- Ongoing research of federal and state grants for possible development.
- Federal Emergency Management Agency's (FEMA's)/Texas Division of Emergency Management's (TDEM's) FY 2023 Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC) Grant
 - O This grant funds hazard mitigation activities that are identified in a jurisdiction's Hazard Mitigation Action Plan. The matching requirement is 25%, and the award range is unspecified. TDEM opened the application period for this grant opportunity on Oct. 16, 2023. While the solicitation and program support materials were under review, Grants Administration staff notified the Engineering Department of this opportunity on Oct. 17 for staff's consideration and to begin identifying potential projects. A Grant Opportunity Form was provided to the Engineering Department on Nov. 2, and grant development meetings took place throughout December with the Engineering Department. The Ebony Hills Drainage Project was selected from the 4 projects that were narrowed down for consideration that align with grant priorities for maximum

competitiveness. The grant project was considered and authorized to be submitted by the City Council on Dec. 19, 2023. The grant deadline is Jan. 8, 2024.

- Office of the Governor's (OOG) FY 2025 Body-Worn Camera Grant
 - The OOG opened the application period for this grant on Dec. 11, 2023. This grant funds projects to obtain body-worn cameras, digital video storage, and retrieval systems or cloud-based services. A 25% match is required. A brief overview was provided to the Police Department on Dec. 13 and a more detailed Grant Opportunity Form will be provided to the Police Department in January, followed by grant development meetings. The grant deadline is Feb. 8, 2024.
- Office of the Governor's (OOG) FY 2025 Bullet-Resistant Shield Grant
 - The OOG opened the application period for this grant on Dec. 11, 2023. This grant funds projects to obtain bullet-resistant shields compliant with the National Institute of Justice (NIJ) Level III, III+, or IV. There is no match requirement. A brief overview was provided to the Police Department on Dec. 13 and a more detailed Grant Opportunity Form will be provided to the Police Department in January, followed by grant development meetings. The grant deadline is Feb. 8, 2024.
- Office of the Governor's (OOG) FY 2025 Criminal Justice Grant
 - The OOG opened the application period for this grant on Dec. 11, 2023. This grant funds projects that promote public safety, reduce crime, and improve the criminal justice system. This includes projects that pertain to crime prevention, control, or reduction, or the enforcement of the criminal law. There is no match requirement. A brief overview was provided to the Police Department on Dec. 13 and a more detailed Grant Opportunity Form will be provided to the Police Department in January, followed by grant development meetings. The grant deadline is Feb. 8, 2024.
- Office of the Governor's (OOG) FY 2025 First Responder Mental Health Grant
 - The OOG opened the application period for this grant on Dec. 11, 2023. This grant funds projects that provide services and assistance directly to peace officers and first responders to address direct and indirect trauma that occurs in the course of their normal duties either as the result of the commission of crimes by other persons or in response to an emergency. A 20% match is required. A brief overview was provided to the Police Department on Dec. 13 and a more detailed Grant Opportunity Form will be provided to the Police Department in January, followed by grant development meetings. The grant deadline is Feb. 8, 2024.
- Office of the Governor's (OOG) FY 2025 General Victim Assistance Grant
 - The OOG opened the application period for this grant on Dec. 11, 2023. This grant funds projects that provide services and assistance directly to victims of crime to speed their recovery and aid them through the criminal justice process. A 20% match is required. A brief overview was provided to the Police Department on Dec. 13 and a more detailed Grant Opportunity Form will be provided to the Police Department in January, followed by grant development meetings. The grant deadline is Feb. 8, 2024.
- Office of the Governor's (OOG) FY 2025 Project Safe Neighborhoods Grant
 - The OOG opened the application period for this grant on Dec. 11, 2023. This grant funds projects that are designed to create and foster safer neighborhoods through a sustained reduction in

violent crime, including, but not limited to, addressing criminal gangs and felonious possession and use of firearms. There is no match requirement. A brief overview was provided to the Police Department on Dec. 13 and a more detailed Grant Opportunity Form will be provided to the Police Department in January, followed by grant development meetings. The grant deadline is Feb. 8, 2024.

