LEGISLATION:

1. THIRD READING:

An Ordinance accepting and appropriating \$163.80 received from Rumpke and declaring an emergency.

2. THIRD READING:

An Ordinance authorizing the renewal of a fifteen-year-term easement for the City of Chillicothe to maintain the City's storm drainage facilities located on the property at Adena Mansion and Gardens.

3: THIRD READING:

An Ordinance amending the "Rules of Council" for the City of Chillicothe, Ohio.

4. SECOND READING:

An Ordinance amending Chillicothe Codified Ordinance 917.19 with regard to refuse collection fees and requiring the Service Director, City Auditor and Mayor's office to provide Council an annual recommendation on rate changes not later than March 31 of each calendar year.

5. SECOND READING:

An Ordinance amending Chillicothe Codified Ordinance 917.06 with regard to recycling collection fees and requiring the Service Director, City Auditor and Mayor's office to provide Council an annual recommendation on rate changes not later than March 31 of each calendar year.

6. SECOND READING:

An Ordinance appropriating funds in the amount of forty thousand dollars (\$40,000.00) for computer-related expenses for the Chillicothe Municipal Court.

7. FIRST READING:

An Ordinance appropriating \$9,300.00 for the purchase and installation of computer systems for the Law Director's office.

8. FIRST READING:

An Ordinance appropriating \$40,000.00 to the purchase replacement lift station (pumps) for the Timberidge lift station and the Neenah Gardens lift station and declaring an emergency.

9. FIRST READING:

An Ordinance accepting and appropriating a donation in the amount of \$4,800.00 from the Ohio Eagles Charity Fund to the Chillicothe Fire department for the purpose of purchasing residential Knox Boxes.

10. FIRST READING:

An Ordinance accepting and appropriating grant funds from the Ohio Department of Natural Resources (ODNR) and declaring an emergency.
