LEGISLATION

- 1. THIRD READING:** A Resolution expressing cooperation and granting use of a certain portion of East Second Street to the Downtown Chillicothe Organization for its Oktoberfest Event
- 2. FIRST READING:**
An Ordinance authorizing the Mayor to enter into an agreement with the Hope Partnership and appropriating \$20,000.00 for the Ross County Reentry Coalition.

An Ordinance accepting and appropriating funds in the amount of \$1,301.20 for police overtime.

12. FIRST READING:

An Ordinance accepting and appropriating funds in the amount of \$1,468.99 for the Police Department uniforms and body armor.

13. FIRST READING:

An Ordinance accepting and appropriating insurance reimbursement funds in the amount of \$22,177.00 for the replacement of a totaled Police Department cruiser.

14. FIRST READING

An Ordinance authorizing the Mayor to enter into an agreement with the Walter H. Drane Company to update the Codified Ordinances of the City of Chillicothe, to prepare twenty (20) sets of replacement pages, to update the Code on the internet and declaring an emergency

15. FIRST READING :

An Ordinance to approve current replacement pages to the Chillicothe Codified Ordinances and declaring an emergency.

16. FIRST READING:

An Ordinance appropriating \$9,514.85 in insurance funds received as security as the result of a structure fire at 375 West Water Street, Chillicothe OH, and declaring an emergency.

17. FIRST READING:

An Ordinance declaring a real and present emergency and waiving the formal bidding and advertising procedure with regard to the sewer repair project at the intersection of Water and Watt Streets and declaring an emergency.

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18. FIRST READING:

A Resolution adopting the tax budget for the city of Chillicothe Ohio, for the calendar year beginning January 1, 2023, submitting the same to the County Auditor, and declaring an emergency.

19. FIRST READING:

An Ordinance addressing the provisions of amended substitute House Bill 172 concerning the right of municipalities to retain the regulations and prohibitions on the discharge, ignition and exploding of fireworks that existed prior to the enactment of amended substitute HB 172 and declaring an emergency.