- Office of the Governor's (OOG) FY 2025 Violence Against Women Justice and Training Grant
 - The OOG opened the application period for this grant on Dec. 11, 2023. This grant funds projects that promote a coordinated, multi-disciplinary approach to improve the justice system's response to violent crimes against women, including domestic violence, sexual assault, dating violence, and stalking. A 30% match is required. A brief overview was provided to the Police Department on Dec. 13 and a more detailed Grant Opportunity Form will be provided to the Police Department in January, followed by grant development meetings. The grant deadline is Feb. 8, 2024.
- National Civic League's 2024 All-America City Award Application
 - O Application development continues. The All-America City Award, bestowed yearly on 10 communities, recognizes the work of communities in using inclusive civic engagement to address critical issues and create stronger connections among residents, businesses, and nonprofit and government leaders. A development meeting was held on Nov. 21, 2023 to discuss the application process and projects with the Library and Parks and Recreation departments, and another was held on Dec. 27, 2023 with the Parks and Recreation Department. The next meeting will take place in January with the Library. The application deadline is Feb. 13, 2024.
- Texas A&M Forest Service's Community Forestry Grants Program (Multiple Grants)
 - This grant funds projects under various categories to help communities develop sustainable programs that provide Texans with healthy trees and forests. Grant categories include (1) Climate Resiliency, (2) Human Health Equity and Accessibility, (3) Municipal Forester, (4) Tree City USA and Growth Awards, (5) Tree Planting, (6) Geospatial Analysis 65 and (7) Schoolyard Forests. Award amounts range from \$10,000 to \$3.2 million depending on project category/project type and require a 50% local match. An email for this grant opportunity was sent to the Planning Department and the City's Forester on Nov. 14, 2023 which detailed each grant category and its priorities. A follow-up email detailing the Schoolyard Forests Grant was sent to the Planning and Parks and Recreation Departments on Dec. 15, 2023, and a full Grant Opportunity Form will be provided to the departments in early January. The application deadline for all categories is Feb. 16, 2024 with award announcements expected to be made approximately May 2024.
- US Department of Transportation's (USDOT) FY 2023 and FY 2024 Bridge Investment Program Grant
 - This grant funds planning and construction activities that improve the condition of bridges in poor condition and supporting activities to prevent bridges in fair condition from dropping to poor condition within the next three years, as determined by the USDOT's National Bridge Inventory (NBI). Six bridges in Edinburg are in fair condition, as per the NBI. The USDOT opened the application period for this grant on Dec. 21. This grant is under review and a Grant Opportunity Form will be provided to the Engineering Department in early January, along with a Bridge Summary Report of the condition of bridges in Edinburg. The grant requires a 20% match. The deadline for the Planning Grant is Feb. 19, and the deadline for the Bridge Project (Construction) Grant is March 19.

- US Department of Transportation's (USDOT) FY 2024 Rebuilding American Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity (RAISE) Grant
 - The USDOT opened the application period for the FY 2024 RAISE Grant on Nov. 30, 2023. This grant funds surface transportation projects that will have a significant local or regional impact. Capital (construction) and planning projects are eligible. The award range for capital project is \$5 million to \$25 million. While the cost-share is 80/20, there is no match required for Areas of Persistent Poverty, and Historically Disadvantaged Communities. A brief overview was provided to the Engineering Department on Nov. 30, where the Grants Administration Department recommended refining and resubmitting the 2 projects submitted last year, as those proposals received such high ratings and staff received thorough, project-specific feedback from the USDOT debriefing session held in August. Those projects were the Sprague Street Capital Grant and the Chapin Street Planning Grant. A more in-depth Grant Opportunity Form was provided to the Engineering Department on Dec. 7. In the meantime, the grant is under review and consideration by the Engineering Department. The grant deadline is Feb. 28, 2024.
- US Department of the Interior Bureau of Reclamation FY 2024 Planning and Project Design Grant
 - o Grant development continues. This grant combines 3 grant programs into 1 solicitation that will accept applications for FY 2023 and FY 2024 funding. This grant funds collaborative planning and design projects to support water management improvements. This includes funding for: (1) Water Strategy Grants to conduct planning activities to improve water supplies; (2) Project Design Grants to conduct project-specific design for projects to improve water management; and (3) comprehensive Drought Contingency Plans. All grant types have a 3-year performance period. Water Strategy and Project Design grants have a minimum award of \$100,000 and maximum award of \$400,000. Drought Contingency Planning grants have a minimum of \$25,000 and maximum of \$400,000. Water Strategy and Project Design Projects have a match requirement range of 0%, 25%, and 50% depending on project type and location. Drought Contingency Planning Projects have a 50% match requirement. Grant Opportunity Form was sent to the Utilities Department on Nov. 30, 2023. A meeting was held on Dec. 14, 2023 with the Utilities Department, Grants Administration Department and the Bureau of Reclamation to discuss the potential project for the planning of a new brackish (groundwater) water treatment plant to determine which of the 3 grant programs is the best fit, and to confirm cost-share requirements. The grant deadline is April 2, 2024.
- US Department of Energy's Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant (EECBG)
 - o Grant development continues. This grant funds energy efficiency improvements that maximize benefits for local and regional communities for a variety of projects, such as developing a clean energy strategy, making buildings more energy-efficient, developing electric vehicle infrastructure, etc. Because Edinburg's population is over 35,000, the City is eligible to apply for a formula grant. Based on population, the City is eligible to apply for a grant of \$153,020, with no local match required. Grant Opportunity Form sent to Public Works and Engineering Departments on April 24. The Pre-Award Information Sheet (Application Step 1 of 2) was submitted on April 28, as required by the DOE. Throughout the summer, staff communicated with the DOE's new Performance and Accountability for Grants in Energy (PAGE) System staff to gain access to the portal where the application can be accessed and submitted. A grant development meeting was held Oct. 17, 2023 with the Engineering Department to regroup and identify a project. The group identified a need for an Energy Action Plan, and will seek funding for this. An energy and

