Subject: Redistricting and Redrawing of Election District Maps – Final Public Hearing, Map Selection, and Reading of the Ordinance

BACKGROUND

The Public Hearing scheduled for March 23, 2022, is required under the California Elections Code as part of the redistricting process required every ten years to coincide with the new U.S. Census data, ensuring that all districts are as substantially equal in population as possible. The official 2020 population of the City of Camarillo is 70,850. For the purposes of redistricting, each council district may have approximately 14,170 people.

The redistricting process held over five prior public hearings provided opportunities for community members to learn about the legalities of the process and to participate in redrawing the election district boundaries. For City Council's consideration in selecting a Final Map, Community members provided public comment on several factors including proposed draft maps, demographics, and communities of interest. Overall, the City Council evaluated 37 maps, and on March 9, 2022, selected Map 118 as the Adopted Map (Attachment 1).

DISCUSSION

At the March 9, 2022, Public Hearing, the City Council reviewed preferred maps from the previous February 23, 2022, session as well as all newly introduced public maps. During deliberation it was discussed by the City Council that Euclid Avenue was divided between two census blocks, thereby splitting the street between two districts. Due to posting requirements, the City Council was advised that they could not request an adjustment to and adopt Map 118 in the same evening. After taking public comment and deliberation of the maps, City Council voted 4 to 1 (Yes: Santangelo, Craven, Kildee, Trembley; No: Mulchay) to adopt Map 118 and introduce and conduct the first hearing of Ordinance No. 1190.

Staff was made aware of an error in Map 118 after the conclusion of the public hearing. The map as submitted by the author was meant to include Euclid Avenue between Districts 1 and 2, along census block 061110055041000.

The District Map will not change for 10 years after new U.S. Census data is received. Since the timeline allows an opportunity for the City Council to evaluate the adjustment, staff is introducing Map 118-Adjusted (Attachment 2) for review, which corrects the technical error that occurred when importing the submitted map file into the mapping software. The above-mentioned census block is now assigned to District 2, as intended by the map's author. NDC has reviewed Map 118 and found no additional errors in census block assignments. The call for additional public maps was not opened to the public as this hearing only seeks to adjust a technical error of the map already selected by City Council.

Options for City Council Consideration

This final Public Hearing presents two options for City Council consideration after the public hearing process.

Option 1: The City Council may decide to move forward with Map 118 as presented and selected on March 9, 2022. The City Council will request for the Second Reading of Ordinance No. 1190. (Attachment #3)

Option 2: The City Council may decide to adopt *Map 118-Adjusted* as the Final Adopted Map 118 and request First Reading of Ordinance No. 1191 waiving full reading, and place the ordinance on the April 13, 2022, regular meeting agenda for Second Reading and final adoption. (Attachment #4).

Public Notice

Elections Code Section 21608(c) requires publication of the date, time, and location of any public hearing or workshop at least five days before the hearing or workshop. Pursuant to this requirement, a public hearing notice was posted on the City's website and posted at City Hall on March 14, 2022. Additionally, a public hearing notice was published in the VC Star on March 17, 2022. Additionally, Elections Code Section 21608(d)(1) requires a draft map shall be published for at least seven days before being adopted by the City Council as a final map. Map 118 and Map 118-Adjusted were posted on the City's webpage at www.cityofcamarillo.org on March 16, 2022, followed by an announcement to all notification subscribers. A Final Map must be adopted by April 16, 2022, and staff has confirmed with the County Clerk's Office that both options are in conformance with the deadline.

CEQA Compliance

Adjusting the district boundaries from which voters elect their City Councilmembers is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section 15061(b)(3), because it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment. Therefore, adjusting the district boundaries is not a project subject to CEQA.

FISCAL IMPACT

Funding for redistricting services is included in the Professional Services/Administrative City Manager budget, Account No. 101-1401-414.32-0.

RECOMMENDATION

City Council will receive a presentation specifically pertaining to *Map 118* and *Map 118-Adjusted*, as well as receive public testimony on the two presented maps. Following the close of the Public Hearing, Council will then choose one of the following options:

1. Motion to move forward with district boundary *Map 118*, as presented and selected on March 9, 2022, and proceed with a second reading, by title only waiving the full reading of the text, adopting **Ordinance No. 1190** Amending Sections 2.08.060 through 2.08.080 of Chapter 2.08 of the Camarillo Municipal Code Adopting a New Council District Boundary Map to Implement the Redrawn District Boundaries, and Finding this Action is Exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (with adopted Map 118); **OR**
2. Motion to select district boundary *Map 118-Adjusted* as the final adopted map and request a first reading, by title only waiving the full reading of the text, of **Ordinance No. 1191** Amending Sections 2.08.060 through 2.08.080 of Chapter 2.08 of the Camarillo Municipal Code Adopting a New Council District Boundary Map to Implement the Redrawn District Boundaries, and Finding this Action is Exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (with adopted Map 118-Adjusted.) This option would place the ordinance on the April 13, 2022, regular meeting agenda for second reading and final adoption.

