

Emergency Rental Assistance

The City of Edinburg Emergency Rental Assistance Program (ERAP) is funded through the Community Development Block Grant funds provide emergency rental assistance for eligible households and/or individuals who are facing evictions due to a change in financial stability, such as job loss or a reduction in hours. The program will provide up to three consecutive months of emergency rental assistance for qualified applicants living inside the city limits.

Eligibility:

You must fall into one of the following categories to be eligible:

- * Financial Hardship - reduction in hours or loss of employment
- * Applicants must have a household income below 80% of the area median income as set by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) (See list below)
- * Provide an eviction notice, Notice to Vacate or Past Due Notice as verification of imminent threat of becoming homeless
- * Applicant and all household members must be U.S. citizens, or be legal resident aliens