conservation master plan will be beneficial for future grant opportunities. The Engineering Department will be the implementing department and biweekly meetings will be set up for grant development once the Engineering Department provides the internal Pre-Award Grant Stakeholder Approval form. The application deadline (Step 2 of 2) was extended to April 30, 2024.

• EDA's FY 2023 Disaster Supplemental Grant

This grant funds assistance to communities and regions to devise and implement long-term economic recovery strategies through a variety of non-construction and construction projects, as appropriate, to address economic challenges in areas where a Presidential declaration of a major disaster was issued "as a result of Hurricanes Ian and Fiona, and of wildfires, flooding, and other natural disasters occurring in calendar years 2021 and 2022...." As a result of DR-4586 Texas Severe Winter Storms, which took place from Feb. 11, 2021 – Feb. 21, 2021, the City is eligible to apply for this grant to benefit a place that was subject to a Presidentially declared disaster that occurred in 2021 or 2022. The match will be 20% generally. Maximum award amount is unspecified but previously-funded awards range from \$500,000 to \$4 million. Staff provided a Grant Opportunity Form to the EDC staff at a grant development meeting on July 20, 2023. Grants Administration and EDC staff regrouped on this grant opportunity on Sept. 28 to identify potential projects, specifically a workforce development center. The EDC staff was to clarify the workforce development center's purpose with the Mayor and City Management, and provide an update so that the group can reconvene. A grant development meeting was set for Nov. 1 but was canceled that day due to the EDC's scheduling conflict. Accordingly, the Grants Administration Department stands ready to meet and asked the EDC to reschedule when the EDC is ready. The grant has a rolling deadline until grant funds are expended.

• EDA's FY 2023 Public Works and Economic Adjustment Assistance Grant

This grant funds investments to address communities' and regions' economic development needs from planning and technical assistance to construction of infrastructure. Through the primarily construction-oriented Public Works program, EDA provides catalytic investments to help distressed communities build, design, or engineer critical infrastructure and facilities that will help implement regional development strategies and advance bottom-up economic development goals to promote regional prosperity. Through the Economic Adjustment Assistance (EAA) program, EDA provides investments that support a wide range of construction and nonconstruction activities in regions experiencing adverse economic changes that may occur suddenly or over time. Supported activities include construction and non-construction such as sectoral partnerships for workforce training, design and engineering, technical assistance, economic recovery strategies, etc. The match will be 20% generally. In the past, the average size of a Public Works investment has been approximately \$1.4 million. In FY 2023, EDA expects investments ranging from \$600,000 to \$5 million. The average size of an EAA investment has been approximately \$650,000, and EDA expects to make investments ranging from \$150,000 to \$2.5 million in FY 2023. Staff provided a Grant Opportunity Form to the EDC staff at a grant development meeting on July 20, 2023. Grants Administration and EDC staff regrouped on this grant opportunity on Sept. 28 to identify potential projects, specifically a workforce development center. The EDC staff will clarify the workforce development center's purpose with the Mayor and City Management, and provide an update so that the group can reconvene. A grant development meeting was set for Nov. 1 but was canceled that day due to the EDC's scheduling conflict. Accordingly, the Grants Administration Department stands ready to meet and asked the EDC to

reschedule when the EDC is ready. The grant has a rolling deadline until grant funds are expended.

- Texas GLO's Resilient Communities Program (RCP)
 - This grant funds the development, adoption, and implementation of modern and resilient building codes and flood damage prevention ordinances to ensure that structures built within the community can withstand future hazards. The City is eligible to apply for up to \$300,000. More information will be provided upon further review. This grant has a rolling deadline until all grant funds are expended.

