## **GRANT SUBMITTED**

- Federal Emergency Management Agency's (FEMA's)/Texas Division of Emergency Management's (TDEM's) FY 2023 Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC) Grant
  - o Grant application was submitted on Jan. 8, 2024 for the Edinburg Ebony Hills Drainage Infrastructure Project. The City requested \$2,580,000 with a 25% local match of \$860,000 and \$166,750 for management costs for a total project costs of \$3,606,750. The Edinburg Ebony Hills Drainage Infrastructure Project's direct impact area is comprised of the following subdivisions: Ebony Terrace No. 2; The Meadows Units No. 1, 2,3, 4, and 5; Golf Crest Estates Unit No. 1; and Sleepy Hollows. The project proposes the installation of new stormwater pipes and structures to ensure that water is conveyed quickly and ponding does not exceed the top of the curb. This will result in a critically needed detention pond, pump station, and improved stormwater pipes. Award notification is anticipated by September 2024.

## **GRANTS/APPLICATIONS UNDER REVIEW AND DEVELOPMENT**

- Ongoing research of federal and state grants for possible development.
- Office of the Governor's (OOG) FY 2025 Body-Worn Camera Grant
  - The OOG opened the application period for this grant on Dec. 11, 2023. This grant funds projects to obtain body-worn cameras, digital video storage, and retrieval systems or cloud-based services. A 25% match is required. A preliminary meeting was held with the Police Department on Jan. 11, 2024 to identify a potential project. The Police Department is requesting 111 updated body-worn cameras that will replace outdated ones that have reached the end of their warranty. The grant request is approximately \$49,950 with a match of \$16,650 for an approximate total project cost of \$66,600. A follow-up grant development meeting was held on Jan. 30, 2024 to continue grant development and discuss required application components. The grant deadline is Feb. 8, 2024. Award notification is anticipated by September 2024.
- Office of the Governor's (OOG) FY 2025 Bullet-Resistant Shield Grant
  - The OOG opened the application period for this grant on Dec. 11, 2023. This grant funds projects to obtain bullet-resistant shields compliant with the National Institute of Justice (NIJ) Level III, III+, or IV. There is no match requirement. A preliminary meeting was held with the Police Department on Jan. 11, 2024 to identify a potential project. The Police Department is requesting 35 additional bullet-resistant shields for investigators in the field that can report to active shooter events. The grant request is approximately \$219,936 with no local match required. A follow-up grant development meeting was held on Jan. 30, 2024 to continue grant development and discuss required application components. The grant deadline is Feb. 8, 2024. Award notification is anticipated by September 2024.
- Office of the Governor's (OOG) FY 2025 Criminal Justice Grant
  - The OOG opened the application period for this grant on Dec. 11, 2023. This grant funds projects that promote public safety, reduce crime, and improve the criminal justice system. This includes projects that pertain to crime prevention, control, or reduction, or the enforcement of the criminal law. There is no match requirement. A preliminary meeting was held with the Police Department on Jan. 11, 2024 to identify a potential project. The Police Department is requesting two digital message boards and two surveillance trailers and associated accessories. The grant request is approximately \$140,000 with no local match required. A follow-up grant development meeting was held on Jan. 30, 2024 to continue grant development and discuss required application components. The grant deadline is Feb. 8, 2024. Award notification is anticipated by September 2024.
- Office of the Governor's (OOG) FY 2025 First Responder Mental Health Grant
  - The OOG opened the application period for this grant on Dec. 11, 2023. This grant funds projects that provide services and assistance directly to peace officers and first responders to address direct and indirect trauma that occurs in the course of their normal duties either as the result of the commission of crimes by other persons or in response to an emergency. A 20% match is required. A preliminary meeting was held with the Police Department on Jan. 11, 2024 to identify a potential project. The Police Department is requesting funds to continue previous mental health programs for peace officers by offering counseling sessions and alternative therapy such as yoga classes. Funds will also cover costs for required supplies used in the counseling and therapy

sessions. The grant request is approximately \$40,000 with a match of \$10,000 for an approximate total project cost of \$50,000. A follow-up grant development meeting was held on Jan. 30, 2024 to continue grant development and discuss required application components. The grant deadline is Feb. 8, 2024. Award notification is anticipated by September 2024.

