Finding Baby Wildlife





Spring is baby wildlife season. And as the weather warms, the Pasadena Humane Society gets an increase in calls from good samaritans who have found baby wild animals like squirrels, opossums and birds. Generally, if you find a baby wild animal, the best thing to do is leave it alone.

Many mammals such as deer and rabbits will leave their young unattended for extended amounts of time to avoid drawing in predators. Baby opossums leave their moms when they are about the size of a dollar bill.

While every situation is different, the Pasadena Humane Society created a few flowcharts to help determine what to do if you find a baby wild animal. To learn about these flowcharts, click <u>HERE</u>. If you are still unsure what to do, before removing the animal from the wild, please text a photo of the animal, the location, and a brief description to Pasadena Humane's wildlife helpline at (626) 344-1129 and one of their techs will be able to assist you everyday between the hours of 9am-5pm.

Reminder: You must have a California State wildlife rehabilitation license to legally possess wildlife for more than 72 hours. Improper care of wild animals by well-meaning, but inexperienced rescuers risk serious health problems for wildlife, including improper diet and feeding, potential imprinting, improper and dangerous handling, and overall unnecessary stress of captivity.

Originally launched in 2019, the Residential Plant Voucher Program offers qualifying residents a voucher redeemable for up to \$250 worth of approved climate-appropriate plants to help transform their yards into beautiful water efficient landscapes. The innovative program is a unique approach to incentivize and inspire residents to take that next step in creating healthy and thriving gardens, while saving water.

The program has been reinstated as of March 12, 2024 on a first-come, first-served registration basis. Applicants do have to reside within the Upper District service area to be eligible to receive a voucher.