The City of Edinburg continued the Hometown Holiday Celebration into December 1, 2023. This wrapped up the 2nd time the tree is lit up at the amphitheater and has become a tradition in Edinburg. About 5,000 people attended the Hometown Holiday Celebration event, which included pictures with Santa, pony rides, carnival rides, a holiday market, and many different local caroler groups from Edinburg schools.

The Cultural Arts Department is actively standardizing festival maps for the various events scheduled in 2024. This initiative involves collaborating with organizers to create a cohesive visual identity, incorporating venue-specific details, and integrating the idea into online vendor registration to make sign-up smoother for both parties. By ensuring consistency and aesthetic appeal, the department aims to streamline navigation, reduce confusion, and elevate the overall quality of the cultural events throughout the year. This commitment reflects our dedication to fostering a thriving cultural arts department and delivering memorable experiences for all attendees and vendors.

Fall classes wrapped up in December with positive feedback from attendees. Art classes, in particular, saw excellent attendance. The drawing class participants formed a close-knit community, culminating in a small potluck on their final day.

The Art & Wellness initiative is progressing, with robust plans to conclude festival preparations for July 27, 2024, in the upcoming January/February timeframe. Additionally, efforts are underway to finalize a class brochure that showcases all the classes and workshops available through the Saludarte program.

On December 8th, 2023, the Cultural Arts team had a retreat that served as a strategic initiative to address mental fatigue resulting from a year packed with festivals, events, and last-minute programs. The retreat aimed to re-energize the team by providing a break from their routine, while fostering a strong sense of unity and inspiration as they approached a new year of events.

The day prior, the team visited the Arts, Culture, and Events (ACE) Center, then on Dec. 8th, the retreat was held at the University of Texas-RGV Art campus down the street from the library, where they were able to physically experience a similar environment, helping them visualize and conceptualize how the ACE Center could be effectively utilized in future art programming.

On December 18 and 20th, the City of Edinburg Conceptos Dance Ensemble conducted auditions, with a significant turnout. Out of the participants, twenty-nine (29) were invited to join the team. We look forward to witnessing the ongoing growth of the city's new dance ensemble, as they expand their impact in the community through competition-level classes and beginner classes tailored for both children and adults.

We had only one rental at the auditorium along with our weekly arts programs/classes, which last month included the Conceptos dance rehearsals, the family music therapy class, and the community theatre class. 1st Position Dance Studio hosted their tech-heavy dance recitals for approximately 450 people in attendance for both performances. We have currently booked 2 more rentals for January and are in contact with the lessees to accommodate their production needs.

Court Hearings are prepared to determine temporary, agreed, or some procedural matters regarding the citations/complaints. Court clerks work diligently to provide equal and impartial justice under the law as well as process each case efficiently and without delay.

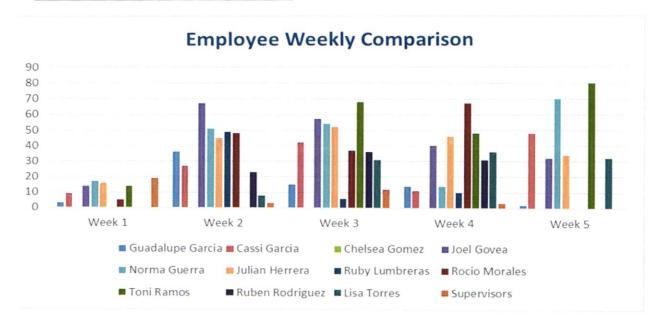

The responsibility of the court clerk's position and the scope of duties have greatly increased in recent years. Although court clerks do not have authority to exercise judicial discretion, they may carry out the duties that are legally delegated from the judge. The professionalism, timeliness, and accuracy of the court clerk's actions are important to the proper operation of the municipal court. As such, the court clerk can have tremendous impact on the perception of the justice system. The court clerk likely has more contact with individual defendants in municipal courts on a daily basis than the judge, prosecutor, or even law enforcement. Consequently, the public will develop a perception of municipal courts largely based on interactions with the court clerk.

Comic book artist to present at MOSTHistory

Author and cartoonist José Alaniz will present a new prose and comics collection published by FlowerSong Press at 2 p.m. Dec. 10 at the Museum of South Texas History.

The hybrid book features short stories and comics, mostly set in the Rio Grande Valley along the Texas-Mexico border. The stories reflect the author's upbringing in this region as a second-generation Mexican-American, at times fusing folk beliefs with Bradbury-style science fiction. For example, "Tamales" sets the immigration narrative on Mars in 2063, when a migrant family makes the crossing in search of work via (malfunctioning) rocket.

