TABLED ITEM: SPECIAL ORDER OF BUSINESS – UPDATE FROM OAKLAND COUNTY EXECUTIVE OFFICE

Chief Deputy County Executive, Hilarie Chambers joined the meeting at 7:48 p.m. and provided an update from the Oakland County Executive Office regarding the County's response to COVID-19. Chambers discussed the Dashboard on Oakland County's website which shows positive cases and fatalities. She noted that there have been many recoveries. She spoke on the three drive-thru testing sites available to residents. She discussed the County's phased reopening plan and referred everyone to Oakland County's COVID-19 Safety Playbook. Chambers also discussed senior living facility testing, using Michigan Works! as a resource for unemployment, small business grants, and the CARES Act.

WHEREAS, the Village Council of Beverly Hills has adopted its annual budget for its fiscal year beginning July 1, 2020 in accordance with State law and the Village Charter;

WHEREAS, the Village Council must also adopt a millage rate to be levied on the Village tax roll for 2020;

WHEREAS, Act 298 of 1917 allows cities and villages to levy a tax not to exceed 3 mils for the purposes of garbage collection and disposal. The annual rubbish tax shall be in addition to the amount authorized to be levied for general purposes; and

WHEREAS, Public Act 5 of 1982 does not apply to levying for Debt Service.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Village Council does hereby approve the total 2020 millage rate for the Village at 12.8053 mils and the 12.8053 millage rate is to be distributed as follows:

REVIEW AND CONSIDER APPROVAL OF BUILDING DEPARTMENT FEE SCHEDULE

Administration has conducted its annual review of applicable fees for building and planning services and is proposing to increase fees effective June 1, 2020. The last modification to building permit, planning review, and zoning review fees was in 2018. There is also a proposed increase to the rental licensing and inspection fee schedule, which has not been changed since 2009. A marked up and clean version of the fee schedules for consideration were included in the packet.

The increases will help offset continued increases in costs by the Village for administration and enforcement of the Building Code and Zoning Ordinance, compliance with statutory requirements, and other applicable standards for ensuring the safe and desirable development in Beverly Hills.

The deadline for applications is Wednesday, June 10, 2020. Applications are available on the Village's website or by emailing the Village Clerk at krutkowski@villagebeverlyhills.com.

This constitutes the first announcement of the vacancies with appointments scheduled to take place at the June 16, 2020 regular Village Council meeting.

Nunez inquired about the minimum requirements for board and commission membership.

Ryan stated Planning Commission and Zoning Board of Appeals have minimum membership requirements per state law.

MANAGER'S REPORT

Village Hall Reopening Process – Village Administration continues to move forward with a plan for reopening Village Hall pending an anticipated lifting of restrictions per the current terms of the Stay Home Executive Order. Assuming the current Order is lifted upon its expiration on May 28th, we will proceed with a reopening of the Village Hall on Monday, June 1st. Village Administration is producing a document that will detail all the safety, cleaning and distancing protocols for employees and the public upon reopening.

Village Meetings – As discussed at the last meeting, the Executive Order allowing teleconference meetings for local public bodies has been extended through June 30th. However, if the Stay Home Order sections pertaining to local governments is lifted as of May 28th it would allow for public meetings to be held in Village Hall pursuant to proper social distancing guidelines being followed.

Oak Tree Giveaway – In celebration of Oakland County’s bicentennial, the Oakland County Board of Commissioners, with the support of the County Executive, created a program to provide oak tree seedlings to local communities. The Village will have approximately 175 free oak tree seedlings (Bur Oak, Swamp White Oak, and White Oak) available for residents to plant on their private property. Seedlings can be picked up from the Village Hall parking lot (18500 W. 13 Mile Road) beginning Thursday, May 21, 2020 at 9:00 a.m. (limit two per household). They will be available on a first come, first serve basis. Please follow social distancing guidelines while picking up the seedlings and stay at least 6 feet away from others. We thank Oakland County for implementing this program. More information on Oakland County’s Oak Tree Program is included as an Information Item at the end of this packet.

2020 Census – As of Wednesday, May 13th, the Village had a Census response rate of 85.5%. This was the 3rd highest response rate in Michigan and 52nd highest in the United States.