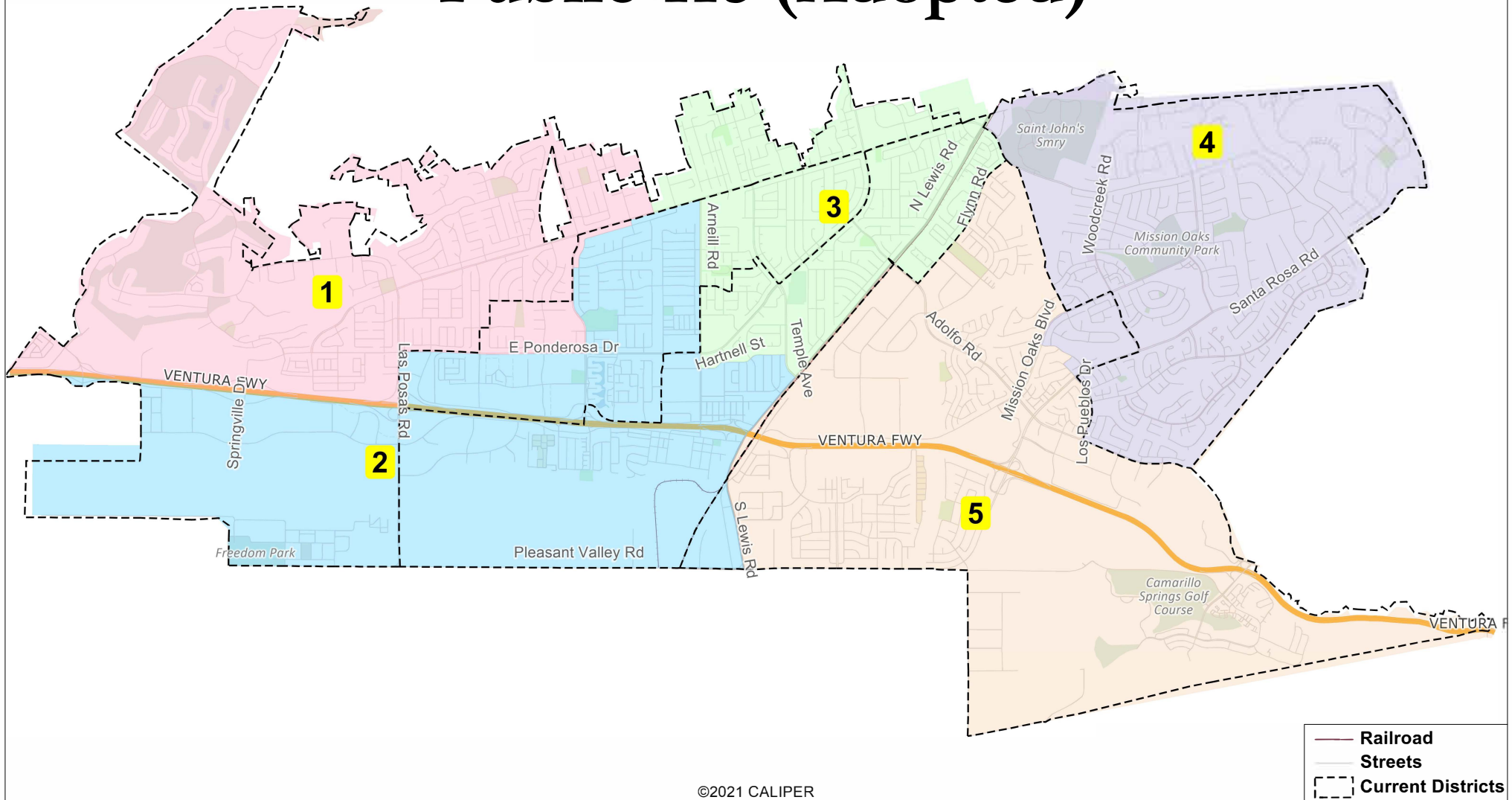

City of Camarillo Redistricting 2022

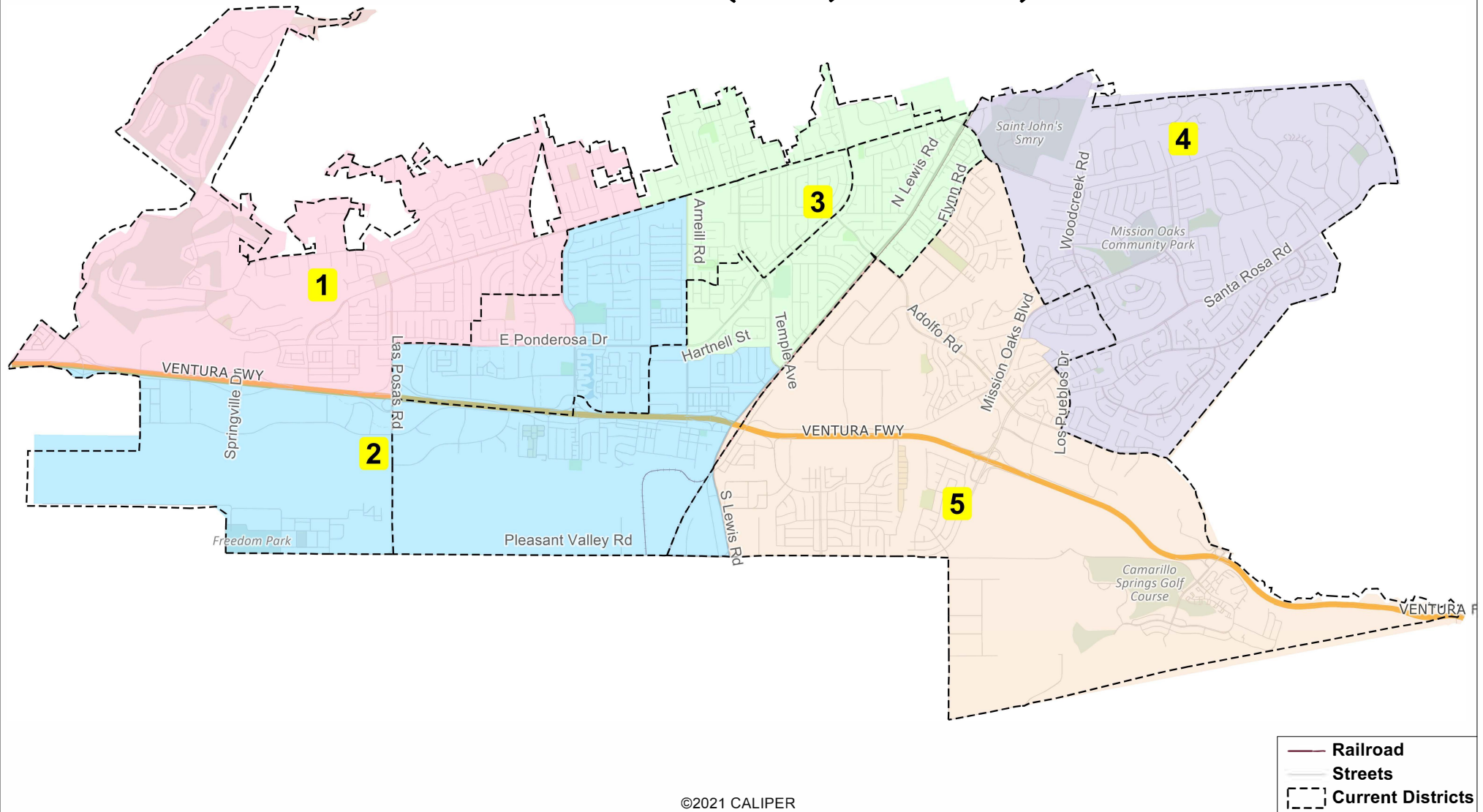

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ORDINANCE NO. 1190

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CAMARILLO, CALIFORNIA, AMENDING SECTIONS 2.08.060 THROUGH 2.08.080 TO CHAPTER 2.08 OF TITLE 2, "CITY COUNCIL", OF THE CAMARILLO MUNICIPAL CODE REDISTRICTING THE CITY'S ELECTORAL DISTRICTS

The City Council of the City of Camarillo ordains as follows:

SECTION 1: Recitals. The City Council of the City of Camarillo finds and declares as follows:

A. The City of Camarillo supports the full participation of all citizens in electing Members of the City Council and implementing the guarantees of Section 7 of Article 1 and of Article II of the California Constitution.

B. On June 12, 2019, the City Council adopted Ordinance No. 1165 changing the at-large City Council method of election to a district-based City Council method of election.

C. On August 12, 2021, the US Census Bureau released official 2020 population data from the decennial Census.

D. On September 27, 2021, the State of California released adjusted population data which cities are required to use for redistricting.

E. Based on the population data from the 2020 Census and the requirements of state and federal law, the City conducted a public process for redistricting to ensure that the district boundaries continue to comply with applicable law due to changes in the population.

F. On October 1, 2021, the City held a Public Hearing to educate the public on the redistricting process and solicit input on "communities of interest".

G. On November 10, 2021, the City held a second Public Hearing to present demographic analysis, solicit further public input on "communities of interest", and introduce the public to mapping tools to enable individuals to draw and propose draft redistricting maps for consideration of the City Council.

H. On January 26, 2022, the City held a third Public Hearing to discuss and revise draft maps, which were published on the City's redistricting webpage at least five days before the hearing.

