PUBLIC HEARING ON PROPOSED 2019/2020 BUDGETS FOR GENERAL FUND, MAJOR & LOCAL ROADS, WATER & SEWER OPERATING AND OTHER SPECIAL REVENUE FUNDS

The proposed 2019/2020 budgets for the Village General Fund, Major & Local Roads, Water & Sewer Operating Fund, and other Special Revenue Funds were reviewed at a Council meeting held on May 7, 2019.

Peddie opened the public hearing on the 2019/2020 budgets at 8:05 pm.

Paula Roddy, East Rutland, asked Wilson to provide an explanation on the water fund account. He explained that the 7% increase in water and sewage will cause account balance to be in the positive in 2019/20 and they will begin to build cash in the fund.

She inquired about the road analysis that was done, Wilson explained that they are working to repair the side streets with the lowest ratings first.

Winters thanked the Council for all their work on the budget.

REVIEW AND CONSIDER ADOPTION OF THE 2019/2020 VILLAGE OF BEVERLY HILLS MILLAGE RATE

REVIEW AND CONSIDER REQUEST TO PURCHASE NEW BOILER AND GENERATOR FOR THE PUBLIC SAFETY DEPARTMENT.

In October of 2017 Public Safety Administration received a report from Johnson Heating and Cooling that the Public Safety Building boiler was no longer in compliance with the State of Michigan standards. In February of 2019, the Village Manager directed Public Safety Administration to obtain a proposal to replace the boiler and control system. Johnson Thermol Temp., Inc. provided a quote of \$88,000 to replace the building boiler. Johnson Heating and Cooling, LLC. provided a quote of \$148,000 to replace the boiler control system. Johnson Thermol Temp., Inc. requires a thirty (30) percent deposit (\$26,400.00). The balance is due upon completion of the project.

Johnson Heating and Cooling, LLC. requires a fifty (50) percent deposit (\$74,000.00) and an additional \$37,000.00 is due when the project is fifty (50) percent complete. The remaining balance is due upon completion of the project. In November of 2018 Michigan CAT was contracted to service the Public Safety Building generator. A system check was performed, and it was recommended the unit be replaced as it had reached the end of its life cycle. Service recommended several repairs that would not guarantee extending the life of the unit. The generator is original to the building and does not power the fire apparatus doors. During a power outage staff must manually open the doors. The doors are left open creating security concerns. Johnson Thermol Temp., Inc provided a quote to replace the generator which would incorporate the use of these doors during a power outage. The \$48,000.00 quote requires a thirty (30) percent deposit (\$14,400.00).

The Public Safety Department has been under contract with both companies to service and maintain the boiler and control system for three years. Johnson Thermol Temp has also provided maintenance on the building generator. Administration is very pleased with the service and expertise. The proposals provided by Johnson Thermol Temp., Inc. and Johnson Heating and Cooling, LLC were provided. Council was provided the equipment evaluations provided by Michigan CAT and Johnson Thermol Temp., Inc.

Per Village Charter Chapter 8, Section 8.7; The Council shall have the authority to make emergency appropriations from general fund surpluses to meet urgent and immediate needs at any time during the budget year within outlined Charter limits. These proposals appear to fall within those guidelines.

Administration recommends approving payment to Johnson Thermol Temp., Inc., located at 58540 Van Dyke Suite 5, Washington, MI. in the amount of \$26,400.00 to begin work on the boiler and \$14,400 to begin work on the building generator.

Administration recommends approving payment to Johnson Heating and Cooling, LLC. located at 59363 Van Dyke Washington Twp., MI. 48094 in the amount of \$74,000.00 to begin work on the boiler control system and additional \$37,000.00 when the project is fifty (50) percent complete.

Motion by Abboud, second by Mooney, be it resolved that the Village of Beverly Hills Council authorize a deposit to begin work and replace the Public Safety Building Boiler Controls, proposal #19021701 to Johnson Heating and Cooling, LLC. for \$74,000.00 and additional \$37,000.00 when the project is fifty (50) percent complete. Funds are available for this purchase in account #401-905-982.00.

Be it resolved that the Village of Beverly Hills Council authorize a deposit of thirty (30) percent to begin work and replace the Public Safety Building Boiler, proposal dated 2-19-19 to Johnson Thermol Temp., Inc. for \$26,400.00. Funds are available for this purchase in account #401-905-982.00.