Other stories, like "Genoveva" and "Where You Stop the Story," retell painful family episodes going back years and generations. The complex earlier "Electric Youth" recognite incidents from Alapiz's

comics section, "Electric Youth," recounts incidents from Alaniz's childhood in South Texas, some of them told in Spanglish. These range from nostalgic (like one showing how common and pleasant it used to be to cross the river to Reynosa, Mexico, for family outings) to funny-gross (the author's memory of stepping on a nail) to self-flagellating (the reimagining of ethnic self-loathing through a Star Wars metaphor). This collection will appeal to readers with an interest in contemporary Chicano fiction and comics.

Born in Edinburg, Alaniz graduated from the University of Texas at Austin in 1993 with dual degrees in Radio-Television-Film Production and Russian Studies. He worked in Moscow, Russia, as a journalist from 1993-1994. In 2003 he earned a Ph.D. in comparative literature at the University of California, Berkeley. Since 2003 he has worked as a comics scholar and professor at the University of Washington, Seattle, in the Department of Slavic Languages and Literatures and the Department of Cinema & Media Studies. He has released three comics-prose collections: "The Phantom Zone and Other Stories" (2020) and "The Compleat Moscow Calling" (2023), both from Amatl Comix, and "Puro Pinche True Fictions" (2023, FlowerSong Press).

Hidalgo County warns public about scammers representing themselves as law enforcement

EDINBURG – Hidalgo County officials are warning the public of a telephone scam in which callers identify themselves as members of the Hidalgo County Sheriff's Department and claims that the County Judge has issued an arrest warrant for the person answering the phone.

The caller provides fictitious case numbers and then claims that the caller can settle the issue and have the warrant dropped if the recipient of the call pays a sum of money over the phone.

The Hidalgo County Judge's Office and the Hidalgo County Sheriff's Department along with other Hidalgo County law enforcement entities do not settle arrest warrants over the phone and both agencies are warning the public that these calls are part of an ongoing criminal enterprise.

People receiving such calls are advised to contact local law enforcement immediately and not to pay for anything or provide personal data to any caller over the telephone.

UTRGV Football Hires Mike Schultz as Assistant Coach

RIO GRANDE VALLEY – The University of Texas Rio Grande Valley (UTRGV) head football coach Travis Bush announced on Friday the hiring of Mike Schultz, who has more than 40 years of coaching experience, including 37 at the NCAA Division I level, as an assistant coach.

Schultz's collegiate coaching stops include serving as the head coach at Lamar (2017-19), offensive coordinator at Texas State (2011-15), Middle Tennessee State (2010), Illinois (2009), and TCU (1998-2009), assistant head coach/running backs/secondary at New Mexico (1992-97), running backs/secondary coach at Texas State (1990-91) and Tennessee Tech (1983-84), linebackers coach at Texas (1985), tight ends coach at Kansas State (1982), wide receivers and tight ends coach at UTEP (1981), and quarterbacks and running backs coach at Sam Houston (1979-80).

Schultz spent the last two seasons as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Marlin High School in Marlin and was also the defensive coordinator at Westwood High School in Round Rock from 1986-89

"I've known Coach Schultz for over 20 years, and we're privileged to add him to our coaching staff," Bush said. "Coach Schultz was the offensive coordinator at TCU when I started out as the offensive graduate assistant in 2001, and he was very instrumental in grooming me to coach at the collegiate level. He brings a wealth of knowledge and experience to the staff, as well as a valuable perspective from his time as a head coach at the Division I FCS level. Coach Schultz has recruited high schools and junior colleges in Texas his entire career and has great ties across the state. He will add immediate value to our program."

Schultz has a strong reputation for running efficient, high-octane offenses. In 2014, his Texas State offense ranked in the top 25 in the nation in total and rushing offense. In both 2014 and 2015, his offenses averaged more than 415 yards of total offense. Schultz coached 31 all-conference performers at Texas State.

At TCU, his teams ranked in the top 40 nationally in scoring offense six times, total offense five times, and rushing offense five times between 2002 and 2008. He also coached four 1,000-yard rushers while helping the program to seven bowl games, five rankings in the top 25 at the end of the season, five seasons of 10 or more wins, and two conference championships. Schultz coached 44 all-conference performers at TCU. Throughout his career, Schultz has coached in 11 bowl games.

