2. Comments by the General Public: Pursuant to NRS 241.020(2C) this time is devoted to comments by the general public and discussion of those comments. No action may be taken upon a matter raised under this item until the matter has been included on a successive agenda and identified as an action item. **(Non-Action Item)**
 - a. Cameron Kinney said the Planning Commission Board is again getting low on members. There's one member that's resigned and another member that, according to the last meeting, is about to get their letter for not showing up to meetings, so they're again short people. In order to have a quorum, they need people to continue doing business there.
 - b. Brent Jacobson asked about the time commitment.
 - c. Cameron Kinney stated they have one meeting a month.
 - d. Brent Jacobson thought there would be some studying.
 - e. Cameron Kinney stated yeah, a little bit for some of the things that they talk about. Mostly they're working on Title 3 right now, trying to get the new maps updated and approved to send to the Council, and all of Title 3 as well, and the map is just part of that. So they're trying to get everything zoned correctly so that Farr West can update the map because Farr West didn't do everything on there. So they're updating it to send it back to them again. That's what they're working on right now,

and the Master Plan is what they're working on, as well.

❖ **Non-action item. No action taken.**

3. Discussion and possible approval of all matters related to the 2022 Sho 'N' Shine Event. **Public Comment will be taken prior to any Action Being Taken by the Board. (For Possible Action)**
 - a. Ellen Meshefski said she tried to get ahold of Leah and asked if Melinda Harris had heard from her. Melinda indicated no. Ellen stated I messaged her today and they still have not heard anything on the insurance. Brent and I went down and we got a photo of the park from Google Maps and we went down and we measured for the burnouts. I went ahead and because it's just getting so close and we have no clue what to do with a race, I asked her, I said please, we really need to get the burnouts covered. Maybe just forget about the race this year and then maybe next year we can learn a little bit more about the race and what we need to have. Because she doesn't know what we have to have, so they sent us an application and Brent and I went down and took measurements and sent them what we have already done that's been implemented for the burnouts, and we have not heard back. We're hoping that maybe they'll send back and say, well, no, you need to do this, this, this, and this, since there are no rules, there's no guidelines, we don't know what we have to do. So, just really, really think we need to really work on keeping our burnouts. We've done the burnouts for 19 years. That's just something I just don't think we should lose.
 - b. Rick Gillespie stated a lot of people just come over for the burnouts.
 - c. Ellen Meshefski agreed and stated we did ask for a little bit of money over what we usually get. And maybe if it is a little expensive, maybe we can help pay the City the difference to cover, because they always pay. There's a regular pay right now that they cover, and if it's extra, then maybe that's something that we're going to have to help pay the difference, so we can keep—
 - d. Denise Taylor stated supplement the insurance cost.
 - e. Ellen Meshefski stated when we talked to Wells, they are sponsored. When you talk to Elko, they are sponsored. Stockmen's sponsors Elko because they said they couldn't afford the insurance on theirs, so they get theirs sponsored by different companies for their burnouts. I really think we need to come up with our itinerary of what we're going to do so at least we can start advertising and getting that out at least a little bit. We can keep our Friday registration, starts at noon, that's something that we've always done. Unless somebody has any other idea. I know that we talked about doing a dance and the parade, and maybe doing lip sync, so that's something I think we need to talk about time-wise, how do we want to do that?
 - f. Denise Taylor thought we had discussed lip sync becoming something else.
 - g. Ellen Meshefski asked is that something that we're going to completely get rid of?
 - h. Brent Jacobson stated we did talk about how it isn't quite the big a hit as it used to be. Not saying it wouldn't come right back, right? And at the car show we have, in the past, had, sponsored by citizens, a little contest, and it was pretty popular, so I don't know the answer to that. Sure, it could be a big hit. We've kind of struggled with it in some other events, so I'm not too sure.
 - i. Denise Taylor stated I knew that we had talked about that and wondered if we shouldn't move from doing the lip sync to a dance with a DJ instead, that it might get more