Be it resolved that the Village of Beverly Hills Council authorize a deposit of thirty (30) percent to begin work and replace the Public Safety Building Generator, proposal dated 2-13-18 to Johnson Thermol Temp., Inc. for \$14,400.00. Funds are available for this purchase in account #401-905-982.00.

MANAGER'S REPORT

14 Mile Paving Project – The poor weather conditions have caused some delays in the paving project on 14 Mile just west of Lahser. Even with the delays, the contractor has made enough progress that we believe that all traffic control can be removed by Friday, May 17th, opening this road up to regular traffic. Further weather delays will likely prohibit the overall project continuing to remain on schedule. Should traffic control be necessary beyond May 17th the Village will provide updated information.

Construction Fences – At the Planning Commission meeting held April 24, 2019, there was discussion on proposed updates to the construction fencing regulations. Currently, the regulations are in Chapter 22, Section 22.08.280 Regulations of Nuisance Activities which has language

regulating the activities and maintenance of a construction site. Planning Commission and Administration discussed the limitations of having such language in the Zoning Ordinance as there are procedural delays to enact changes, as well as the general appropriateness of construction site maintenance regulations located in the Zoning Ordinance. In most communities, this language is in other chapters as a general police power and detailed rules can be generated administratively which allows greater flexibility to add/modify the rules as needed and to provide discretion to address specific circumstances that may arise. There was consensus at the meeting to modify the existing language to require 6-foot, chain link fencing on any demolition and new construction as well as requiring compliance with Building Department Construction Site Maintenance Requirements. Administration has drafted the requirements, a copy is attached, and there is a public hearing scheduled for the May 22, 2019 Planning Commission meeting on the modifications to the ordinance language.

May Newsletter – The May Village newsletter in now available on the Village's website. Newsletters have been sent out in the mail and should be arriving soon. Please note that this newsletter contains a copy of the Village's 2018 water quality report.

COUNCIL COMMENTS

Council thanked Wilson, McCarthy, and Administration for their work on the budget.

PROCLAMATION DECLARING THE FIRST FRIDAY IN JUNE TO BE NATIONAL GUN VIOLENCE AWARENESS DAY

This proclamation declares the first Friday in June to be National Gun Violence Awareness Day in the Village of Beverly Hills to honor and remember all victims and survivors of gun violence and to declare that we as a country must do more to reduce gun violence.

WHEREAS, every day, more than 100 Americans are killed by gun violence and on average there are nearly 13,000 gun homicides every year;

WHEREAS, Americans are 25 times more likely to be killed with guns than people in other high-income countries;

WHEREAS, protecting public safety in the communities they serve is an elected body's highest responsibility;

WHEREAS, support for the Second Amendment rights of law-abiding citizens goes hand-in-hand with keeping guns away from people with dangerous histories;

WHEREAS, mayors and law enforcement officers know their communities best, are the most familiar with local criminal activity and how to address it, and are best positioned to understand how to keep their citizens safe;

WHEREAS, in January 2013, Hadiya Pendleton, a teenager who marched in President Obama's second inaugural parade and was tragically shot and killed just weeks later, should be now celebrating her 22nd birthday;

WHEREAS, to help honor Hadiya – and the 100 Americans whose lives are cut short and the countless survivors who are injured by shootings every day – a national coalition of organizations has designated June 7, 2019, the first Friday in June, as the 5th National Gun Violence Awareness Day;

WHEREAS, the idea was inspired by a group of Hadiya's friends, who asked their classmates to commemorate her life by wearing orange; they chose this color because hunters wear orange to announce themselves to other hunters when out in the woods and orange is a color that symbolizes the value of human life;

WHEREAS, anyone can join this campaign by pledging to Wear Orange on June 7th, the first Friday in June in 2019, to help raise awareness about gun violence;

WHEREAS, by wearing orange on June 7, 2019 Americans will raise awareness about gun violence and honor the lives of gun violence victims and survivors; and

WHEREAS, we renew our commitment to reduce gun violence and pledge to do all we can to keep firearms out of the wrong hands, and encourage responsible gun ownership to help keep our children safe.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Lee Peddie, Council President of the Village of Beverly Hills, do hereby proclaim the first Friday in June, June 7, 2019, to be National Gun Violence Awareness Day. I encourage all residents to support their local communities' efforts to prevent the tragic effects of gun violence and to honor and value human lives.

