The event includes a Chalkfest in which talented sidewalk chalk artists spend the day creating magnificent renderings on the parking lot. The theme of that competition this year is music.


The event includes a display of artwork by Boone County's visual artists, music, and food yendors!

Boone County Historical Society's annual "outand-about" meeting will be held at the historic Richwood Presbyterian Church, established in 1834. Rev. Rhoda Brumfield is the minister of this congregation.



During the brief business meeting portion of this gathering, the BCHS membership will vote on the proposal from the Board of Directors to approve the preparation of an application to the Kentucky Historical Society for two historic markers for 2015: one to



commemorate Dr. George Speri Sperti, scientist and inventor, which would be placed at the Sperti Park off of East Bend Road, Burlington; and the other to commemorate the Petersburg Distillery on one side and, on the opposite side, the Loder House. This marker would be placed along the riverfront park in Petersburg.

The program begins at 7pm Thursday, **July 17, 2014** at the Richwood Presbyterian Church, 1070 Richwood Road, Walton, Kentucky. The public is invited, so bring interested friends and neighbors.

The Boone County Historical Society provides program meetings at 7pm on the third Thursday evenings of January, March, May, July, September and November.

The Society hosts a number of exhibits at the BCHS Museum (see page 3) each year. Most items for these exhibits are borrowed on a temporary basis from our members and friends, and do not belong to the Society.