- Office of the Governor's (OOG) FY 2025 General Victim Assistance Grant
  - The OOG opened the application period for this grant on Dec. 11, 2023. This grant funds projects that provide services and assistance directly to victims of crime to speed their recovery and aid them through the criminal justice process. A 20% match is required. A preliminary meeting was held with the Police Department on Jan. 11, 2024 to identify a potential project. The Police Department is requesting funds to continue funding the salary and fringe benefits of the Crime Victim Liaison position for another one-year period for FY 2024-2025. The grant request is approximately \$33,955 with a match of \$8,489 for an approximate total project cost of \$42,444. A follow-up grant development meeting was held on Jan. 30, 2024 to continue grant development and discuss required application components. The grant deadline is Feb. 8, 2024. Award notification is anticipated by September 2024.
- Office of the Governor's (OOG) FY 2025 Project Safe Neighborhoods Grant
  - The OOG opened the application period for this grant on Dec. 11, 2023. This grant funds projects that are designed to create and foster safer neighborhoods through a sustained reduction in violent crime, including, but not limited to, addressing criminal gangs and felonious possession and use of firearms. There is no match requirement. A preliminary meeting was held with the Police Department on Jan. 11, 2024 to identify a potential project. The Police Department is requesting funds to compensate overtime and fringe costs for Commissioned Police Officers for targeted and prioritized enforcement of neighborhoods. The grant request is approximately \$75,000 with no local match required. A follow-up grant development meeting was held on Jan. 30, 2024 to continue grant development and discuss required application components. The grant deadline is Feb. 8, 2024. Award notification is anticipated by September 2024.
- Office of the Governor's (OOG) FY 2025 Violence Against Women Justice and Training Grant
  - The OOG opened the application period for this grant on Dec. 11, 2023. This grant funds projects that promote a coordinated, multi-disciplinary approach to improve the justice system's response to violent crimes against women, including domestic violence, sexual assault, dating violence, and stalking. A 30% match is required. A preliminary meeting was held with the Police Department on Jan. 11, 2024 to identify a potential project. The Police Department is requesting funds to cover overtime costs for four (4) existing Rape Aggression Defense (R.A.D) trained police officers to provide R.A.D training to women in the community. Additionally, EPD is requesting funds to send four additional police officers (two men and two women) to R.A.D training to further expand the current program. The grant request is approximately \$17,500 with a match of \$7,500 for an approximate total project cost of \$25,000. A follow-up grant development meeting was held on Jan. 30, 2024 to continue grant development and discuss required application components. The grant deadline is Feb. 8, 2024. Award notification is anticipated by September 2024.
- Office of the Governor's (OOG) FY 2024 State Homeland Security Program Grant
  - The OOG opened the application period for this grant on Dec. 11, 2023. This grant funds projects
    that support state and local efforts to prevent terrorism and targeted violence and prepare for
    the threats and hazards that pose the greatest risk to the security of Texas citizens. A preliminary

meeting was held with the Fire Department on Jan. 12 to identify potential projects, and a follow-up grant development meeting was held on Jan. 25. The Fire Department is seeking funds to purchase seven thermal imagers for first responders. These thermal imagers will be used during local or regional response to detect various issues such as overheating and circuit overload in electrical and mechanical systems, as well as to identify heat sources during structure fires or when conducting search and rescue operations. The grant request is approximately \$40,000 with no local match required. The application is due Feb. 8, 2024. Award notification is anticipated by September 2024.

- National Civic League's 2024 All-America City Award Application
  - Application development continues. The All-America City Award, bestowed yearly on 10 communities, recognizes the work of communities in using inclusive civic engagement to address critical issues and create stronger connections among residents, businesses, and nonprofit and government leaders. Application development meetings were held throughout November, December and January to discuss the application process and projects with the Library, Parks and Recreation, and City Manager's departments. The application deadline is Feb. 13, 2024. Awards will be announced in March 2024.
- Texas A&M Forest Service's Community Forestry Grants Program (Multiple Grants)
  - This grant funds projects under various categories to help communities develop sustainable programs that provide Texans with healthy trees and forests. Grant categories include (1) Climate Resiliency, (2) Human Health Equity and Accessibility, (3) Municipal Forester, (4) Tree City USA and Growth Awards, (5) Tree Planting, (6) Geospatial Analysis 65 and (7) Schoolyard Forests. Award amounts range from \$10,000 to \$3.2 million depending on project category/project type and require a 50% local match. An email for this grant opportunity was sent to the Planning Department and the City's Forester on Nov. 14, 2023 which detailed each grant category and its priorities. A follow-up email detailing the Schoolyard Forests Grant was sent to the Planning and Parks and Recreation Departments on Dec. 15, 2023. A preliminary meeting was held on Jan. 9, 2024 with City Departments to discuss application components and identify which ECISD schools qualify under the grant requirements. A meeting was held with ECISD and City staff on Jan. 15, 2024 where eight schools were identified as potential project areas. ECISD and City staff regrouped on Jan. 19, 2024 to review the agenda item requirement and finalize project selection. During this meeting, ECISD advised that there was a possibility they would partner with the Texas Trees Foundation, a nonprofit, to apply on behalf of the school district. The City followed up with ECISD requesting that the schools selected within Edinburg City Limits remain in the final application, to which ECISD agreed to do. The application deadline for all categories is Feb. 16, 2024 with award announcements expected to be made in May 2024.
- US Department of Transportation's (USDOT) FY 2024 Rebuilding American Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity (RAISE) Grant
  - The USDOT opened the application period for the FY 2024 RAISE Grant on Nov. 30, 2023. This grant funds surface transportation projects that will have a significant local or regional impact. Capital (construction) and planning projects are eligible. The award range for capital project is \$5 million to \$25 million. While the cost-share is 80/20, there is no match required for Areas of Persistent Poverty, and Historically Disadvantaged Communities. A brief overview was provided to the Engineering Department on Nov. 30, where the Grants Administration Department

recommended refining and resubmitting the 2 projects submitted last year, as those proposals received such high ratings and staff received thorough, project-specific feedback from the USDOT debriefing session held in August. Those projects were the Sprague Street Capital Grant and the Chapin Street Planning Grant. A more in-depth Grant Opportunity Form was provided to the Engineering Department on Dec. 7. A preliminary grant development meeting was held on Jan. 9, 2024. The Engineering Department decided to reapply for the Chapin Street Planning Project for the roadway redesign and complete street conversion for Chapin street, from I69C to the West City Limits. The Chapin Planning Project was scored as "Highly Rated" and a "Project of Merit," meaning it was on the Transportation Secretary's final list to be awarded before funding was depleted. The total project cost is approximately \$5,081,700 with no matching funds required. A follow up meeting was held on Jan. 24 to review the grant application requirements and further grant development. The grant deadline is Feb. 28, 2024.

