Ron Buckley presents "Absolom Graves" 7 pm Thurs., Jan. 17, 2019 Boone Co. Main Library

Due to the unfortunate timing of an ice storm, our November meeting was cancelled. However, our dear friend Ron Buckley has agreed to present his program at the upcoming meeting. We are so fortunate to benefit from his extensive work in the most inaccessible sites in Boone County.

RON will present the third of his series on the PIATT FAMILY OF BOONE COUNTY. The first, presented in January 2014, covered his work on Piatt's Landing, the site of Robert Piatt's home (Duke Energy's complex) along Boone County's shoreline. His second covered his continuing exploration and research on Federal Hall, Robert's brother Jacob Piatt's property near the Judge Cropper Bridge.



This presentation focuses on Absolom Graves, an important Baptist leader in this area, and the first official Clerk of Court in Boone County. The Graves family arrived in Boone in a flat boat in 1797. The site is thought to have been a Civil War outpost for the North.

HISTORIC MARKER DEDICATION DATE: 3PM SAT., MAY 18

The Historic Marker commemorating Stringtown-on-the-Pike/John Uri Lloyd will be dedicated at 3pm Saturday, May 18, 2019 in the City of Florence's newest park, Crossroads Point Plaza. The location is at the corner of Main Street, Dixie Highway, and Turfway Road. The park's completion was delayed because of the discovery of old gas tanks contaminating the soil — folks of a certain age will remember the gas stations that existed decades ago in that area.



The park, shown here before completion, is now finished, however the turf is still a bit muddy, and winter is rapidly approaching, so we have decided to delay the marker dedication until Spring.