During his second season as the head coach at Lamar, Schultz took a team picked 10th out of 11 preseason Southland Conference Coaches Poll and rallied them to the first NCAA Division I FCS postseason appearance in program history. By the end of the 2018 season, the Cardinals had posted their second winning season since the program's return in 2010 and only its third since 1979. Schultz's squad notched one of the top single-season turnarounds in the nation, going from 2-9 in 2017 to 7-5 in 2018, closing the regular season with a six-game winning streak that included wins over three nationally ranked programs and the conference co-champion.

During his three seasons at Lamar, Schultz coached 20 all-conference selections, including four first-teamers, a newcomer of the year, and a lineman of the year. He also produced two All-Americans.

Two players from Schultz's 2018 team went on to play professionally, including Rodney Randle with the Los Angeles Chargers and Davon Jernigan with the Saskatchewan Roughriders of the CFL.

Schultz coached several other future NFL players, including Pro Football Hall of Fame running back LaDainian Tomlinson, who was TCU's all-time leading rusher before becoming a superstar with the Chargers, and quarterback Andy Dalton, who has been in the NFL since 2011 and is currently with the Carolina Panthers.

"I am really excited about being at UTRGV," Schultz said. "It is a great community and I look forward to working with Coach Bush. I have done a lot of things in my football career but have never started a program from the ground up. I look forward to being involved with that process."

Originally from Houston, Schultz graduated with a Bachelor of Science in Teaching from Sam Houston in 1979. He played one season of football at Sam Houston after playing receiver for two seasons at Tyler Junior College.

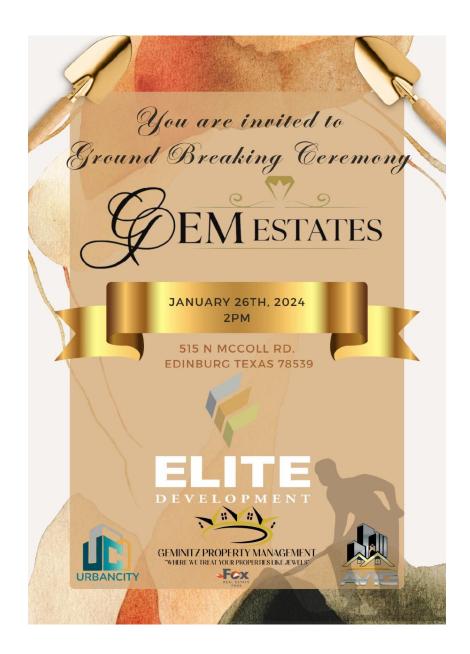

Acquisitions and loans—working with collections

Several items were won at auction, including an Emancipation Proclamation broadside, José Maria de Ortega Broadside Denouncing the Republic of the Rio Grande, a pamphlet *Mexican Treacheries and Cruelties, Incidents and Sufferings in the Mexican War*, and a book *The Life*,

Travels and Opinions of Benjamin Lundy, who was a well know abolitionist. The book includes accounts of his travels in Texas and Mexico. Plans to renew our incoming loan L2023.001 with the Worcester Art Museum are underway.

Bringing the collections to life

As has become the tradition for December, Bishop Emeritus Raymundo Peña's collection of nativities was on display for the month.

Patrons and public--serving the community

Kelly helped Pam with an outreach at the Dustin Sekula Memorial Library. On December 10, Melissa and Luna assisted with photos with Cowboy Santa, while Kelly was available to accept donations for the border food archive.

Planning and progress—using best practices for continual improvement

The team met to strategize for the work on the produce label exhibit. Kelly, Luna and Melissa all established goals for research and will reconvene at the beginning of January to figure out the next steps.

Summary

There were several new items added to the collection this month, as well as planning for a traveling exhibit to be produced in 2024.

EXHIBITS

Summary:

Collaborative display of art with Vanguard Beethoven campus.

Exhibit Work:

Melissa received a call from Aubrey Neilson from the Brownsville Museum. She was asking if we were interested in displaying some art created by students at Vanguard. Luis Contreras, the art teacher, was a former colleague of Neilson's and was looking for a place to display the artwork. She agreed to a display but thought an institution closer to the school would make sense. The artwork is a series of prints made from carved linoleum. Each student was given a city to research. They wrote an essay about their research and created a video presenting their art and the city it represented. This exhibit was well received, and Melissa has spoken to Contreras about partnering up again next year when his class works on this project. The exhibit will be displayed in Brownville after it comes down here.

Melissa has continued her work on upgrading and updating the long-term exhibits. She is focused on the technology and mapping out where all the sounds and lighting effects are located. Most of the technology has not been updated or replaced since 2010 and is due for an upgrade.