- FY 2025 Community Project Funding (CPF) Appropriations
  - The Office of Congresswoman Monica De La Cruz released the Community Project funding (CPF) request for Fiscal Year 2025 on Jan. 15. This program seeks to fund projects that address the most significant needs of local communities or provide a significant public good. A Community Project Request Form was requested from the Congresswoman's Office on Jan. 15, 2024. A preliminary meeting was held with the Engineering and Utilities Department on Jan. 22, 2024 to determine a potential project. The Utilities Department is requesting funds for a National Environmental Laboratory Accreditation Program (NELAP) Certified Lab Project that will allow the City to construct an internal accredited NELAP certified lab to conduct water quality analysis that would otherwise be outsourced. The lab would collect and analyze samples on a monthly basis to ensure water quality requirements are met. The total project cost is approximately \$4,500,000 with no local match at this time. The match requirement will vary upon review of the project selected. Impact to the Utility Fund for any match on this program is currently unknown. Application deadline is March, 1, 2024.
- US Department of Energy's Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant (EECBG)
  - Grant development continues. This grant funds energy efficiency improvements that maximize benefits for local and regional communities for a variety of projects, such as developing a clean energy strategy, making buildings more energy-efficient, developing electric vehicle infrastructure, etc. Because Edinburg's population is over 35,000, the City is eligible to apply for a formula grant. Based on population, the City is eligible to apply for a grant of \$153,020, with no local match required. Grant Opportunity Form sent to Public Works and Engineering Departments on April 24, 2023. The Pre-Award Information Sheet (Application Step 1 of 2) was submitted on April 28, 2023, as required by the DOE. Throughout the summer, staff communicated with the DOE's new Performance and Accountability for Grants in Energy (PAGE) System staff to gain access to the portal where the application can be accessed and submitted. A grant development meeting was held Oct. 17, 2023 with the Engineering Department to regroup and identify a project. The group identified a need for an Energy Action Plan, and will seek funding for this. An energy and conservation master plan will be beneficial for future grant opportunities. The Engineering Department will be the implementing department and biweekly meetings will be set up for grant development once the Engineering Department provides the internal Pre-Award Grant Stakeholder Approval form. The application deadline (Step 2 of 2) was extended to April 30, 2024.

- US Department of the Interior Bureau of Reclamation FY 2024 Planning and Project Design Grant
  - Grant development continues. This grant combines 3 grant programs into 1 solicitation that will accept applications for FY 2023 and FY 2024 funding. This grant funds collaborative planning and design projects to support water management improvements. This includes funding for: (1) Water Strategy Grants to conduct planning activities to improve water supplies; (2) Project Design Grants to conduct project-specific design for projects to improve water management; and (3) comprehensive Drought Contingency Plans. All grant types have a 3-year performance period. Water Strategy and Project Design grants have a minimum award of \$100,000 and maximum award of \$400,000. Drought Contingency Planning grants have a minimum of \$25,000 and maximum of \$400,000. Water Strategy and Project Design Projects have a match requirement range of 0%, 25%, and 50% depending on project type and location. Drought Contingency Planning Projects have a 50% match requirement. Grant Opportunity Form was sent to the Utilities Department on Nov. 30, 2023. A meeting was held on Dec. 14, 2023 with the Utilities Department, Grants Administration Department and the Bureau of Reclamation to discuss the potential project for the planning of a new brackish (groundwater) water treatment plant to determine which of the 3 grant programs is the best fit, and to confirm cost-share requirements. The grant deadline is May 21, 2024.
- US Department of Transportation's (USDOT) FY 2023 and FY 2024 Bridge Investment Program Grant
  - This grant funds planning and construction activities that improve the condition of bridges in poor condition and supporting activities to prevent bridges in fair condition from dropping to poor condition within the next three years, as determined by the USDOT's National Bridge Inventory (NBI). Six (6) bridges in Edinburg are in fair condition, as per the NBI. The USDOT opened the application period for this grant on Dec. 21. Award amounts are not specified but have a maximum of \$100,000. A 20% match is required. A Grant Opportunity Form was sent to the Engineering Department on Jan. 2, 2024 and a preliminary grant development meeting was held on Jan. 9, 2024. The Sprague and Schunior bridges were identified as eligible projects. However, based on feedback received from the DOT and Local Infrastructure Hub, it was determined that an application for this grant will be submitted for the following FY 2025 Bridge Investment Program Grant cycle so that there is sufficient time to obtain a consultant to work on the required preliminary engineering and the required benefit cost analysis. This will in turn help leverage an application for the complete street conversion of Sprague Street to be applied for under the FY 2026 Rebuilding American Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity (RAISE) Grant. The FY 2025 Bridge Investment Program Grant cycle deadline is Nov. 1, 2024.
- EDA's FY 2023 Disaster Supplemental Grant
  - This grant funds assistance to communities and regions to devise and implement long-term economic recovery strategies through a variety of non-construction and construction projects, as appropriate, to address economic challenges in areas where a Presidential declaration of a major disaster was issued "as a result of Hurricanes Ian and Fiona, and of wildfires, flooding, and other natural disasters occurring in calendar years 2021 and 2022...." As a result of DR-4586 Texas Severe Winter Storms, which took place from Feb. 11, 2021 Feb. 21, 2021, the City is eligible to apply for this grant to benefit a place that was subject to a Presidentially declared disaster that occurred in 2021 or 2022. The match will be 20% generally. Maximum award amount is unspecified but previously-funded awards range from \$500,000 to \$4 million. Staff provided a Grant Opportunity Form to the EDC staff at a grant development meeting on July 20, 2023. Grants

Administration and EDC staff regrouped on this grant opportunity on Sept. 28 to identify potential projects, specifically a workforce development center. The EDC staff was to clarify the workforce development center's purpose with the Mayor and City Management, and provide an update so that the group can reconvene. A grant development meeting was set for Nov. 1 but was canceled that day due to the EDC's scheduling conflict. Accordingly, the Grants Administration Department stands ready to meet and asked the EDC to reschedule when the EDC is ready. The grant has a rolling deadline until grant funds are expended.

