Spinks Canyon Pile Burn Notice

On Monday and Tuesday, February 19 - 20, 2024, the Los Angeles County Fire Department will be conducting a Prescribed/Pile Burn at Spinks Canyon. Ignition is set to begin at 8:00 a.m. and end at 2:00 p.m. each day. Fire personnel will be onsite and will monitor/patrol the burn area throughout the week. The purpose of this Pile Burn is to reduce the excess fuel load from recent brush abatement work completed in the Spinks Canyon area. Smoke may be visible at the base of the foothills and surrounding areas above the cities of Bradbury and Duarte. Residents are encouraged to use caution when driving vehicles entering/leaving the area if affected by smoke. This LHMP update will help our community assess the potential for future disasters, take steps to prepare for them, and make us eligible for additional funding from the federal and state government.


Our LHMP update is being prepared by the City, with support from key stakeholders and technical consultants. Our LHMP will cover four major topics:

- ·Summarize the natural and human-caused hazards that pose a threat to our community
- ·Look at how our community members, buildings, and infrastructure are vulnerable to these hazards
- ·Outline a Hazard Mitigation Strategy, with specific policy recommendations for future actions to help reduce the threat from these hazards
- ·Maintenance procedures for the plan, keeping it current in the face of changing conditions
