Emphasis placed on developing the whole child and reflected in a structured environment that fosters language and social skills, problem solving, large and small muscle development, creativity, pre-reading, and math skills. Learning is facilitated through an environment that is relaxed and nurturing where children are encouraged to laugh, play, and express themselves.

Free high quality pre-kindergarten education for eligible 3 and 4 years old is available at Growing Years through the Pennsylvania Pre-K Counts program. Quality Pre-K prepares children for reading and math as well as paying attention, following directions and getting along with others. Pre-Kindergarten gives children an opportunity to learn, become excited about school and be better students. This strong early start means they have a better chance of doing well in school, going on to college or career training, and getting a good job. Early education can open the doors of opportunity for every child to do well in school, in the workforce, and in life.