- EDA's FY 2023 Public Works and Economic Adjustment Assistance Grant
  - This grant funds investments to address communities' and regions' economic development needs from planning and technical assistance to construction of infrastructure. Through the primarily construction-oriented Public Works program, EDA provides catalytic investments to help distressed communities build, design, or engineer critical infrastructure and facilities that will help implement regional development strategies and advance bottom-up economic development goals to promote regional prosperity. Through the Economic Adjustment Assistance (EAA) program, EDA provides investments that support a wide range of construction and nonconstruction activities in regions experiencing adverse economic changes that may occur suddenly or over time. Supported activities include construction and non-construction such as sectoral partnerships for workforce training, design and engineering, technical assistance, economic recovery strategies, etc. The match will be 20% generally. In the past, the average size of a Public Works investment has been approximately \$1.4 million. In FY 2023, EDA expects investments ranging from \$600,000 to \$5 million. The average size of an EAA investment has been approximately \$650,000, and EDA expects to make investments ranging from \$150,000 to \$2.5 million in FY 2023. Staff provided a Grant Opportunity Form to the EDC staff at a grant development meeting on July 20, 2023. Grants Administration and EDC staff regrouped on this grant opportunity on Sept. 28 to identify potential projects, specifically a workforce development center. The EDC staff will clarify the workforce development center's purpose with the Mayor and City Management, and provide an update so that the group can reconvene. A grant development meeting was set for Nov. 1 but was canceled that day due to the EDC's scheduling conflict. Accordingly, the Grants Administration Department stands ready to meet and asked the EDC to reschedule when the EDC is ready. The grant has a rolling deadline until grant funds are expended.
- Texas GLO's Resilient Communities Program (RCP)
  - This grant funds the development, adoption, and implementation of modern and resilient building codes and flood damage prevention ordinances to ensure that structures built within the community can withstand future hazards. The City is eligible to apply for up to \$300,000. More information will be provided upon further review. This grant has a rolling deadline until all grant funds are expended.

The Warming Center opened overnight on January 15<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup>. A total of 8 people stayed at the warming center.

During that time, the library took the opportunity to lift patron spirits and promote literacy during the inclement weather by giving away knitted hats with popular characters to patrons who came by the library and checked out Library materials. The free giveaways were a big hit and the patrons were appreciative of the bonus gift.

In January, the Children's Department answered 1,029 reference questions, assisted with 1109 catalog book requests, and assisted 97 children with computer usage. The staff also promoted upcoming events and hosted their weekly programs, which include Toddler Time every Tuesday at 10 a.m., preschool story time every Friday at 10 a.m., Computer classes, and Family Storytime every Thursday at 6:00 p.m.

They also hosted a school tour, where 38 students and 8 teachers from Monte Cristo Elementary School explored the building and learned about the different services the library offers.

The staff was also invited to promote the library's services at the monthly Mission Rotary Club, where the Children's Supervisor, Viviana Caballero, provided an online presentation about the library's services. The Mission Rotary Club consists of various members who are Edinburg residents and they were very pleased to hear of the exciting programs and services offered by our library.

The Edinburg Cultural Arts Department kicked off the year with the Martin Luther King Day of Service. Originally scheduled for January 15 but postponed to January 19 due to freezing temperatures, the event focused on enhancing the Historic Black Restlawn Cemetery. Volunteers from university organizations and the community joined forces to accomplish this endeavor. We also linked the project with the ITT Challenge, which allows employees to contribute to their community while earning points for the challenge.

Additionally, volunteers undertook a second service project at the Historic Black Church, Rising Star Baptist Church, where they assisted with cleaning and repainting. This endeavor, led by the City of Edinburg Juneteenth Committee, highlights the ongoing efforts to restore historical landmarks in Edinburg's black community.

Art programs are expanding to meet the needs of our community with a full spring schedule. The Art Works program, which includes the internship program, has recruited 8 interns for the department from partners at UTRGV and World Scholars making the Cultural Arts Division a training and teaching site for your creative professionals. The Missoula Children's Theater summer program is returning to Edinburg thanks to a collaboration between the Cultural Arts Division, the Edinburg Arts Foundation, and the generous support of the Rotary Club of

Edinburg. Also, the first of 10 muralists has been selected and will be proceeding with additional opportunities for artists to be part of the creative Edinburg community.

Additionally, the Cultural Arts Department collaborated with the Public Works Department with their Equipment Rod-E-O at the Richard R. Flores Stadium on January 13 providing assets and staff to assist at the event. We also collaborated with the City Manager's Department for the Challenge RGV event on January 27 at the McIntyre promenade for the RGV Challenge's weigh-in and look forward to collaborating for the weigh-out in March.

