# Water-Use Restrictions in Effect

Due to a continuing statewide drought, California American Water has issued water restrictions. They are requesting customers follow common sense rules to conserve water and eliminate waste.

#### Please follow the outdoor watering schedule.

Beginning June 1, 2022, please follow the updated two-day-a-week watering schedule:

Odd-numbered addresses: Tuesday & Saturday

- Even-numbered addresses: Thursday & Sunday
- Water between 8 p.m. and 9 a.m.
- Limit watering to 15 minutes per station per allowed day.
- Drip irrigation and micro-spray are exempt from day-of-week and time limitations.

Turf grass irrigation (irrigation timer or garden hose) only permissible on allowed watering days.

Below are some conservation measures provided by California American Water:

- Eliminate runoff from sprinklers.
- Use an automatic shut-off nozzle on hoses while washing cars.
- Do not irrigate or water outdoors for 48 hours after rain.
- Do not use potable water for non-recirculating fountains, ponds and water features.
- Do not use potable water to wash driveways and other hardscapes.

BEAT THE MOSQUITO HEAT THIS SUMMER!



Summer is here and mosquitoes are roaming. The San Gabriel Valley Mosquito and Vector Control District has some tips for you!

- <u>Tip 'n Toss, Show them who's boss!</u> You know mosquitoes can turn from egg to adult in a week. So eliminate stagnant water weekly in and around the home. Don't forget to keep your pool clean and maintained!
- <u>Repel, Don't Swell</u> Apply repellent to exposed skin to stop mosquito bites. Use oil of lemon eucalyptus, which is EPA-registered and CDC-recommended. Other effective repellents are Picaridin, DEET and IR3535.
- <u>Educate friends, neighbors and family</u> We challenge you to educate at least two more people about mosquitoes. The more we understand that mosquito control is a Shared Responsibility, the more healthy our communities will be!

# **BEING READY- WILDFIRE PREPAREDNESS**

Temperatures are rising and wildfire season is here. Being Ready starts with hardening your home and maintaining adequate Defensible Space around your home and property. Home Hardening means using ignition-resistant materials on and around your home to help it withstand flying embers and radiant heat. Defensible Space is the buffer created by removing dead plants, grass and weeds to help keep wildfire away from your home.

It takes a combination of Home Hardening and Defensible Space to give your house the best chance of surviving a wildfire.

Home Hardening actions to get you started:

- Use or install fire ignition-resistant materials around your home.
- Remove vegetation or debris from your roof, vents, windows, deck and gutters.
- Inspect home for dry rot, gaps or cracks. Caulk gaps greater than 1/8-inch.

Defensible Space actions to get you started:

- Create and maintain the required 100 feet of Defensible Space.
- Cut or mow annual grass down to a maximum height of four inches.
- Ensure all combustible materials are located 30 feet away from your home.
