The meeting opened with Mark Mathews leading the pledge of allegiance and prayer.

Kim Spencer, Road and Bridge:

- Kim has put in a request for a grant through LHTAC for the 8-Mile bridge. If it comes through it is for 100% funding for re-construction of the bridge.
- The crusher is at the Stauffer pit currently and will be moved to the Georgetown Summit by the end of the month.
- They have 6 days left of hauling millings from Bennington. Currently there are 9 trucks running on the project and they are averaging 3 ½ hours of overtime. The crews will move to the Government Dam Road project since there will be a break before hauling the millings from Highway 34.
- Kim gave estimates of painting the roadway at approximately \$1000 per mile. The board discussed the possibility of painting Old Highway 30 between Bancroft and the Bannock County line.