- participation.
- j. Ellen Meshefski stated so on Friday, then, if we're going to add that, we need to talk about our times. From 12 to 5 we have registration, cars come in and register until 5. A lot of the car show people that are there leave around 4:30, 5:00. But we want to keep them there, so what time do we want to do our parade that we talked about?
 - k. Brent Jacobson asked if that was going to be a cruise in town.
 - l. Ellen Meshefski said she thought we'll have them cruise up and we'll set a podium up at the school, and then we'll announce the cars as they come by. Or, if you guys want, trying to get the town involved, we can set the podium up and announce them when they're coming out. I don't know how we want to do it. Because I know Elko does it in front of their courthouse. When they do their parade, they announce every parade entry, the bands, everything in front of the courthouse.
 - m. Rick Gillespie stated the more spread out you get the podium, instead of everything being at the park, the more you spread out, the more people you get interested in it. More people are hearing it.
 - n. Denise Taylor asked since registration ends at 5:00, could we maybe say, start the parade at 5:30, so they can get back to their cars? Those late registrations could be ready to roll if they want to be part of that parade, and then we can start the parade say at 5:30, start from the park, go down, and come back to the park? And that way they're already starting from where they've already registered. And then go from 5:30 to whatever, Denise guessed the parade would be over by 6:30 or 7:00. She stated immediately following the parade would be when the free dance starts.
 - o. Brent Jacobson asked if this was on Friday night.
 - p. Board members indicated yes.
 - q. Brent Jacobson stated so we've got to remember, too, we don't have every car by then, so I think within an hour we're done, I'm pretty sure, because we don't have the full contingent of the car show. A lot of them come on Saturday, too, so that's pretty fair to say that we can get that done pretty quickly.
 - r. Denise Taylor asked how long do you want to do the street dance?
 - s. Jeremiah Wilcox suggested until about 8:00 or 9:00 ish. When we normally hold the dances at the Fire Station, everybody shows up right there around about 5:00, 6:00, but most of the time they're gone by 8:00 and it's pretty much almost empty by 9:00. I mean, granted this is going to be a little bit different, so they might be going 'til 10:00, but the only thing you have to worry about is if it goes past 10:00 is the noise ordinance.
 - t. Brent Jacobson stated we've only done it a couple of times since I've been aboard, but we do know that people stay there at the bar and the area with the music until, one year it was like midnight. They stayed pretty late, but you're right, we do turn things down. I'm not sure about a dance, but people do stay late. A lot of people stay late, so I don't know if we can go 'til we're done or put a time limit.
 - u. Rick Gillespie mentioned people who work graveyards or day shifts.
 - v. Ellen Meshsefski asked so do we want to just put a question mark there, on when it gets slow, we close up? And if we're busy, we stay?
 - w. Brent Jacobson stated I think that's fair.
 - x. Denise Taylor stated your bar people will say, leave that bar open as long as they can. They're making money.
 - y. Brent Jacobson explained we just turn things down. We don't keep it loud like a bar. We