VILLAGE MANAGER'S REPORT CHRIS D. WILSON MAY 17, 2019

Park Buckthorn Removal Update – Saturday, May 11th saw some significant progress made toward the eventual removal of the buckthorn debris. A number of local volunteers showed up and worked very hard under less than ideal conditions to clear, stack and chip a significant amount of debris. An area on the north end of the project area is being cleared to allow for a first round of tree planting later this month. Village Administration is also working to clear some drains that appear to be plugged that will hopefully allow this area to dry out as soon as possible. The park rangers continue to work to move and stack debris. Village Administration met with NCS on the project site this week to examine the progress to date and plan for the remainder of the season. NCS will be back on site in late June with a significant amount of labor to hand carry debris to be chipped. The current wet conditions inhibit the collection of cut material in a significant portion of the project area at this time. Nevertheless, we will continue to collect the debris from the areas we can. Chipped material that can be used will be placed along the path. Some of the larger felled logs will also be used to line the foot paths. There has been a lot of work put into this project to date. I anticipate that the cleanup progress will accelerate as the conditions improve. Again, thank you to all the volunteers for your effort.

Village Healthcare Renewal – Village Administration met with our insurance agent for the Village's health care policies for the upcoming year. For the plan year 2020 (August 1, 2019 – July 31, 2020) the Village's overall health care costs will increase by 0.07%. In the budget for FY 2020 the Village anticipated an increase of 5.0% for heath care premiums. Over the last three (3) years, the Village's overall health care costs have increase by an average -0.68%. Village Administration has worked closely with our agent, IBEX Insurance Agency to consistently monitor and evaluate our plans and to offer a plan that provides affordable and comprehensive coverage for our employees in a cost-effective way. The Village has been able to maintain our level of coverage to our employees and retirees and has remained compliant with the maximums for health care costs established by Public Act 152.



Memorial Day is on the horizon, marking the unofficial start of the summer season. As people host barbecues and pool parties to celebrate, personal firework shows are sure to be heard throughout the neighborhood. Before lighting up the night, there are new laws to keep in mind. In December, new measures were signed into law that reduce the number of days fireworks can be used, give local government more power to regulate the devices.

What types of fireworks are legal in Michigan?

Consumer fireworks

- Bottle rockets
- Missile type rockets
- Aerials
- Reloadable shell devices
- Firecrackers
- Helicopter/aerial spinners

When can I shoot off fireworks?

The new law, House Bill 5939, has <u>significantly reduced the number of days one can shoot off</u> <u>fireworks, from 30 to 12.</u> While the initial law allowed people to light fireworks around federal holidays, the new measure has limited displays to these dates:

- Dec. 31 until 1 a.m. on Jan. 1
- The Saturday and Sunday immediately preceding Memorial Day until 11:45 p.m. on each of those days.
- June 29 to July 4 until 11:45 p.m. on each of those days.
- July 5, if that date is a Friday or Saturday, until 11:45 p.m.
- The Saturday and Sunday immediately preceding Labor Day until 11:45 p.m. on each of those days.

Those who violate the ordinance will receive a fine of \$1,000 for each offense. The ordinance must provide for the remittance of \$500 of the fine collected under the ordinance to the local law enforcement agency responsible for enforcement.

Can I display fireworks anywhere?

No, a person cannot light fireworks on public property, such as schools, churches, or the property of another person without their permission. Those who violate the law can pay a fine as much as \$500.

Can anyone sell fireworks?

According to the Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs (LARA), a person cannot sell consumer fireworks unless they have a fireworks certificate. Applications can be completed online and must be submitted by April 1 for the upcoming fireworks season.

- A person must pay a \$1,250 fee for each retail location that is a permanent building or structure, or a \$1,000 fee for each temporary structure. If the application includes 10 or more retail locations that are not permanent buildings or structures, the fee is \$700.
- The certificate is valid until April 30 of the following year.

What if I sell fireworks in a temporary space?

• Under a new law that takes effect on Aug. 1, local governments with a population of 100,000 people or more or a local government located in a county with a population of

750,000 or more will have the authority to regulate temporary structures, such as tents or stands. This can include a restriction on the number of permits issued for a temporary structure, regulation of the distance required between two or more temporary structures, or a zoning ordinance.

Can fireworks be banned?

• Yes, but only under weather conditions. The governor, the state fire marshal or the head of the Department of Natural Resources can ban fireworks use in a county because of dry conditions. In addition, local fire chiefs have the authority to impose burn bans in their jurisdictions if the DNR has issued a fire risk criteria to "very high" for 72 hours.

Can I still operate fireworks while drinking alcohol?

- A person is prohibited from using fireworks while under the influence of alcohol, drugs, or a combination of the two. A \$1,000 fine may be issued for those who violate the law.