Carry over work from previous month:

Summary:

The Bishop Raymundo Peña Nativity collection was installed.

Exhibit Work:

In preparation for the annual nativity exhibit, wooden cases were sanded and stained. They were allowed to dry for several weeks. G&S Glass was called in to make new case lids out of plexiglass. Slowly, Melissa wants to replace all the case lids. They are not in good condition because of age and use.

The nativities went in the last week of November. There are 134 nativities in total. These are not individually labeled. The exhibit is about the Bishop and his collection story. The community was eager to see the exhibit and had been calling for a few weeks before installation. Melissa participated in a webinar hosted by Texas Historical Commission called Building Community Engagement through Collections Exhibitions. Over 1,200 people signed up for the webinar and close to 500 people attended from all over the United States, Canada, and even Jamaica. After the webinar, Melissa received numerous emails asking for more advice and information. Several museums also requested collaborations.

More planning toward 2024 exhibit calendar happened and Melissa is trying to finalize plans with departments who will be involved.

<u>Brick Project:</u> The last of the brick pavers to be laid in the Heritage Courtyard have been ordered. Hesbrook Monument Company has agreed to finish the engraving for \$30 per paver. As of Dec. 31, the pavers have not been delivered nor laid.

<u>Museum Store</u>: New merchandise was ordered. A 25% After Christmas sale was planned to take place the weekend of the Dia de Los Reyes on January 6 & 7, 2024.

<u>Grants Report</u>: (reported by Maria Rodriguez, Grants Coordinator/Assistant Development Officer)

Active Grants this month: 1; Cumulative active grant awards remaining,

- 1. "Families and University Together as a Unit for Research and Education (FUTURE): Connecting Hispanic Families to Geosciences Through Community Informal Learning Network": The goal of the proposed project, FUTURE (Families and University Together as a Unit for Research and Education), is to test and examine an approach to stimulate Hispanic participation in geosciences by connecting families (parents and students/children) through an informal learning network (in geosciences). With the experience gained in a previous GEOPATHS project, the leadership team will expand and scale up the established platform and infrastructure of its existing program transforming the traditional Geoscience Learning Ecosystems (GLEs) while nurturing the Hispanic Geoscience workforce in a way that it can be expanded nationally. This project is for three years at \$2,500 per year. \$2,500/0% (Per three years for a total of \$7,500)
- 2. Labeling History: A Look into the Ed Pease Collection of Produce Labels: This exhibition is a two-phase project. The first phase will produce an exhibit using archival materials that were donated by Carol Pease, the wife of the late collector Ed Pease. The exhibit will be on display at the museum as a Spotlight Exhibit, a term coined for temporary exhibits. The second phase will include contacting other museums, libraries, and businesses to offer the exhibit for display at their institutions. \$5,130/0%

Pending Grants:

1. Texas Travel Industry Recovery Grant Program Second Round: up to \$250,000 Businesses that previously applied for — and received — grants, can apply again to receive more funds if they qualify, minus the funds they received earlier. To qualify for the \$250,000 reimbursement, a business must document at least that amount in expenses, which may include payroll, rent, utilities and maintenance. (TTIR) was established by Senate Bill 8 during the 87th Legislature, Third Special Session, to administer \$180 million of funds received from the Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund, which was established under the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021. The purpose of TTIR is to provide grants for the recovery of Texas businesses in the tourism, travel, and hospitality industry that were negatively impacted due to COVID-19. TTIR will support the Texas tourism, travel, and hospitality industry by making grant funds available to businesses negatively impacted by COVID-19 to improve safety, customer service, and hospitality

