The Clear Creek County Sheriff's Office Communications Center, in conjunction with the Department of Health & Human Services, Clear Creek Fire Authority, Clear Creek EMS, Idaho Springs Police Department and the Georgetown Police Department presents SafeCall, a public safety program for our community and its citizens.

The program is available to residents of Clear Creek County who seek peace-of-mind with a daily call into the communications center.



How it Works

The program is designed for residents that live by themselves, or in a remote area, or someone who is just not near many family or friends.

If you are feel that you could use some extra attention, we can provide that for you. This program is designed specifically to give you, your family, and your way of life some peace of mind.

Is it for you?

The program is designed for residents that live by themselves or otherwise have a weak family and friends support system. If you are concerned about your daily safety and have felt the need for someone to check on you often, we are here for you.

Getting Started

If you are a Clear Creek County resident who wishes to participate in this program stop by any one of our participating agencies to pick up application and waiver of liability.

Once accepted to the program, you will be requested to call the Communications Center on a daily basis, between 6 a.m. and 11 a.m. and let us know you are doing well. On a monthly basis, our dispatchers will give you a brief public safety announcement to help keep you informed, prepared and aware of your own safety.

If you forget or are unable to call by 11 a.m., no worries! We will call and check on you or send an officer or deputy to your house to check.