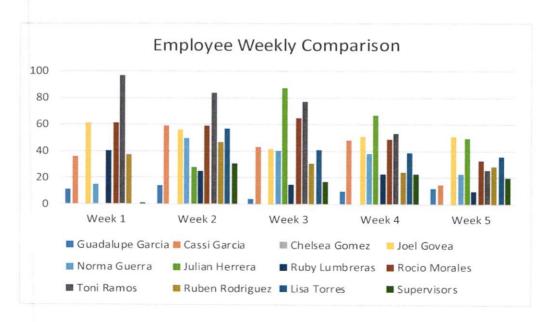




The responsibility of the court clerk's position and the scope of duties have greatly increased in recent years. Although court clerks do not have authority to exercise judicial discretion, they may carry out the duties that are legally delegated from the judge. The professionalism, timeliness, and accuracy of the court clerk's actions are important to the proper operation of the municipal court. As such, the court clerk can have tremendous impact on the perception of the justice system. The court clerk likely has more contact with individual defendants in municipal courts on a daily basis than the judge, prosecutor, or even law enforcement. Consequently, the public will develop a perception of municipal courts largely based on interactions with the court clerk.

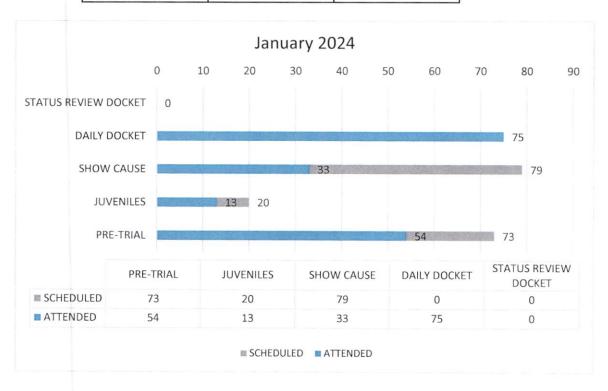

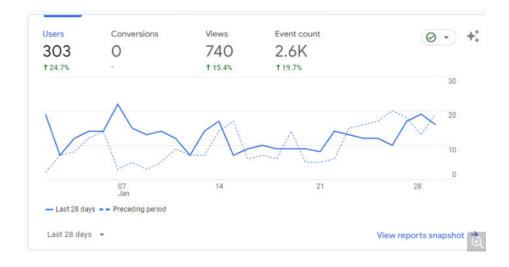

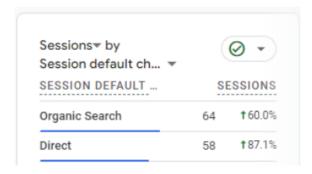
#### SOCIAL MEDIA / OUTRECH

A charitable deduction for both income tax can be taken based on the fair market value of the stock at the time your gift is made. Gifts of low-basis stock can produce larger charitable deductions. A gift of closely-held stock can allow the donor to maintain control of the corporation while still claiming both capital gains and income tax deductions. A gift of appreciated real property will allow the donor to avoid capital gains tax as well as brokerage fees and closing costs.

#### Giving Life Insurance

New or current life insurance policies may be transferred or irrevocably assigned to the Boys & Girls Clubs as beneficiary; or a donor can retain ownership of a policy, pay the premium and simply name the Boys & Girls Clubs as the beneficiary. Both have substantial tax benefits to the donor and the donor's estate.

#### Charitable Remainder Trust

A significant donation can be structured in a trust as either a lifetime income for one or more beneficiaries, with the income going to the Boys & Girls Clubs, or with the lifetime income going to the Boys & Girls Clubs and the remainder going to the beneficiaries. Trusts can be designed to meet individual needs of the donor to provide savings on income, capital gains and estate taxes.

#### **Gift Annuity**

These vehicles are a legal agreement to transfer money or securities to the Boys & Girls Clubs. The donor receives fixed payments for life based on his or her age, prevailing interest rates and an actuarial table, as well as an income tax deduction for the donated asset value.

The Community Health Challenge is in its 15th season of promoting healthy lifestyles

The City of Edinburg, UT Health Houston School of Public Health in Brownsville, and the City of Brownsville are excited to bring The Challenge-RGV 2024, a healthy weight-loss and lifestyle change initiative to the Upper Valley! This year marks the 15th season of The Challenge-RGV, and the opportunities are expanding to Hidalgo



County residents, thanks to a new collaboration with the City of Edinburg. A press conference will kick off The Challenge on Thursday, Jan. 4, at 10 a.m. at Edinburg City Hall, 415 W. University Drive.

The Challenge-RGV provides people with the tools and opportunities to make sustainable, healthy lifestyle changes and lose weight when appropriate. Over the course of three months, participants have free access to gyms, exercise classes, health screenings, cooking classes, and outdoor fitness opportunities.

"We are excited to welcome The Challenge-RGV to our city and provide our residents with an incredible opportunity for positive, sustainable lifestyle changes. This collaboration underscores our commitment to promoting health and well-being in our community," Edinburg Mayor Ramiro Garza Jr. said.

By fostering a culture of wellness and providing accessible resources, we aim to inspire positive transformations in the lives of our residents."

Dr. Arturo Rodriguez, Director of the City of Brownsville Health and Wellness Department and co-founder of The Challenge-RGV, shares, "The City of Brownsville is committed to offering its residents opportunities to improve their health. The Challenge is a fun and free way for folks to learn about small changes that can greatly impact health and well-being. We look forward to an opportunity to bring our communities together to celebrate health."

Dr. Belinda Reininger, Dean of the UT Health Houston School of Public Health, based in Brownsville, agrees with Gowen about the economic impact over the years. "Our economy is positively impacted when we improve the health of our community members, reducing the cost of chronic diseases which are related to overweight and obesity, like diabetes and hypertension, and improving the quality of life."