I. On February 23, 2022, the City held a fourth Public Hearing to discuss and revise draft maps, which were published on the City's redistricting webpage at least five days before the hearing.

J. On March 9, 2022, the City Council held a final public hearing on the proposal to adopt new district boundaries, reviewed additional public input, considered draft maps that had been published on the City's redistricting webpage on or before February 25, 2022, formally selected the voting district map and the election sequence attached to, incorporated in, and set forth in this Ordinance, which was introduced for a first reading at the same regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Camarillo.

K. Throughout the foregoing process, the City engaged in a significant amount of public outreach and engagement as required by California Elections Code Section 21608.

L. The purpose of this Ordinance is to amend the Sections 2.08.060 through 2.08.080 of Title 2, Chapter 2.08, "City Council" of the Camarillo Municipal Code to enact a redistricting

plan for City Council elections as reflected in Attachment A to this Ordinance to ensure that the district boundaries are drawn in a manner consistent with applicable law due to changes in the population reflected in the adjusted 2020 Census data.

SECTION 2: The above Recitals are true and correct and are incorporated herein by this reference.

SECTION 3: Amendment of Code. Sections 2.08.060 through 2.08.080 contained in Title 2, Chapter 2.08, "City Council" of the Camarillo Municipal Code, are hereby amended as follows (revisions are shown in strike-through and italicized type):

"2.08.060 District Based Electoral System.

Pursuant to California Elections Code Sections 21600 *et seq.* and the election schedule established in Section 2.08.080 of this Chapter, beginning in November 2022, Members of the City Council shall be elected in a district-based electoral system from five (5) single-member City Council Districts. For purposes of this Chapter, the term "district-based electoral system" shall mean the election of Members of the City Council by the voters of the district alone as provided in California Government Code Section 34871, subdivision (a).

2.08.070 Redistricting of City Council Electoral Districts.

- A. Pursuant to Section 2.08.060 of this Chapter, Members of the City Council shall be elected on a district-based electoral system, from the five City Council Districts described as follows, which shall continue in effect until they are amended or repealed in accordance with law:
 - 1. City Council District 1 shall comprise all that portion of the City reflected in Attachment A.
 - 2. City Council District 2 shall comprise all that portion of the City reflected in Attachment A.
 - 3. City Council District 3 shall comprise all that portion of the City reflected in Attachment A.
 - 4. City Council District 4 shall comprise all that portion of the City reflected in Attachment A.
 - 5. City Council District 5 shall comprise all that portion of the City reflected in Attachment A.
- B. Members of the City Council shall be elected in the electoral districts established by this Section and as subsequently reapportioned pursuant to applicable State and federal law, until the by-district electoral system is amended or repealed in accordance with law.
- C. Except as provided in subdivision D herein and notwithstanding any other provision of this Chapter, once this Ordinance is fully phased in, the Member of the City Council elected to represent a district must reside in that district and be a registered voter in that district, and any candidate for City Council must live in, and be a registered voter in, the district in which he or she seeks election at the time nomination papers are issued, pursuant to Elections Code 10227. Termination of residency in a district by a Member of the City Council shall create an immediate vacancy for that City Council district unless a substitute residence within the district is established within thirty (30) days after the termination of residency.

- D. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Section, and consistent with the requirements of California Elections Code Section 21606, the Members of the City Council in office at the time the Ordinance codified in this Chapter takes effect, shall continue in office until the expiration of the full term to which he or she was elected and until his or her successor is qualified. A vacancy in a Council Member seat elected at-large shall be filled by appointment or at-large election of a person qualified to hold the office who is a resident of the City. A vacancy in an office filled in a by-district election in 2020 shall be filled by appointment or by special by-district election of a person qualified to hold the office who resides in the district as configured in 2020. At the end of the term of each Member of the City Council, that Member's successor shall be elected on a by-district basis in the districts established in Section 2.08.070 of this Chapter for each district under the new district plan that has the same district number as a district whose incumbent's term is due to expire. Thereafter, a vacancy in a Council Member seat elected by-district shall be filled by appointment or by-district election of a person qualified to hold the office who is a resident of the district.

2.08.080 Election Schedule.

The Members of the City Council shall be elected in City Council Districts Nos. 1, 2, and 5 as reflected in Attachment A or as amended in accordance with law, beginning at the General Municipal Election in November 2022, and every four years thereafter. Members of the City Council shall be elected from City Council Districts Nos. 3 and 4 as reflected in Attachment A or as amended in accordance with law, beginning at the General Municipal Election in November 2024, and every four years thereafter, as such City Council Districts shall be amended."

SECTION 4: Map. Attachment A to Ordinance No. 1165 is hereby repealed. A map showing the districts described in this Ordinance and codified in Section 2.08.070 of the City of Camarillo Municipal Code is attached hereto as Attachment A and incorporated herein by reference.

