New School Resource/D.A.R.E. Officer


The Cassville Police Department is proud to announce Officer Zach Thompson graduated D.A.R.E. Officer Training on September 27, 2019. The training was held in Jefferson City, Missouri. This intensive two-week training was sponsored by the Missouri Police Chiefs Association through D.A.R.E. America. Officer Thompson is now certified to teach the D.A.R.E. program in the Cassville School system, and will be teaching the sixth grade students. The course is ten-weeks long, and there are supplement lessons that can be taught in conjunction with the D.A.R.E. material. Students who complete the program will

participate in a graduation ceremony.

In addition, Officer Thompson completed School Recourse Officer training in October. This week-long training was also held in Jefferson City, Missouri and sponsored through the Missouri Police Chiefs Association. This course ensures officers have the proper training to work in school settings.

Officer Thompson is also involved with after school activities and with the Youth Advisory Board.

Officer Thompson joined the Cassville Police Department as a patrol Officer in October, 2017.



The Ozarks Water Watch, nonprofit organization that works to preserve

the water quality of the upper White River Basin, has released their 11th annual Status of the Watershed report. The basin as a whole received a "C" rating as did the Table Rock watershed. A "C" rating indicates no substantial changes in water quality. The most common problem cited was high levels of nitrogen, which encourages the growth of problem algae including the toxic varieties that can harm wildlife, livestock, pets and humans.

The results of the most recent samples taken at Roaring River showed an improvement in dissolved oxygen, total phosphorus and invertebrates, but a slight increase in total nitrogen content.

The group offers these suggestions to help improve our streams a n d lakes:

• Use fertilizers properly. Test your soil to know if you even need fertilizer and what kind your soil needs. Don't apply fertilizer ahead of rain events because it can easily wash off lawns and be flushed into creeks and rivers through city storm water drains. Continued page 2

Fall Safety Tips

Service Your Furnace

Before the cold autumn and winter weather sets in, be sure to call your heating and cooling company to service your furnace. A specialist should inspect the furnace to make sure everything is in working order and that there are no leaks.

Use Fireplaces Safely

Keep that fire in its proper place by using a fireplace screen to keep sparks from flying out of the fireplace. Never leave a burning fire unattended, and make sure a fire in a fireplace is completely out before going to bed.

Use Caution with Space Heaters

A space heater can be an effective way to warm up a chilly room, but it's essential that you read the instructions on the unit before you use it. If your space heater requires venting, make sure you have vented it to the outdoors. Never use your stove or oven to heat your home; only use space heaters that are approved for this purpose. Always allow at least three feet of empty area around space heaters.

Reconsider Leaf Burning

According to information from the Environmental Protection Agency, burning leaves produces dangerous and cancer-causing chemicals. For this reason, homeowners should avoid disposing of leaves this way. If you decide to burn leaves, wear a protective mask. Burning leaves should only be attempted far away from a house or other structures on a homeowner's property. Always check the weather forecast before starting to burn leaves. This activity should not be attempted in windy conditions.

Exercise Candle Caution

Candles are a great way to give a room that warm glow, but they can also cause fires. According to the National Candle Association, almost 10,000 home fires start with improper candle use. Never leave candles burning if you go out or go to sleep, and keep your candles away from pets and kids.