- don't want to ruin it for the whole town.
- z. Ellen Meshefski stated so we're going to get rid of lip sync at 5:30, so we're just going to do a parade, 5:30 to 6:30, and then 6:30 to a question mark for the street dance. Right? Okay. And then Saturday, we keep it the same. Everything is pretty much the same. We go 7:00 to 9:00 is your breakfast. Which I'm sure your cheerleaders will still do. We'll find out about that. You have 7:00 a.m. to burnout is registration. And the reason is because people sign up for the burnouts right when burnouts are. And then we have Art in the Park. Then you've got the Poker Run from 2:00, it's usually 2:00 to 4:00. And then your Rolling Thunder Auto Competition is from 2:00 to 3:00. And then you have your 4:00 p.m. is your awards ceremony. And so maybe 3:30 we can do our special 30th auction. Ellen wanted to know what if we would be doing a silent auction, or what on our specialty, our lap quilts and—
 - aa. Denise Taylor thought that was a live auction item.
 - bb. Ellen Meshefski stated okay, so it's a live auction, so at 3:30 we can do our special 30th live auction.
 - cc. Brent Jacobson asked who's your auctioneer?
 - dd. Ellen Meshefski stated I don't know.
 - ee. Rick Gillespie stated I will get with Tom Griswold to see if he would like to do the auctioneer for that.
 - ff. Brent Jacobson stated cool, awesome.
 - gg. Rick Gillespie asked what time was that?
 - hh. Ellen Meshefski stated 3:30. Because a half an hour, we don't have a lot of things, but a half an hour, we should be able to auction the few things that we have. That would be kind of fun. And then hopefully we have 5:00 p.m. burnouts. That's what we're hoping for.
 - ii. Rick Gillespie asked can we get that out more through Elko and Spring Creek?
 - jj. Ellen Meshefski stated oh, yeah.
 - kk. Rick Gillespie stated there's a couple of guys in Spring Creek that didn't even know nothing about it, so I didn't know if there is something you can get more.
 - ll. Ellen Meshefski stated yeah, we advertise on the radio. We put in the newspaper. It's all over Facebook.
 - mm. Denise Taylor asked didn't we even do the bulletin board or the billboard on the way into Spring Creek last year? Unfortunately, you can take a horse to water, but you can't make them drink.
 - nn. Ellen Meshefski stated and we are going with a '50s theme, so I really think with our posters, I think, or at least with our trophies, we should keep with the 30s, because it's our 30th, so we really should advertise that. Ellen mentioned sometimes people put the Nevada or they do something in the background. Do we want to do something with the '50s theme, or do we want to just keep it 30th year?
 - oo. Brent Jacobson asked what Ellen meant.
 - pp. Ellen Meshefski asked how do we want our trophies to look like? Do we want to incorporate '50s or do we want to just incorporate it that it's our 30th year?
 - qq. Andrea Andrews stated I think it would be confusing if you did both of them.
 - rr. Brent Jacobson stated yeah, I think 30th anniversary.
 - ss. Denise Taylor asked but the whole event is going to be '50s theme, just on the 30th anniversary is going to be on the trophies, correct?
 - tt. Ellen Meshefski confirmed. She stated we didn't talk about the RC thing.
 - uu. Jeremiah Wilcox stated not yet. Why don't we just do the roaring '30s for our 30th

- anniversary? I mean, just a thought. It would tie everything together. But that's up to you guys.
- vv. Andrea Andrews stated we already voted, I thought.
- ww. Brent Jacobson explained the '50s theme and music is really for car shows. I think it's a good idea, Jeremiah. I just don't know how to do it, is all. But I think the music and stuff is all going to be '50s music. That's how it always is.
- xx. Jeremiah Wilcox suggested still playing '50s music but have people dress up like the roaring '30s. The music doesn't matter what you play, but I think it'd be kind of cool to, you know, our 30th anniversary doing the roaring '30s. But I hadn't thought about it until it just clicked in my head. Jeremiah asked are we going to still hold the RC races?
- yy. Ellen Meshefski stated we need to put that in there. What time do we want to do that?
- zz. Denise Taylor asked which theme are we doing? Are we considering going a different direction or not?
- aaa. Board members discussed that they had already voted on the '50s.
- bbb. Ellen Meshefski asked is that something that we can change? She asked if that's something Board members want to try to do.
- ccc. Melinda Harris stated if you want to change it, you can make a motion to change it. I know Jody mentioned buying decorations for the '50s theme, so I would check with her and maybe shoot her a text message and make sure she hasn't bought anything quite yet.
- ddd. Ellen Meshefski asked the Board if that's something they want to do and maybe change it?
- eee. Brent Jacobson stated with all due respect, I'd like to stay with the '50s. I don't know about anybody else. That's only one, though.
- fff. Denise Taylor suggested checking with Jody to see if she's already started purchasing decorations before taking anything into consideration because that was her big thing when we voted on that theme to start with, is so she could start digging into that because she usually starts way in advance.
- ggg. Jeremiah Wilcox stated he didn't think he was here when we took the vote for the '50s, so I didn't know we had voted on it.
- hhh. Denise Taylor stated if we don't do it now, I think that having a '30s-themed event futuristically for some other event this year would be great.
- iii. Brent Jacobson asked the street dance DJ and explained that before, it was expensive.
- jjj. Ellen Meshefski stated we'll just put music together and do it. She explained if people request songs, we can find them.
- kkk. Brent Jacobson suggested Jeremiah Wilcox as a DJ and Jeremiah stated he can mix up some music.
- lll. Ellen Meshefski asked when would you like to do the RC? Would you like to do it on Friday or would you like to do it Saturday?
- mmm. Jeremiah Wilcox stated I think we should probably do it more towards Saturday. And only because you have more participation. More people are there. And then the kids aren't so tied up with some of the things that they end up doing on Fridays. You see more of the kids down there on Saturday, so I'd probably say from maybe like 10:00 to noon, or so, and have a couple different heats, depending on the classes that you have come in.
- nnn. Cameron Kinney asked where are you guys going to do the races?
- ooo. Jeremiah Wilcox stated in the skate park, and then there's some that can be off-road, and you can do a little course by our conexas. Just get out there with a shovel, create a couple