#### **Edinburg EDC launches Facade and Lot Improvement Program**

FLIP to offer up to \$10,000 in grants to support 40 qualifying businesses



The Edinburg Economic Development Corporation (EEDC) is launching the Façade and Lot Improvement Program (FLIP), an initiative aimed at providing financial assistance to local small businesses that have faced significant challenges in recent years.

The FLIP program addresses the aftermath of the pandemic, high inflation, and severe weather storms that have adversely affected the local economy, causing damage to signs, awnings, facades, parking lots, and more. The EEDC is committed to supporting the community's recovery by offering up to \$10,000 in grants to qualifying small businesses for repairs and improvements. The program officially launches on January 8, 2024.



PROGRAM DETAILS: The EEDC has allocated \$400,000 for the Fiscal Year 2023-2024 to support at least 40 qualifying small businesses, providing grants of up to \$10,000 each. The program covers repairs to existing parking lots, signage, and facades, with eligible improvements to be implemented from the date of program initiation through September 30, 2024. Final approval from the EEDC Board of Directors is required for the grant.

The FLIP program operates on a reimbursement basis, with approved projects receiving funds upon completion. Any project expenses incurred before approval and obtaining the building permit will not be reimbursed unless approved by the EEDC Board of Directors.

Additionally, if a qualifying business faces financial hardship preventing them from undertaking the contemplated improvements, the EEDC may consider providing financial assistance up to the grant amount.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS: To qualify for the FLIP program, businesses must meet the following criteria:

- Located within Edinburg City Limits.
  Commercial property owner and/or an existing for-profit business (tenant) in Edinburg with fewer than 20 employees.
  Currently operating and locally owned.

- Current with all local property tax payments.

  No outstanding code enforcement violations or liens.

  Submission of two quotes for work, with at least one from an Edinburg business/vendor/contractor.

  Authorization from the landlord via letter if the grant recipient is a tenant.

**ELIGIBLE EXPENSES:** The program covers hard costs associated with the renovation of exterior portions of property owned or leased by the qualifying small business. Eligible expenses include, but are not limited to:

- Construction of outdoor patios.
  Exterior painting, re-siding, cleaning, or other façade improvements.
  Restoration of significant architectural details.
  Installation of permanent landscaping.
  New doors, windows, or awnings.
  Parking lot resurfacing with striping.
  Repair, removal, and replacement of old signage.
  Roof repairs that are part of the existing building.

Before starting work, all improvement projects must be approved by the EEDC staff and the City of Edinburg's Development Services. Permit fees are waived for approved projects.

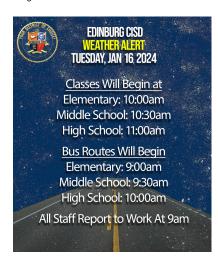
## Hidalgo County offices to delay opening on Tuesday due to inclement weather

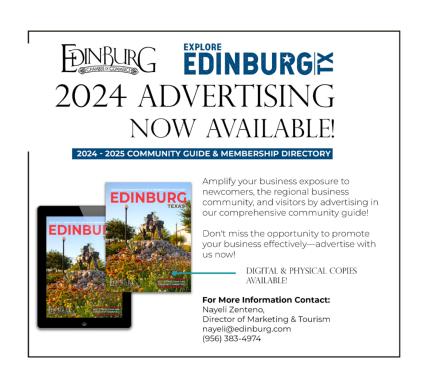

#### **Edinburg Announces New Utility Rates to Support** Infrastructure Improvements

After careful consideration, the City of Edinburg has made the decision to implement a modest rate adjustment in utility rates, marking the first adjustment in over a decade. The new rates are set to go into

In recognizing the financial challenges faced by residents, and prior to implementing the change, the City of Edinburg contracted a utility rate consultant to conduct a comparative analysis and received input from the City's financial advisors. In addition, a Utility Rate Study Task Force was created consisting of local residents to provide community involvement and input.

In the last 12 years, the City of Edinburg has grown substantially, demanding essential infrastructure upgrades and improvements. These enhancements play a crucial role in guaranteeing the ongoing provision of reliable and efficient services to residents. Even with the proposed rate change, Edinburg's water rates remain well below the average of other cities in South Texas. Based on consumption, the rate adjustment will affect homeowners an additional \$2.96 for 5,000 gallons of usage per month beginning March 1, 2024. "City of Edinburg residents will continue to benefit from water rates that remain below those of neighboring cities and other water service providers. The rates will continue to be less than half the state average," Utility Director Gerardo Carmona said. "Despite maintaining the lowest water rates in the Valley for over a decade, these necessary adjustments are essential to meet current growing demands and fund crucial infrastructure improvements for our community."

To facilitate a smooth transition, a grace period will be in effect through the end of February 2024, allowing residents to adjust to the new rates. The City of Edinburg expresses its gratitude to the community for its understanding and support as it works towards creating a sustainable and resilient future for all residents. ## UTRGV FOOTBALL HIRES MARCUS COLEMAN AS SPECIAL TEAMS COORDINATOR AND CORNERBACKS COACH

The University of Texas Rio Grande Valley (UTRGV) head football coach Travis Bush announced on Friday the hiring of Marcus Coleman, who was a Hall of Fame defensive back at Texas Tech and played 11 seasons in the NFL, including four with the Houston Texans and one with the Dallas Cowboys, as the special teams coordinator and cornerbacks coach.

Coleman has been coaching for nine years, including the last five with Trinity as special teams coordinator and defensive backs coach. He previously coached in the Indoor Football League (IFL) for four seasons, as the head coach and defensive coordinator of the Tucson Sugar Skulls in 2019, defensive coordinator and defensive backs coach with the lowa Barnstormers from 2016-18, and defensive backs coach for the Tri Cities Fever in 2016. Coleman previously served as the defensive backs coach for the College Gridiron Showcase and the defensive coordinator for Pflugerville High School's 7 on 7 team in 2015. He has additional experience as a scout, working with The Sideline View in 2013 and 2014.