Memorial Day Parade Replay – Since the Memorial Day Parade was cancelled this year, BCTV will be broadcasting a replay of last year’s parade on Memorial Day. The Gratitude Steel Band is also working to record a concert to be broadcast on Memorial Day in lieu of their annual performance in the Village.

Mueller reported that a spray treatment for buckthorn at Beverly Park is scheduled for Wednesday, May 20.

Abboud thanked military members for their service and wished everyone a happy Memorial Day.

Peddie announced and congratulated the recipients of the 2020 Greening Scholarship Awards: Nolan Kamoo, Autumn Reed-Nordwall, Leo Williams, and Megan Zacharias.

Re: FY 2019-2020 Budget Amendments

Attached are proposed FY 2019-2020 Village of Beverly Hills Budget Amendments.

There are General Fund amendments adjusting various revenue and expenditure accounts. The largest revenue amendment is for the reduction in building permits due to the shutdown because of COVID19. There is also a revenue amendment of \$71,438 for the Pat Greening Estate donation. The largest expenditure amendment is for the reduction of fees paid to Safebuilt. The effect of the amendments is a net revenue over expenditure increase of \$198,723.

In Major Roads and Local Roads there are amendments reducing expenditures to expected actuals in the amount of \$44,000 and \$48,000 respectively.

In the Water fund there is an adjustment for necessary unbudgeted maintenance beneath 13-mile road of \$22,000.

In the Drug Enforcement fund there is an amendment to adjust the equipment account to indicate no purchases will be made in FY20.

In the Public Safety Fund there are various expenditure adjustments to expected actuals, many due to COVID19, as well as a decrease in capital furniture and an increase in capital public safety equipment due to the purchase of a Lucas Machine for medical runs. The effect of the amendments is a net revenue over expenditure increase of \$183,200.

These proposed FY 2019-2020 Budget Amendments have been reviewed by Village Administration and are recommended for approval.

Recommended Resolution

Be it resolved that the Village of Beverly Hills Council authorizes Village Administration to transfer or adjust monies reserved in the General, Major Roads, Local Roads, Public Safety, Drug Enforcement and Water Fund as reflected in the May 29, 2020 memorandum from Finance Director, Sheila McCarthy.

VILLAGE MANAGER'S REPORT

Village Operations During Stay Home Order – On May 22nd Governor Whitmer issued Executive Order 2020-100, extending many of the terms of the existing Stay Home Order (EO 2020-96) through Friday, June 12th. I reviewed the terms of the revised Order with Village Attorney Ryan and President Peddie and it was determined that per this order the Village Offices would need to remain closed to the public until Monday, June 15th and Village staffing should continue on a limited basis in the Village Hall with employees working from home when they can. I have modified the work schedule through Friday, June 12th, with slightly more staff than before as call volumes and building dept activity have increased. As of June 15th, all staff are planning to report on all business days. The building will also be opened to necessary business only. Visitors will be required to wear a mask to enter the building and maintain social distance while in the building. Village Administration is continuing to finalize our COVID workplace manual as is being required by the State and will have it in place prior to June 15th.

As the building will not be open to the public, we will be waiving late fees for water payments through June 30th. The Village will be able to accept payments for water bills and building permit fees online via credit card or electronic check (\$3 fee) by June 15th. Passport applications are not being accepted until further notice. We have also been getting asked about garage sale permits. We have not been issuing garage sale permits or estate sale permits due to the limitations on gatherings to 10 people or less. Should this gathering limit increase in the future we can consider issuing garage sale permits again, with the onus on the applicant to enforce social distancing on their own property. Pavilion reservations have been canceled through June 12th and renters will receive a 100% refund.

13 Mile Reconstruction – There will be a preconstruction meeting on the 13 Mile Road Project on Tuesday, June 2nd. I will have more information about this project to report on at the meeting later that evening. The project is still scheduled to begin on Monday, June 15th. This will obviously be one of the most impactful road construction projects that we will have had for a long time.

Household Hazardous Waste and Other Items – The SOCRRA facility on Coolidge remains closed to the public. This has created a backlog of some household hazardous waste (HHW), electronics and other items normally dropped off at the MRF. SOCRRA has been able to partner with three regional vendors to arrange drop off services for HHW, electronics and paper shredding/cardboard and paper recycling. I have attached a flyer with the descriptions of the materials that can be dropped off at various locations.
