## Animal Facts of the Month



Bobcat sightings can be common in Bradbury. These animals are generally seen alone and are most active around sunrise and sunset. It's also not uncommon to find one napping under a

shrub in a bushy backyard.

If you see a bobcat near your home, there is no need to panic. These cats rarely attack people, as they are usually pretty skittish. Bobcats mainly target rabbits but are predators; therefore, small pets and livestock should be protected.

Fun Facts: these cats typically live 12-13 years, males do not play a role in raising kittens, they can reach top speeds of 35 mph, jump as high as 12-feet, and are solitary animals.