Coleman also spent time working with the Baltimore Ravens defensive backs during training camp in 2023 and the Jacksonville Jaguars linebackers during training camp in 2022. His time with the Jaguars came after being awarded the Bill Walsh NFL Diversity Coaching Fellowship.

"Marcus Coleman is a slam dunk hire for UTRGV Football," Bush said. "He spent 11 years in the NFL as a defensive back and playing on special teams. He will bring great detail and expertise to our young program. He obviously knows what it takes to get to the next level and will find ways to maximize the potential of everyone he coaches. Being a former Texas High School player and All-American at Texas Tech, he already has great recruiting ties across the state and will help bring some more top talent down to the Valley. We are extremely excited to add Coach Coleman to the Vaqueros Family."

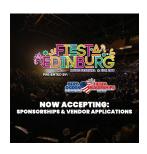

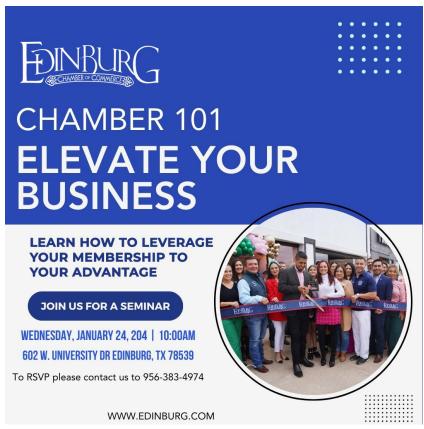




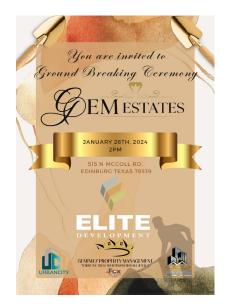

Melissa and Luna met with Cynthia Glover for a possible donation of an antique Glover printing press and a counting machine. Logistics about transporting the artifact must be discussed before further action is made.

Melissa and Kelly met with Margaret Culbertson and Michelle Johnson from the William J. Hill Texas Artisans and Artists Archive in Houston. They are working on compiling a database of pre-1900 artifacts and archival materials from around the state.

Luna's student intern Annete is assisting with cross checking former loan files (1990s) for any missing information. Annete is learning how to process a large collection of 3D artifacts, donated from Ron Stone.

Rentals: There were two daytime rentals in December.

Heritage Associate Drive: The 2024 Heritage Associate Drive officially began with a training workshop (Boat House Workshop) on Dec. 5. <u>Museum Store</u>: New merchandise was ordered. A 25% After Christmas sale was planned to take place the weekend of the Dia de Los Reyes on January 6 & 7, 2024.

<u>Grants Report</u>: (reported by Maria Rodriguez, Grants Coordinator/Assistant Development Officer)

Active Grants this month: 1; Cumulative active grant awards remaining,

- 1. "Families and University Together as a Unit for Research and Education (FUTURE): Connecting Hispanic Families to Geosciences Through Community Informal Learning Network": The goal of the proposed project, FUTURE (Families and University Together as a Unit for Research and Education), is to test and examine an approach to stimulate Hispanic participation in geosciences by connecting families (parents and students/children) through an informal learning network (in geosciences). With the experience gained in a previous GEOPATHS project, the leadership team will expand and scale up the established platform and infrastructure of its existing program transforming the traditional Geoscience Learning Ecosystems (GLEs) while nurturing the Hispanic Geoscience workforce in a way that it can be expanded nationally. This project is for three years at \$2,500 per year. \$2,500/0% (Per three years for a total of \$7,500)
- 2. Labeling History: A Look into the Ed Pease Collection of Produce Labels: This exhibition is a two-phase project. The first phase will produce an exhibit using archival materials that were donated by Carol Pease, the wife of the late collector Ed Pease. The exhibit will be on display at the museum as a Spotlight Exhibit, a term coined for temporary exhibits. The second phase will include contacting other museums, libraries, and businesses to offer the exhibit for display at their institutions. \$5,130/0%

#### Pending Grants:

1. Texas Travel Industry Recovery Grant Program Second Round: up to \$250,000 Businesses that previously applied for — and received — grants, can apply again to receive more funds if they qualify, minus the funds they received earlier. To qualify for the \$250,000 reimbursement, a business must document at least that amount in expenses, which may include payroll, rent, utilities and maintenance. (TTIR) was established by Senate Bill 8 during the 87th Legislature, Third Special Session, to administer \$180 million of funds received from the Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund, which was established under the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021. The purpose of TTIR is to provide grants for the recovery of Texas businesses in the tourism, travel, and hospitality industry that were negatively impacted due to COVID-19. TTIR will support the Texas tourism, travel, and hospitality industry by making grant funds available to businesses negatively impacted by COVID-19 to improve safety, customer service, and hospitality within their operations and further encourage travel and tourism industry recovery.

#### Submitted This Month

1. Lady Byrd Johnson Wildflower Center Seed Grant: \$500. Applied for a gift certificate to purchase native plant seeds from the Center. The seeds will be used to further sustain or expand the living collection of native plants in Legacy Park. The condition is that the museum would provide identification and interpretation of these plants for visitors.

The museum's overall attendance for the month of January was 86% when compared to prior year attendance.

