RESOURCES FOR RESIDENTS

The information below will help guide you in connecting with drug and/or alcohol treatment. Bucks County Drug & Alcohol Commission, Inc. is available to help with any questions, concerns and needed resources. Please contact our **Approval of Care Department at 215-444-2730** (Monday - Friday from 8:30 am to 4:30 pm).

The first step in accessing treatment is to have a drug and alcohol assessment to determine the type of treatment and recovery plan needed. Assessment sites are listed in the box to the left. If treatment is needed after-hours, you or your family member can go to or call Gaudenzia Lower Bucks 24/7 at 267-478-5664.

- **To access treatment for those who have private health insurance,** call the number on the back of the insurance card listed under Mental Health/Substance Abuse to find an in-network provider.
- **To access treatment if you have Medical Assistance or do not have insurance,** please call one of the agencies listed to the left. Individuals who are considered a priority population - such as pregnant women who inject drugs, pregnant women who use substances, persons who inject drugs, overdose survivors, Veterans and adolescents - are exempt from any treatment limitations. Preferential treatment is given to pregnant females.

An additional resource is **Bucks Human Services Connect - The Hub**. The Hub provides access to all human services resources for Bucks County residents, their families and those who support them. The Hub is located on the first floor of the Administration Building in Doylestown (M-F, 9 am - 4 pm). Resource Navigators are also on-site every Tuesday at PA CareerLink Bucks County in Trevoze. Save a Life... Get Narcan!

Narcan Nasal Spray is used for the emergency treatment of a known or suspected opioid overdose. Narcan is available for pick-up at The Hub on Mondays and Tuesdays between 10 am and 2 pm through BCDAC, Inc. CENTERS OF EXCELLENCE

A Center of Excellence (COE) is an agency identified to help ensure that underinsured and uninsured individuals with substance use disorder stay in treatment to receive follow-up care and are supported within their communities. RECOVERY COMMUNITY CENTERS, CASE MANAGEMENT & PEER SUPPORT

The Recovery Community Centers through PRO-ACT provide education, resources, information, support and socialization for those in recovery and their family and friends. In addition, Centers offer recovery support groups, job search assistance, peer mentor services, case management, computer labs, telephonic support and much more. The Centers are a hub for all services, including Case Management services through the Intensive Case Management (ICM) program and Peer Support services offered by a Certified Recovery Specialist (CRS).
