### LEGISLATION

**1. SECOND READING:**

An Ordinance amending Sections 1709.02(d) Weeds, 138.03 Nuisance Abatement definitions, and 138.06 Notice of Nuisance or Repeat Nuisance Service of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Chillicothe.

**2. SECOND READING:**

An Ordinance appropriating \$18,320.00 in insurance funds received as security as the result of a structure fire at 268 South Hickory Street, Chillicothe, Ohio, and declaring an emergency.

**3. FIRST READING:**

An Ordinance appropriating \$4,000.00 for the replacement of a traffic signal pole near 810 East Main Street and declaring an emergency.

**4. FIRST READING:**

An Ordinance appropriating \$16,000.00 for plaster and painting at the City of Chillicothe Administration Building.

**5. FIRST READING:**

An Ordinance accepting and appropriating the ARPA Law Enforcement Violence Reduction and Staffing Grant, accepting the terms of the grant agreement, approving the creation of a new fund for tracking grant revenue and expenditures, and declaring an emergency.

**6. FIRST READING:**

An Ordinance establishing an agreement between the City of Chillicothe and the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) regarding their “Municipal Bridge Inspection Program” and declaring an emergency.

**7. FIRST READING:**

An Ordinance accepting and appropriating \$4,776.20 from Ohio Mutual Insurance for repair of the wall located at the entrance of Brewer Heights, which was damaged in a traffic crash, and declaring an emergency.