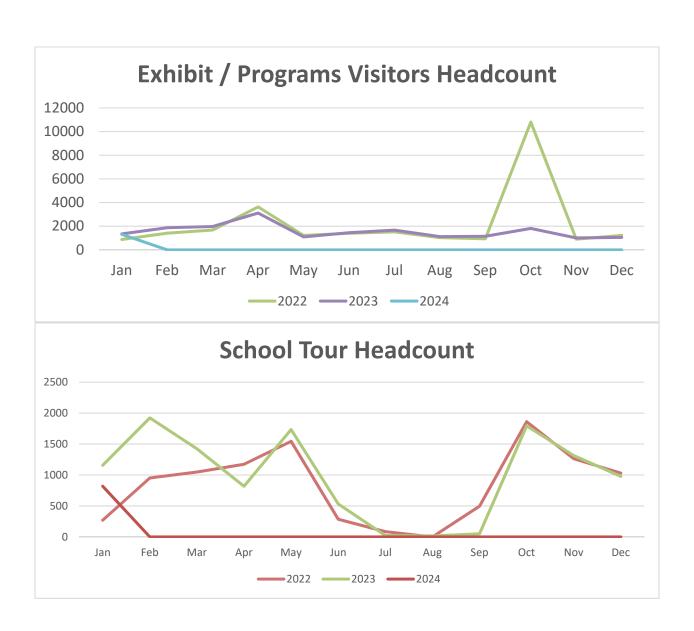
Museum store revenues for January were 79% versus 2022. Museum store revenue was 106% versus budget in January.

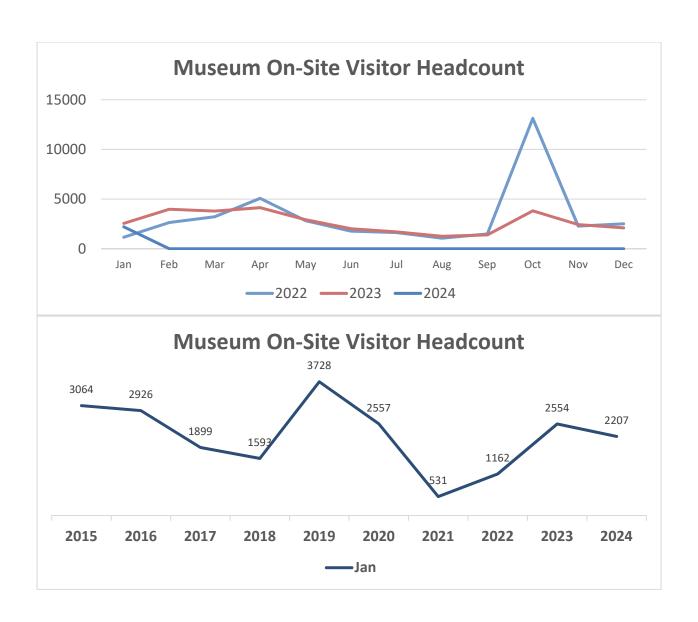

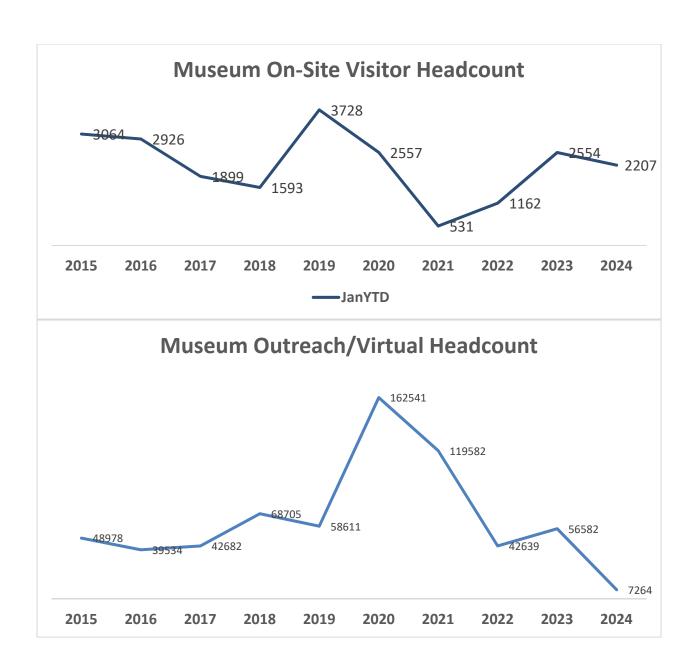

## **Synopsis of January Financials**

#### **Balance Sheet:**

Working capital (excluding operating reserves) was \$1,061K, an increase of \$122K since 1/31/2024. More specifically, \$887K of the working capital assets were unrestricted cash-in-bank. The current liability as of 1/31 was \$165K. The quick ratio (excluding operating reserves) is 7:1.

Investments in the Museum's Operating Reserve market value increased in January by \$3K. The portfolio recognized actual realized gains/(losses) of \$0K in January. Investments in our Endowment Fund decreased in market value by \$29K in January. There were 6 sales transactions in our Endowment's portfolio during January resulting in actual realized gains/(losses) of \$(4K).

#### **P&L (YTD):**

The January P&L reflects a net surplus of \$120K, a \$9K favorable variance. Revenues, net of the non-cash in-kind contribution line item, are favorable by \$0K. Favorable line items are Store sales \$1K. there are no Unfavorable line items.

On the expense side of the equation, the favorable expense variance of \$9K consists of a mixed bag of line items. The most notable favorable variances are Wages (and related costs) \$9K. There are no notable unfavorable variances.
