DR. JAMES HUEY'S
SERVICE IN THE U.S. CAVALRY
IN WWII
7 PM, THURSDAY, MARCH 21

Dr. James Huey is, without a doubt, a WWII Hero, and a member of, as author Tom Brokaw identifies them, "The Greatest Generation."

Born in 1916, Dr. Huey graduated from New Haven High School (near Union) in 1933, enrolled in UK's pre-med program, and waited tables to earn enough to pay his rent and tuition. He graduated from U.of L. Medical School in 1940. During his internship in St. Elizabeth Hospital in Covington, he married Cordella Turner, R.N., nicknamed "Corky."

After the Japanese bombed Pearl Harbor on Dec. 7, 1941, Dr. Huey enlisted in the U.S. Army. His service to our country included attending the sick and wounded on the 350-mile jungle march through Burma, an event detailed in John Randolph's book, *Marsmen in Burma*.

Later, he was named the Assistant Surgeon of the Southern Combat Command, and rode by Jeep or on a Chinese pony to inspect medical facilities in Chinese Divisions. He was then assigned to Shanghai's prisoner internment camp where English businessmen had been held prisoners by the Japanese. He returned home in late 1945, and began his long-time medical practice in Walton.

HISTORIC MARKERS UPDATE

The recently approved markers are being cast at the foundry at this writing. The marker commemorating CSA General John Hunt Morgan's 1863 escape through Boone County from the federal prison in Columbus, Ohio, is to be erected on US 42 in Union, and the one commemorating the historic Anderson Ferry and the 1937 Flood's effect in Constance will be planted on KY 8 at the Anderson Ferry entrance.

The dedication ceremony details will soon be finalized, and after that, we'll begin working on the next marker applications!