SECTION 5: Severability. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision will not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance. The City Council hereby declares that it would have passed this ordinance and each and every section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase not declared invalid or unconstitutional without regard to whether any portion of the ordinance would be subsequently declared invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 6: Technical Adjustments. If necessary to facilitate the implementation of this Ordinance, the City Clerk is authorized to make technical adjustments to the district boundaries that do not substantively affect the populations in the districts, the eligibility of candidates, or the residence of elected officials within any district. The City Clerk shall consult with the City Manager and City Attorney concerning any technical adjustments deemed necessary and shall advise the City Council of any such adjustments required in the implementation of the districts.

SECTION 7: Conflicting Terms. To the extent the terms and provisions of this Ordinance may be inconsistent or in conflict with the terms or conditions of any prior City ordinance, motion, resolution, rule or regulation governing the same subject, the terms of this Ordinance shall prevail with respect to the subject matter thereof.

SECTION 8: Interpretation. In interpreting this Ordinance or resolving any ambiguity, this Ordinance shall be interpreted in a manner that effectively accomplishes its stated purpose.

SECTION 9: Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective thirty days after its adoption.

SECTION 10: Publication. The City Clerk is directed to certify this ordinance and cause it to be published in the manner required by law.

SECTION 11: Sunset. If the California Voting Rights Act, Elections Code sections 14025 through 14032, as it now exists or may hereafter be amended, is repealed, or is amended such that its provisions no longer apply to the City of Camarillo, or is declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be facially unconstitutional, in whole or in part, or unconstitutional, in whole or in part, as applied, and the basis of that ruling also applies to the City of Camarillo, this Ordinance shall be automatically suspended and the City Council shall immediately consider an ordinance repealing Sections 2.08.060 through 2.08.080 of Title 2, Chapter 2.08, "City Council" of the Camarillo Municipal Code. If the City Council repeals Sections 2.08.060 through 2.08.080 of Title 2, Chapter 2.08, "City Council" of the Camarillo Municipal Code, the incumbent Councilmembers elected pursuant to the provisions of this Ordinance shall complete their terms of office until their successors are qualified, and their successors shall be elected at-large in the order in which the terms of the then-incumbent Councilmembers expire and in accordance with all other provisions of law, until such time as the voters of the City of Camarillo shall approve a different method of electing City Councilmembers in accordance with Government Code section 34871, et seq. If the City Council does not repeal Sections 2.08.060 through 2.08.080 of Title 2, Chapter 2.08, "City Council" of the Camarillo Municipal Code, it shall remain in full force and effect until repealed in accordance with law. Nothing in this section shall prohibit the City Council from placing on the ballot a measure for the repeal of Sections 2.08.060 through 2.08.080 of Title 2, Chapter 2.08, "City Council" of the Camarillo Municipal Code.

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B. On June 12, 2019, the City Council adopted Ordinance No. 1165 changing the at-large City Council method of election to a district-based City Council method of election.

I. On February 23, 2022, the City held a fourth Public Hearing to discuss and revise draft maps, which were published on the City's redistricting webpage at least five days before the hearing.

J. On March 9, 2022, the City Council held a fifth Public Hearing to discuss and revise draft maps, which were published on the City's redistricting webpage at least five days before the hearing, selected Map 118 as its preferred map, which had been proposed by a member of the public, and introduced an Ordinance to adopt Map 118.

K. After the March 9, 2022, public hearing, a technical defect was discovered in the transfer of Map 118 from the public mapping tool to the official published version, which was corrected and the map reposted on March 16, 2022 as Map 118-Adjusted.

L. On March 23, 2022, the City Council held its final Public Hearing on the proposal to adopt new district boundaries, reviewed additional public input, considered selected Map 118 and Map-118 adjusted which had been posted for at least three days before the final Public Hearing, and formally selected the voting district map and the election sequence called Map 118-Adjusted as the City's 2022 redistricting map, attached to, incorporated in, and set forth in this Ordinance which was introduced for a first reading at the same regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Camarillo.

M. Throughout the foregoing process, the City engaged in a significant amount of public outreach and engagement as required by California Elections Code Section 21608.

N. The purpose of this Ordinance is to amend the Sections 2.08.060 through 2.08.080 of Title 2, Chapter 2.08, "City Council" of the Camarillo Municipal Code to enact a redistricting plan for City Council elections as reflected in Attachment A to this Ordinance to ensure that the district boundaries are drawn in a manner consistent with applicable law due to changes in the population reflected in the adjusted 2020 Census data.

