Living with Bears



The time of year is here! Bears have come out to roam around in Bradbury backyards and pools. The City of Bradbury will be sharing tips throughout the summer so our residents can stay bear safe:

- Pick fruit trees promptly and pick up any produce that falls to the ground.
- Make trash cans inaccessible. Purchase and properly use a bearproof garbage container.
- Wait to put trash out until the morning of collection day.
- Do not leave trash, groceries or pet food in your car.
- Keep garbage cans clean and deodorize them with bleach or ammonia.
- Keep barbecue grills clean and stored in a garage or shed when not in use.
- It is advised to not hang bird feeders in bear country. If you must, only do so during November through March and make them inaccessible to bears. Keep in mind bears are excellent climbers.
- Do not leave any scented products outside, even non-food items such as suntan lotion, insect repellent, soap or candles.
- Keep doors and windows closed and locked when unoccupied.

CLEAN AIR REBATE PROGRAM

South Coast AQMD has two programs that help clean the air through the replacement of gasoline-powered residential lawn mowers and commercial lawn and garden equipment.

The public can receive a rebate of up to \$250 with the purchase of a cordless, battery-electric lawn mower. An operable, gasoline powered lawn mower must be scrapped to be eligible for the rebate. Eligibility is open to residents of South Coast AQMD's jurisdiction. Rebate amounts are based on the purchase price of the new electric lawn mower, not including taxes and delivery. The electric lawn mower purchased must include a battery and charger, and the rebate amount cannot be greater than the purchase price. The rebate process is as follows:

- 1. Purchase your new, cordless electric lawn mower
- 2. Begin the online application, uploading your purchase receipt
- 3. Select a certified scrapper from South Coast AQMD's list and print your certification form
- 4. Take your old working gas mower to the scrapping location and have the scrapper sign and return the certification form to you
- 5. Upload the signed certification form to your application
- 6. Sign and submit your final application electronically for processing

HOW TO BUILD AN EMERGENCY KIT

The kit should include the following:

- Water, one gallon of water per person per day for at least seven days, for drinking and sanitation
- Food, at least a seven-day supply of non-perishable food
- Battery-powered or hand crank radio and a NOAA Weather Radio with tone alert and extra batteries for both
- Flashlight and extra batteries
- · First aid kit
- Whistle to signal for help
- Dust mask to help filter contaminated air, and plastic sheeting and duct tape to shelter-in-place
- Moist towelettes, garbage bags and plastic ties for personal sanitation
- Wrench or pliers to turn off utilities
- Manual can opener for food
- Local maps
- · Cell phone with chargers, inverter or solar charger

EEPING MOSQUITOS AWA

The San Gabriel Valley Mosquito & Vector Control District provides information and tips to stay mosquito safe during the summer.

- 1. Eliminate Breeding Spots: Each week, tip and toss stagnant water around the home.
- 2. Use Insect Repellant: Make sure your repellant has at least one of these ingredients: Picardin, Oil of Lemon, Eucalyptus, DEET or IR3535.
- 3. Lock them Out: Making sure all window and door screens are in good repair on your property.
- 4. Make the Switch: Tropical plants are a mosquito oases! Consider California native plants to attract less mosquitos.
