



Aquatic Plant Harvesting is scheduled to start on the Lower Huron River Chain of Lakes

Plant harvesting is scheduled to start on Monday, July 24th.

Huron Lakes Weed Control will start harvesting on Little Portage and work their way up to Whitewood.

During harvesting, large machines come in and cut plants above the lake bottom with no soil disturbance. These machines have limitations in their ability to navigate in shallow water, therefore they are not able to get in-between docks.

Once cut, the plants will be hauled off and removed for proper disposal.

While harvesting, not all cut plants are able to be collected and can wash up on shorelines. If your property is within or adjacent to the harvested areas outlined in the posted harvesting [map](#), and you have excess cut plant fragments, the harvester will provide pick up. Plant material must be piled on the end of your dock and must be done so directly following harvesting activities.

Cut plant debris created by wildlife and motorboats will not be collected outside of the harvesting areas.
