WATSON CRAFT PRESENTS "STORIES OF WWII" 7 PM, THURSDAY, JANUARY 17

Watson Craft grew up in the mountains of Eastern Kentucky. The youngest in a family of 17, he learned the vocation of farming at a very young age.

He received a Bachelor degree from Berea College, then earned two Masters degrees at the University of Kentucky – one in teaching, the other in administration. He managed a college farm while still a student.

He began teaching school in Mason County, then taught at Hebron High School. When the merger of Boone County's schools took place in 1954, he began teaching Vocational Agriculture, Physical Science and other subjects at Boone County High School.

He met and married his wife, Minerva, who spent her career as a school teacher. They had two daughters, both of whom also became school teachers. Three of his five grandchildren continued in the honorable profession



of education, with two teaching at Walton Verona and one teaching at Erlanger Lloyd.

Mr. Craft served our country during World War II, and will speak on his harrowing experiences in the Navy's submarine service. The Boone County

HISTORIC MARKERS UPDATE

The Boone County Historical Society has received notice of approval of both historic marker applications: first, CSA General John Hunt Morgan's 1863 escape through Boone County from the federal prison in Columbus, Ohio, and, second, the commemoration of the historic Anderson Ferry on one side, and the 1937 Flood on the other.

Details are currently being finalized with the foundry representatives, after which we will be working with the Kentucky Historical Society to plan the dedication ceremonies.

Remember the Raisin: Boone County and the War of 1812.

7pm Tuesday, Jan. 22, Main Library. Presented by Tom Schiffer. Captain Uriel Sebree and his Boone County Company of Kentucky Militia were caught in the Battle of the River Raisin in late January of 1813 near Frenchtown, Michigan. The entire company of 61 men were either killed or captured in the resulting massacre by British and Native American forces. This was a significant event in Boone County's history.
