Judy is President and Founder of the Kentucky Philanthropy Initiative and President and CEO of Judith Clabes Associates, consultants in philanthropy.

She taught high school English and Journalism, has authored several books, was a syndicated columnist for Scripps Howard, and is the recipient of numerous national, state and local awards. She has served Kentucky as a reporter, editor and volunteer, giving her time to numerous boards and committees.

Three years ago, she received the Devou Cup from the Northern Kentucky Fund of the Greater Cincinnati Foundation — this award honors someone who has made a profound difference in the quality of community life. She has spent



both her professional and personal time making Kentucky a better place to live.