4. City Council District 4 shall comprise all that portion of the City reflected in Attachment A.
 5. City Council District 5 shall comprise all that portion of the City reflected in Attachment A.
- B. Members of the City Council shall be elected in the electoral districts established by this Section and as subsequently reapportioned pursuant to applicable State and federal law, until the by-district electoral system is amended or repealed in accordance with law.
- C. Except as provided in subdivision D herein and notwithstanding any other provision of this Chapter, once this Ordinance is fully phased in, the Member of the City Council elected to represent a district must reside in that district and be a registered voter in that district, and any candidate for City Council must live in, and be a registered voter in, the district in which he or she seeks election at the time nomination papers are issued, pursuant to Elections Code 10227. Termination of residency in a district by a Member of the City Council shall create an immediate vacancy for that City Council district unless a substitute residence within the district is established within thirty (30) days after the termination of residency.
- D. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Section, and consistent with the requirements of California Elections Code Section 21606, the Members of the City Council in office at the time the Ordinance codified in this Chapter takes effect, shall continue in office until the expiration of the full term to which he or she was elected and until his or her successor is qualified. A vacancy in a Council Member seat elected at-large shall be filled by appointment or at-large election of a person qualified to hold the office who is a resident of the City. A vacancy in an office filled in a by-district election in 2020 shall be filled by appointment or by special by-district election of a person qualified to hold the office who resides in the district as configured in 2020. At the end of the term of each Member of the City Council, that Member's successor shall be elected on a by-district basis in the districts established in Section 2.08.070 of this Chapter for each district under the new district plan that has the same district number as a district whose incumbent's term is due to expire. Thereafter, a vacancy in a Council Member seat elected by-district shall be filled by appointment or by-district election of a person qualified to hold the office who is a resident of the district.

2.08.080 Election Schedule.

The Members of the City Council shall be elected in City Council Districts Nos. *1, 2, and 5* as reflected in Attachment A or as amended in accordance with law, beginning at the General Municipal Election in November 2022, and every four years thereafter. Members of the City Council shall be elected from City Council Districts Nos. *3 and 4* as reflected in Attachment A or as amended in accordance with law, beginning at the General Municipal Election in November 2024, and every four years thereafter, as such City Council Districts shall be amended."

SECTION 4: Map. Attachment A to Ordinance No. 1165 is hereby repealed. A map showing the districts described in this Ordinance and codified in Section 2.08.070 of the City of Camarillo Municipal Code is attached hereto as Attachment A and incorporated herein by reference.

SECTION 5: Severability. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase of

this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision will not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance. The City Council hereby declares that it would have passed this ordinance and each and every section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase not declared invalid or unconstitutional without regard to whether any portion of the ordinance would be subsequently declared invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 6: Technical Adjustments. If necessary to facilitate the implementation of this Ordinance, the City Clerk is authorized to make technical adjustments to the district boundaries that do not substantively affect the populations in the districts, the eligibility of candidates, or the residence of elected officials within any district.

The City Clerk shall consult with the City Manager and City Attorney concerning any technical adjustments deemed necessary and shall advise the City Council of any such adjustments required in the implementation of the districts.

SECTION 7: Conflicting Terms. To the extent the terms and provisions of this Ordinance may be inconsistent or in conflict with the terms or conditions of any prior City ordinance, motion, resolution, rule or regulation governing the same subject, the terms of this Ordinance shall prevail with respect to the subject matter thereof.

SECTION 8: Interpretation. In interpreting this Ordinance or resolving any ambiguity, this Ordinance shall be interpreted in a manner that effectively accomplishes its stated purpose.

SECTION 9: Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective thirty days after its adoption.

SECTION 10: Publication. The City Clerk is directed to certify this ordinance and cause it to be published in the manner required by law.

SECTION 11: Sunset. If the California Voting Rights Act, Elections Code sections 14025 through 14032, as it now exists or may hereafter be amended, is repealed, or is amended such that its provisions no longer apply to the City of Camarillo, or is declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be facially unconstitutional, in whole or in part, or unconstitutional, in whole or in part, as applied, and the basis of that ruling also applies to the City of Camarillo, this Ordinance shall be automatically suspended and the City Council shall immediately consider an ordinance repealing Sections 2.08.060 through 2.08.080 of Title 2, Chapter 2.08, "City Council" of the Camarillo Municipal Code. If the City Council repeals Sections 2.08.060 through 2.08.080 of Title 2, Chapter 2.08, "City Council" of the Camarillo Municipal Code, the incumbent Councilmembers elected pursuant to the provisions of this Ordinance shall complete their terms of office until their successors are qualified, and their successors shall be elected at-large in the order in which the terms of the then-incumbent Councilmembers expire and in accordance with all other provisions of law, until such time as the voters of the City of Camarillo shall approve a different method of electing City Councilmembers in accordance with Government Code section 34871, et seq. If the City Council does not repeal Sections 2.08.060 through 2.08.080 of Title 2, Chapter 2.08, "City Council" of the Camarillo Municipal Code, it shall remain in full force and effect until repealed in accordance with law. Nothing in this section shall prohibit the City Council from placing on the ballot a measure for the repeal of Sections 2.08.060 through 2.08.080 of Title 2, Chapter 2.08, "City Council" of the Camarillo Municipal Code.