- little jumps or something, and let them have fun there.
- ppp. Brent Jacobson asked those bigger ones, the gravel's fine for them in there, isn't it? The bigger ones, they can go like crazy, big tires. Along with that race we talked to a guy from Spring Creek who was here for something else. There's a lot of people probably around here like you that can do tricks and things with them, too. Might have a little show, too, beside just the race.
- qqq. Jeremiah Wilcox stated you can. They're not cheap, but it depends on if they're willing to kind of sacrifice it. I mean, of course, like anything, with a trick it can end up costing money if it breaks. You can set up a trick course, you can set up jumps, you can set up pretty much almost anything and if people are willing to do it, and you might just end up having people just sit over at a little track for an RC if it gets set up nice enough, and people might utilize it all year round.
- rrr. Ellen Meshefski stated so we'll go like 10:00 to noon will be our RC race, and it's all ages, right? All ages, all cars? Is that what you say? All cars.
- sss. Jeremiah Wilcox stated kind of all makes. You've got your off-road and you've got your street RCs. Like I said, we can set up heats to where you have the street cars that are on the concrete in the skate park and then you can have the off-roads like on a little dirt track off the side of the conex or in the gravel or whatever. I could add a couple jumps here and there for those and then if people want, they've got the little ramps and stuff at the skate park that they can utilize. And then you're not shutting down the skate park the entire time for kids because I know kids are over there playing on it constantly.
- ttt. Brent Jacobson stated we'll have to plan ahead. He suggested since people bring trucks and trailers and park over there, we'll have to put out some cones to keep an area open for that track.
- uuu. Jeremiah Wilcox stated where our conexas are, not the gravel in front. Off to the side, the dirt, I know they've already got a couple dirt piles if we just set up, and we can set that track up a couple days prior.
- vvv. Brent Jacobson agreed that's a good spot.
- www. Ellen Meshefski asked have we gotten anything back on anything, Melinda?
- xxx. Melinda Harris stated I haven't heard anything. I sent out the vendors' letters a couple weeks ago and I haven't heard anything back from them.
- yyy. Ellen Meshefski asked could you make me copies of the applications, the car show app, the registration forms? Because I usually mail them out to everybody.
- zzz. Melinda Harris stated okay. How many do you want?
- aaaa. Ellen Meshefski asked for 100. I'll get them all ready and then I'll bring them down and you can mail them out.
- bbbb. Denise Taylor stated Jody is good with the '30s.
- cccc. Andrea Andrews stated Jody has not bought decorations yet.
- dddd. Denise Taylor stated so I guess that's up to you guys, what you want to do.
- eeee. Ellen Meshefski asked if the Board wants to switch it over. They discussed if they like the '50s theme.
- ffff. Brent Jacobson stated I like the '50s but I think '30s are a good idea, so it won't hurt my feelings. The only reason why I'm saying it is because car shows are really a '50s-type thing. And maybe that's a good reason to change. I don't know.
- gggg. Denise Taylor stated '30s would definitely be different. We wouldn't be the same.
- hhhh. Brent Jacobson asked for Ellen Meshefski's opinion.

iiii. Ellen Meshefski thought the '30s idea is pretty awesome. I mean, it's different, and it is a 30.

