SECRETS OF CIRCUITRY

Historian ready to pass on the secrets of his train museum exhibit

Two railroad lines were the lifeblood of area towns a century ago. Hamburg Township historian and author Wayne Burkhardt has put some of his own lifeblood into an electric train display that replicates railroads and several towns in 1910. It is on permanent exhibit in a gallery named after Burkhardt at the Hamburg Township Historical Museum.

Two model train tracks criss-cross, representing the Grand Truck Western and Ann Arbor railroads. Miniature replicas of buildings show landmarks in South Lyon, the Hamburg village neighborhood, Pinckney and Howell as they would have looked in 1910.

For years, Burkhardt, the museum's board president, has been in charge of making sure his one-of-a-kind, complex circuitry is working properly. He engineered and handmade electrical circuit boards from home.

He likes to fiddle with circuits. After retiring from running electronics shops at universities about 20 years ago, he kept up his life's occupation as a hobby at home.

"I'm 84 now, so I need to hustle things," Burkhardt said.

An immediate goal is to find someone he can teach how to run the trains.

challenge to fit in the gallery because it is a larger community.

Before many of the county roads people travel everyday existed, more train lines criss-crossed the landscape, according to a historic map on display at the museum.

In the village of Hamburg, the railroads were critical to the town's major commercial enterprise — ice harvesting.

Blocks of lake ice were cut from Zukey Lake and transported by train to cool ice boxes, the they found a civilization 20 miles into the original refrigerators — all the way to Toledo. A museum volunteer made a replica of the ice house building for Burkhardt's exhibit.

Burkhardt made the rest of the replicas of historic buildings, which include some that still exist such as the historic Howell

the Ann Arbor Railroad still runs through that history is still very much alive," Majher said.

The old Grand Trunk Western Railroad route is now part of the Mike Levine Lakelands Trail State Park.

The Wayne Burkhardt gallery at the museum also features other railroad, transportation and electronics-related displays, maps and documents.

Beyond his duties at the museum, Burkhardt is also writing the fourth science fiction novel in his The Brisen Chronicles series.

"I'm working on it now, but I can tell you earth," he said.

courthouse and the Howell Carnegie District Library before the additions.

The historic South Lyon Hotel, which was destroyed in a fire on June 23, 2016 is represented in miniature in the South Lyon section of the exhibit. Owners of the historic hotel, which was a restaurant and entertainment venue at the time of the fire, are rebuilding, according to the company's website.


Burkhardt helped restore the 1941 Pere Marquette 1225 locomotive in Owosso, which was featured in 2004 film "The Polar Express."

The Senior/Community Center will remain closed through the end of 2020. We will be meeting again before the end of the year to determine if there will be an opening date in early 2021. I have requested all keys be returned by users, and am in the process of finalizing the scheduling process for rental of the Center after hours. Letters will be going out to all the users shortly giving an update on the expected fees. The fees that we now charge could help offset extra cleanings once the Center is open.

Folks have been using the pre-application form for Parks and the Community Center room rental which can be found at this link: https://docs.google.com/forms/d/1NLd-SbJcFumRBFlvVRZdKhRRODDF79cn-OtpEbC1dgA/. This has been particularly helpful for folks who are requesting use of the open areas for their face-to-face activities. I continue to use the Google products to develop a system that will be visible to both staff and users, so they are able to see the uses already in place. I hope to have the process finalized by next month, and have already been invoicing folks under the new fee schedule.

We were approached by PHS Cross Country to re-open their application for the approved District Meet which they canceled due to Covid. The meet is back on, and has been re-scheduled to October 24, 2020. In lieu of coming back with a new application, I updated their approval to reflect the new date. All points remain the same, except for the number of anticipated spectators which will be lower due to Covid restrictions. Public Safety and Hamburg RC Flyers have been notified.

We have received our preliminary scores for the two MNRTF Grant applications submitted for the Hay Creek Bridge project and the Land Acquisition.

We are in receipt of a Park Use Application from Pinckney Community Schools dated August 3, 2020 for use of the east park grounds Manly Bennett Park for Cross Country activities. Use is anticipated daily from 3 p.m. to 5 p.m.

The application states that other uses will not be interfered with, however, the course does wind around baseball, near the picnic pavilion and through football. The concerns raised by the Flyer's club were raised, and the course was adjusted accordingly. I have notified Flyer's of this change and have made every effort to not schedule folks for use of the grounds when sports groups are present. The use has been occurring since last year, and I have been working with the coach to work on a scheduling solution that works for all users.

Should approval of the application be recommended as submitted, it should include the contingency that a recommendation from Public Safety be obtained, a Certificate of Insurance naming Hamburg Township as Additional Insured be provided, that the Clerk Department be provided all requested documents to their satisfaction, that the field assignments be communicated Administratively through the Parks Coordinator, and that fees I should be invoicing, if any, for this new use be confirmed by the Township Board.
