

LAND GRANT SIGNED BY PATRICK HENRY IN 1875 TO BE HUNG IN JUSTICE CENTER

The ancient ink on the sheepskin document may have faded over the decades, but there is no mistaking the signature of Patrick Henry, Governor of Virginia, on this Land Grant, giving 2000 acres near Big Bone Lick to Samuel McDowell (1735-1817), Revolutionary War hero. The document was dated 1786, six years before Kentucky gained statehood. The tract of land was part of Fayette County, Virginia before that time.

The Land Grant will be displayed publicly for the



first time at the May 17 meeting of the Boone County Historical Society. It will then be hung in the Boone County Justice Center in Burlington.

The document has been re-framed in archival-safe materials and under muse-um-quality glass by Tom Gaither Gallery in Ludlow, who donated a portion of the cost.

KENTUCKY HISTORICAL HIGHWAY MARKERS TO BE DEDICATED

The Bullittsburg Baptist Historical Marker Dedication will be 2 pm Sunday, June 3, following 10:30 service and a pitch-in dinner.

The Dedication of the Historical Marker at Hopeful Lutheran Church will be Sunday, June 24 at 2 pm followed by a reception given by Boone Germanna.

The Boone County Historical Society began the long application process for historical markers for Hopeful Lutheran Church and Bullittsburg Baptist Church in 2011. The process required extensive research and written accounts of each church's history. This task was accomplished by Michael Rouse (Hopeful Lutheran) and Norma Hennigen (Bullittsburg Baptist).

The cost of each was \$2,500. BCHS Treasurer Steve Conrad kept in frequent contact with representatives of the Ky. Department of Highways and the local KY. Historical Marker

Coordinator Dennis Vesper. Finally word came from Frankfort that both applications had been approved!

One last meeting was held just last month to determine the exact location of each of the markers.

A committee has begun work to determine future sites of historical significance where highway markers would be appropriate. The committee members are Bruce Ferguson, Matt Becher, Michael Rouse, Yvonne Hempfling Edwards, and Wilma McMillian.
