Paul Anderson, Owner of the famous Anderson Ferry, to speak at our September 19 meeting

Paul Anderson, owner and operator of the famous Anderson Ferry, will be our guest at the September 19 Meeting of the Boone County Historical Society. The meeting will begin at 7 pm at the Main Library.



The Anderson Ferry is a ferry across the Ohio River between Cincinnati, Ohio and Constance, Kentucky. It has been in continuous operation since 1817. It was originally

known as the Kottmyer ferry but was later sold to the Anderson family. The ferry was often used in the 19th century by Kentucky farmers bringing their product to market in Cincinnati. It is the lone survivor of dozens of ferries that once served the Cincinnati area. The ferry is located about 8 miles west of Downtown Cincinnati.

We've asked Paul to tell us about what changes have been occurring on the river, and what changes he expects in the future. Don't miss this presentation!