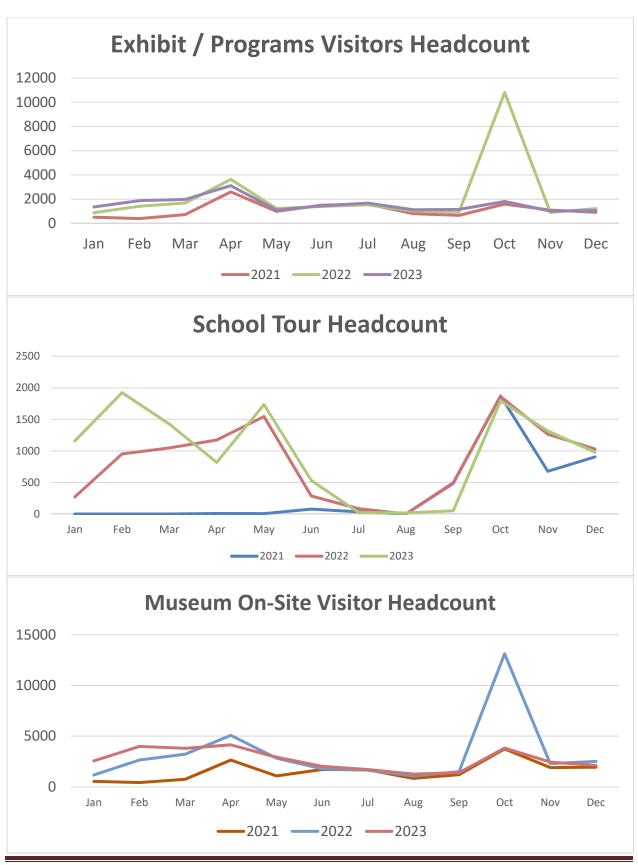

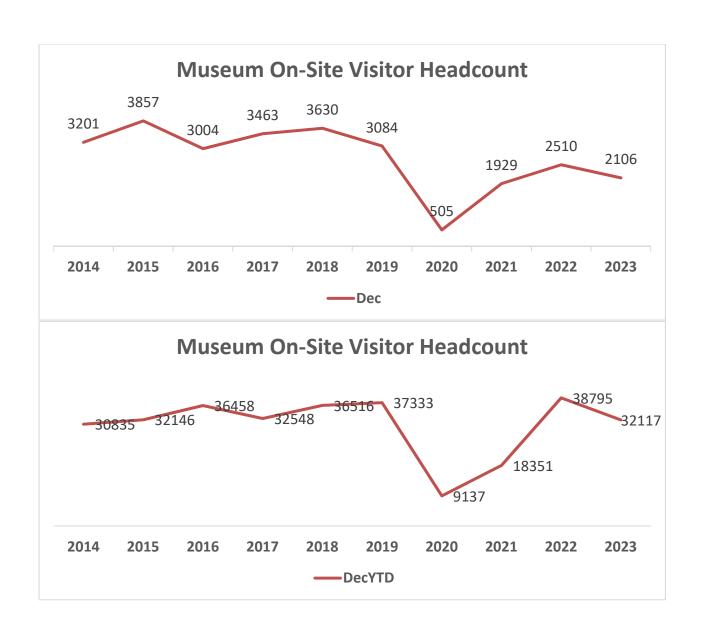
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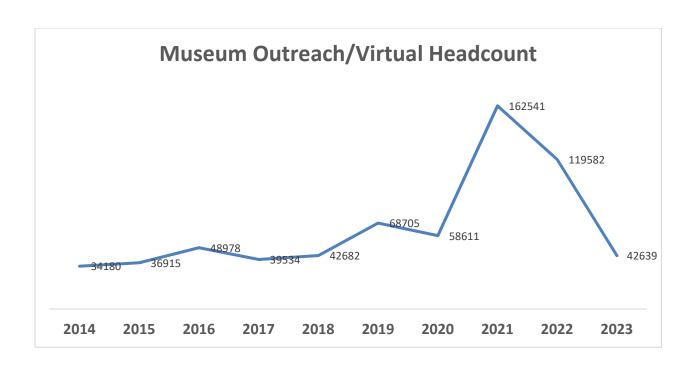

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Synopsis of December Financials

Balance Sheet:

Working capital (excluding operating reserves) was \$939K, a decrease of \$21K since 12/31/2023. More specifically, \$860K of the working capital assets were unrestricted cash-inbank. The current liability as of 12/31 was \$200K. The quick ratio (excluding operating reserves) is 5:1.

Investments in the Museum's Operating Reserve market value increased in December by \$3K. The portfolio recognized actual realized gains/(losses) of \$0K in December. Investments in our Endowment Fund increased in market value by \$134K in December. There were 5 sales transactions in our Endowment's portfolio during December resulting in actual realized gains/(losses) of \$19K.

P&L (YTD):

The December P&L reflects a net surplus of \$70K, a \$70K favorable variance. Revenues, net of the non-cash in-kind contribution line item, are favorable by \$78K. Favorable line items are Friendships \$3K, HA revenues \$65K, Admissions \$3K, Store sales \$6K, and Investment income \$2K. Unfavorable line items are Student fees \$1K.

On the expense side of the equation, the favorable expense variance of \$12K consists of a mixed bag of line items. The most notable favorable variances are Education/Grants \$3K, Advertising \$3K, Insurance \$2K, Professional Development \$1K, Admin Expenses \$2K, and Postage & supplies \$5K. The most notable unfavorable variances are ACE \$2K, Programming \$4K, and Contract labor \$10K.