I like the '50s theme because I like poodle skirts, but—

jjjj. Brent Jacobson stated the '30s clothes are very cool.

kkkk. Board members discussed when flappers were worn.

llll. Denise Taylor asked what are you going to get most of your people at the car show to wear?

mmmm. Ellen Meshefski thought they're going to go with '50s.

nnnn. Denise Taylor asked who is going to be involved in our theme, other than our Board?

oooo. Ellen Meshefski stated she didn't even know if they're even going to be involved in a theme. I don't know. This is something new.

pppp. Cameron Kinney asked you said that you're doing a parade? Or a cruise?

qqqq. Ellen Meshefski stated it'll be a parade.

rrrr. Cameron Kinney stated so all the parade floats will be to the theme, right? Or are they just cars, not floats?

ssss. Denise Taylor stated they're cars, but maybe they decorate their cars according to the theme or be a part of the theme in the car.

tttt. Andrea Andrews stated I don't see any of those people decorating their car.

uuuu. Brent Jacobson stated they may dress the part but they won't decorate their car.

vvvv. Ellen Meshefski stated why don't we keep it the '50s this year, because that's pretty basic, and if we get them going, next year, let's go with the '30s and try it.

wwww. Denise Taylor suggested do a different theme every year.

xxxx. Ellen Meshefski stated we could do an '80s theme one year. Everybody loves '80s.

❖ **Brent Jacobson moved that we accept the itinerary for the 2022 car show as discussed and all related matters. Andrea Andrews seconded. Motion carried.**

4. Discussion and possible approval of all matters related to the 2022 4th of July event. **Public comment will be taken prior to any Action Being Taken by the board: (For Possible Approval)**

a. Ellen Meshefski stated that's why we invited Rick to our meeting. He is the new Commander of the American Legion Post, and so we just wanted to have him come and join us, and maybe we can start talking about what we want to do for the theme, so we can start getting this advertised and getting it out there. Rick, have you thought of a theme? Have you talked to anybody?

b. Rick Gillespie stated well, I talked to several. He indicated most people didn't have any suggestions, but it basically came down to Freedom Isn't Free and Never Forget. And they could be two separate ones, or they could be put together, but I would like to keep them separate.

c. Denise Taylor asked didn't we just do Never Forget?

d. Andrea Andrews stated or something along those lines.

e. Ellen Meshefski stated yeah, but I like that Freedom Isn't Free. But what would you make? Would that be tough to make something?

f. Brent Jacobson asked for a reminder of what was done for Never Forget.

g. Andrea Andrews stated it was right after the 150th, wasn't it?

h. Denise Taylor stated the last couple of years have been all on that.

i. Brent Jacobson stated the reason I asked, because the Never Forget is a great theme because think of things you can do with that. Think of the memorials you could make for a parade.

- j. Andrea Andrews asked why don't you combine them? Never Forget Freedom Isn't Free.
- k. Brent Jacobson stated Rick said he didn't want it.
- l. Rick Gillespie stated well, I didn't say I didn't want it. I'm just putting this out there.
- m. Brent Jacobson asked can the two be worked together somehow?
- n. Rick Gillespie stated they can be worked together.
- o. Denise Taylor suggested Never Forget "Freedom Isn't Free".
- p. Rick Gillespie stated oh, I like that. Sure. That's why you never say this is the way it's going to be. The more minds in it, the more input you get on it.
- q. Ellen Meshefski stated we will have it on Monday. It's going to be an icky day. It'll be pretty quiet, so it's going to be a holiday, so the numbers are going to be low, because people are going to leave for a three-day holiday. The numbers aren't going to be a lot, but we'll be here, so that's cool. Have you had a meeting or anything?
- r. Rick Gillespie stated not until the 18th this month, so we're going to be going over all this, what's left.
- s. Ellen Meshefski stated so you guys will do the bingo and the bar. If you guys want to keep the bingo. If you want to give it away, we'll look for somebody else. But I know that Lincoln wanted to keep it, and he had other people help him do it.

