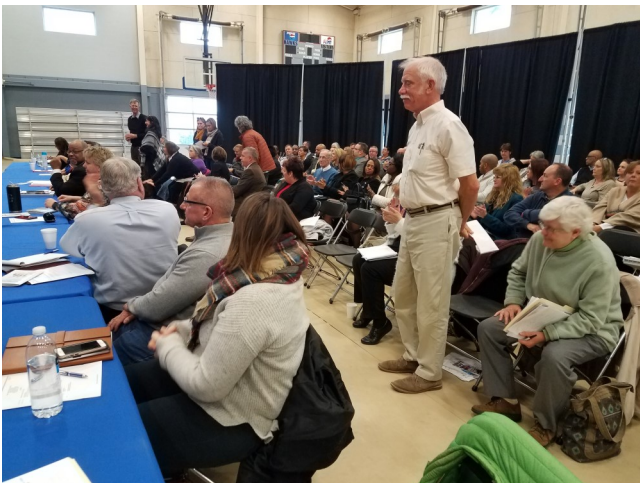


## Ohio Ex-Offenders Reentry Coalition Event

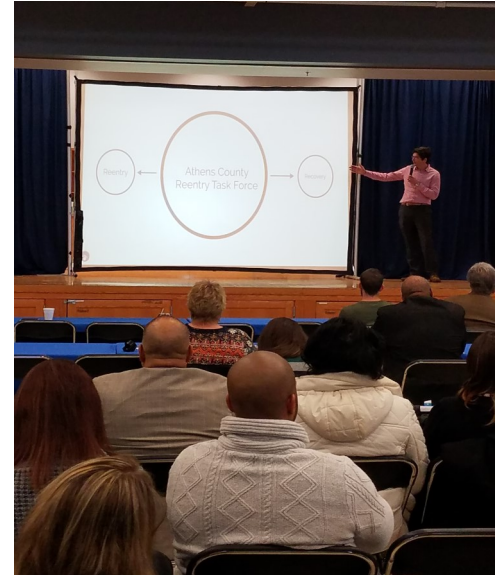
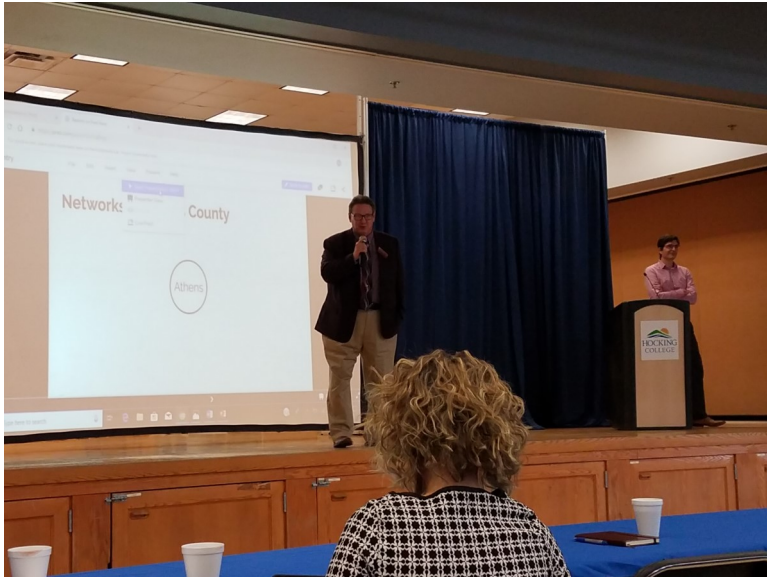

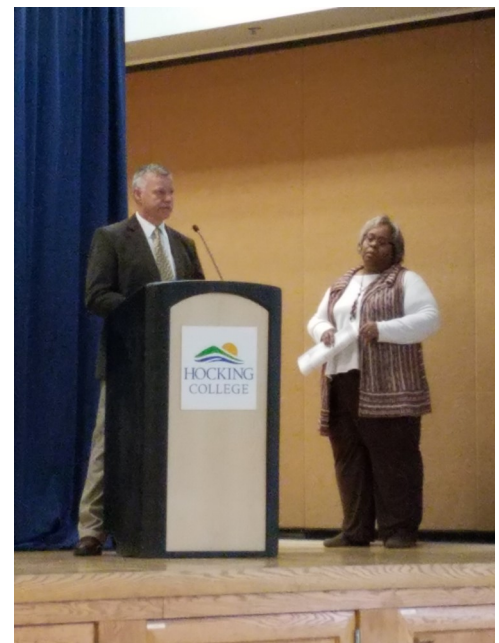
## Ohio Ex-Offenders Reentry Coalition Event
