OCTOBER IS BREAST CANCER AWARENESS MONTH

No matter who you are or where you live, breast cancer may touch your life. It's necessary to understand the warning signs of breast cancer, your risk of breast cancer and what's normal for you so you can take action.

Every day, more than 700 women in the U.S. are diagnosed with breast cancer. For these women, the impact of breast cancer extends well beyond the single month dedicated to awareness. This October, get involved. Spread awareness! There are a variety of ways you can stay aware, get involved, and help educate others such as:

Knowing your Risk - Knowing your family history is lifesaving. Talk to a doctor about your family history and see how that history impacts your risk of breast cancer. You and your doctor can create a personalized plan to monitor for signs of the disease.

Getting Screened - For those at average risk, have a mammogram every year starting at age 40. If you have any signs of breast cancer, finding it early and treating it early may save your life.

Making Healthy Lifestyle Choices - Living a healthy lifestyle is within your control and may lower your risk of breast cancer. Maintain a healthy weight, limit alcohol intake and exercise regularly. It all matters when it comes to your overall health and risk of disease.

Getting Involved - Participate in a fundraising event near you such as the [Race for Cure](#), [MORE THAN PINK Walk](#), or [create a fundraiser](#) of your own that is meaningful to you. Your support can help organizations take action to invest in research and help those facing breast cancer today!

WILDFIRE PREPAREDNESS: GET READY, GET SET AND GO!



As a Bradbury resident, it is important be proactive and prepare for a wildfire. One of many helpful tools is the web based application on the Ready For Wildfire website. The application guides the user by giving specific task lists to prepare for a wildfire in their area. There are 3 stages of preparation: Get Ready, Get Set and Go!

Go! is the evacuation guide portion. Remember, before evacuation is necessary, follow these steps before it's time to GO!

1. Create a Wildfire Action Plan for your family. Being ready to go also means knowing when to evacuate and what to do if you become trapped.
2. Complete the pre-evacuation preparation steps (only if time allows) to increase your home's defense.
3. Make sure you monitor wildfires in your area and know your community's emergency response plan, evacuation orders and evacuation centers.