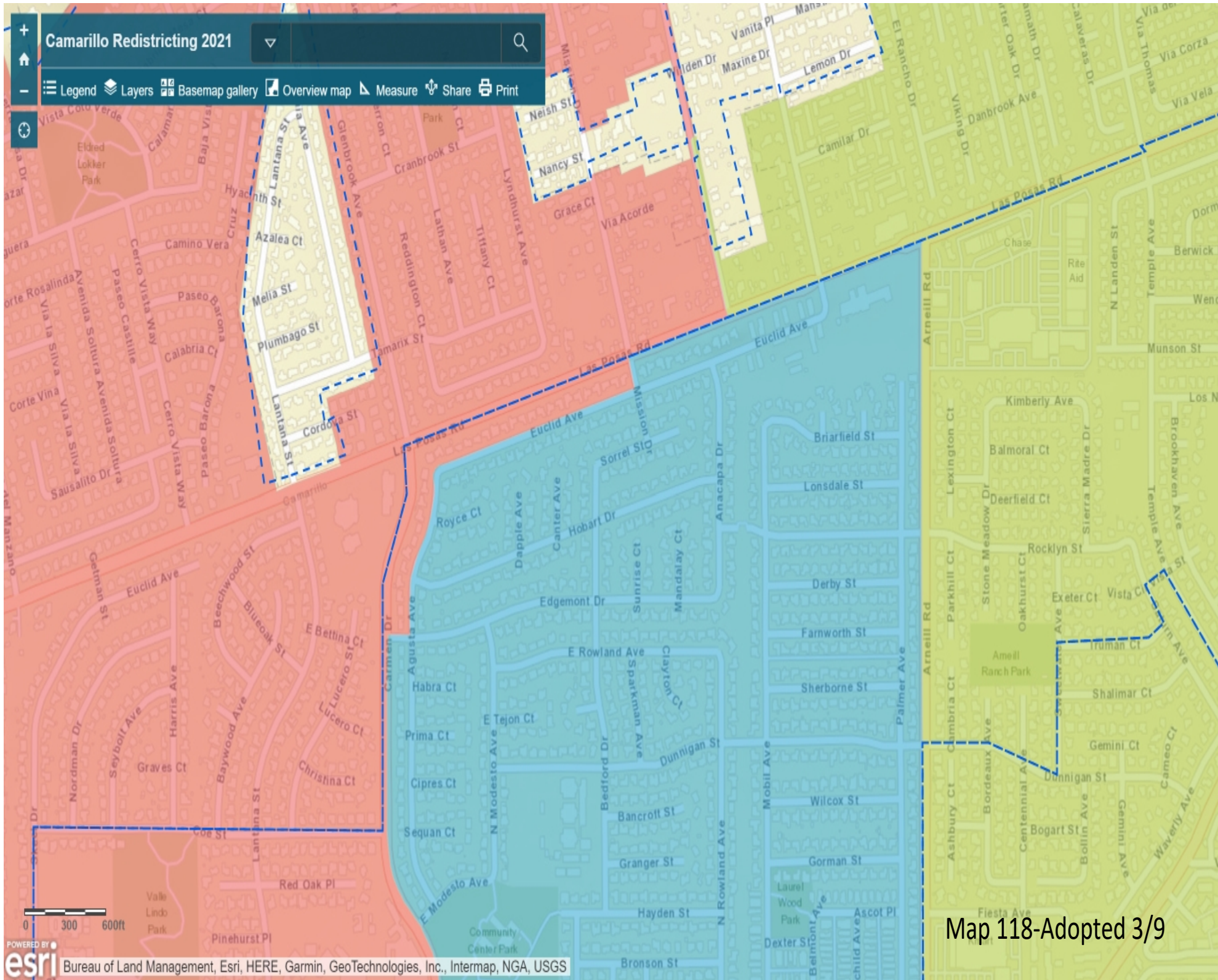
City Council Districts Map

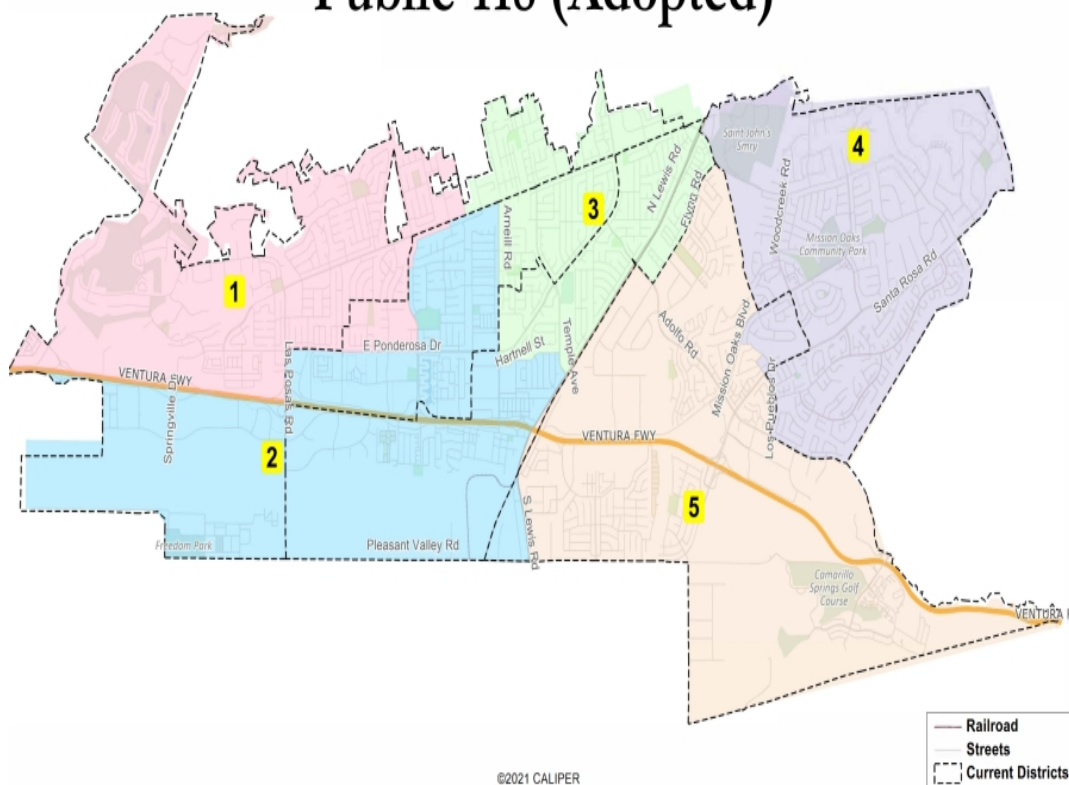