- u. Ellen Meshefski stated and I know that we usually had different people that did food, but I think we invited food trucks, didn't we, last year?
- v. Denise Taylor asked we've invited food trucks every year, haven't we? Because we just didn't have any food.
- w. Ellen Meshefski stated I know like on the 150th, Dana and them did it for the 150th group and that was the only food that was there.
- x. Denise Taylor remembered cooking for her family because it was so busy around the barbecue and people wondered if they were selling.
- y. Ellen Meshefski suggested opening it up to see if there's any organizations out there that want to do it, to make money. Because that's what it used to be.
- z. Denise Taylor stated because we can't do that and run everything else. There's just no way.
- aa. Brent Jacobson stated some organization can make a lot of money that day. A lot.
- bb. Ellen Meshefski stated if they have enough food, usually they run out, but I would rather offer it to the organizations and clubs here first before we send it out saying that, hey, would you come over? Right?
- cc. Denise Taylor stated the Equestrian Park has a rodeo that weekend, too, as well, correct?
- dd. Ellen Meshefski stated they usually have something going on that weekend.
- ee. Brent Jacobson asked around the Fourth of July?
- ff. Ellen Meshefski stated yeah, they usually have some kind of horse something. It's nothing big.
- gg. Melinda Harris stated they have a branding contest June 28th and then after that they have the Ranch Hand Rodeo and then possibly the ATV Rodeo.
- hh. Denise Taylor asked when's the Ranch Hand Rodeo?
- ii. Ellen Meshefski and Melinda Harris stated it's the same weekend as the car show.
- jj. Denise Taylor asked would that be something that they could come in and cook, then, since


they're right here, part of our organization?

- kk. Ellen Meshefski stated I know they used to have those ones that just come in. It was not the big rodeos that they bring in. It was just something that, it was like, oh, you have an event up there? They didn't know. So maybe we can open it up to them.
 - ll. Denise Taylor stated or maybe one of the other organizations. I don't know who else. I know we're pretty slammed with what we've got for the two things—the million things that Ellen has us involved in.
 - mm. Ellen Meshefski stated last year we ended really early because of the wind. We regrouped and it was awesome up there, so I still think we'll still do all that again.
 - nn. Denise Taylor asked are we still doing the children's games?
 - oo. Ellen Meshefski stated yes, you will still run the children's games. If you like. You do it so well, you and Andrea.
 - pp. Denise Taylor stated I don't have a voice afterwards, but okay. The Toilet paper one was the best last year in the wind, so we're still doing the toilet paper, the egg, and the three-legged races.
 - qq. Board members discussed difficulty getting eggs and Brent Jacobson stated Khoury's had signs all over the store that eggs are going to be hard to get.
 - rr. Ellen Meshefski stated maybe we should do water balloons.
 - ss. Denise Taylor stated that's excellent. Let's try that.
 - tt. Cameron Kinney suggested a watermelon eating contest and asking Khoury's to donate the watermelons.
 - uu. Denise Taylor stated so let's do the toilet paper roll race, the watermelon eating, and three-legged races. I like the three-legged races because it makes families get involved because I don't let them just do kids or just do adults. It has to be a kid and an adult.
 - vv. Ellen Meshefski stated and we still have to do the quarter scramble. I'm sorry. That's something that when I was a kid, we all got excited for the nickel scramble.
 - ww. Denise Taylor stated we're doing the quarter scramble, so those are the four.
 - xx. Brent Jacobson stated at the Senior picnic, speaking of families involved, the watermelon eating contest was a parent and a kid. You could make something like that to keep them involved with their kids with that, too, or siblings, or whatever.
 - yy. Denise Taylor thought that was a great idea. She described wheelbarrow races with the adult on the ground and the child holding the legs. She stated that was fun.
 - ❖ **Denise Taylor made a motion that we go with the children's game of toilet paper race, watermelon eating contest parent and child, three-legged races, wheelbarrow race with parent and child, and the quarter scramble, and the theme being Never Forget "Freedom Isn't Free". Jeremiah Wilcox seconded. Motion carried.**
5. Discussion and possible approval of the Minutes for April 12, 2022 and all related matters.


identified as an action item. **(Non-Action Item)**