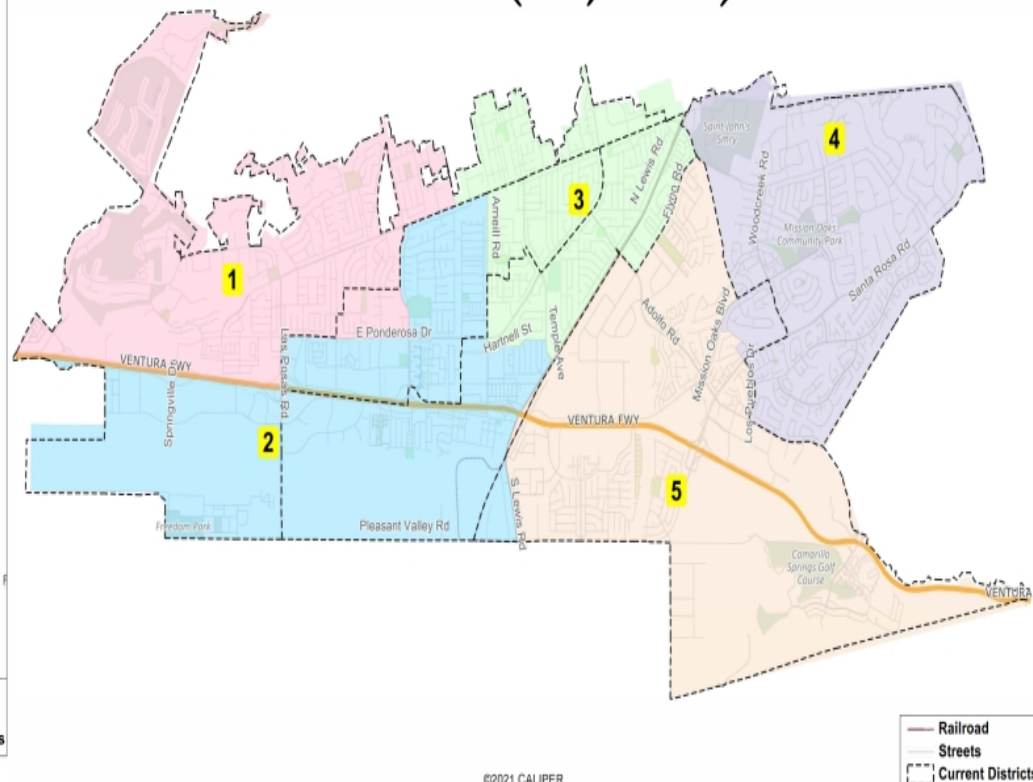
City of Camarillo Redistricting 2022
