MN Energy Resources Agreement – Administrator Coleman stated that this is preliminary. MN Energy Resources wanst to do automated meter readings. They want to put their meter reading devices on two poles in the City but we don't have a pole in one of their desired locations. Once they identify locations, this will come back to the Council. MN Energy Resources will pay the pole rental of \$10 per pole and for metered electricity.

ENGINEER'S REPORT

E Main Street Storm Sewer – Engineer Theobald stated the project includes storm sewer from the fire station running straight east along the north side of the railroad tracks to the creek. The bids were let on June 6th, and the lowest bid is over the engineer's estimated amount by \$187,076. Theobald believes that this is the lowest cost that we are going to get. Mayor McKern asked if there are adequate funds to pay for this. Finance Director Zaworski stated there are and we have been anticipating this cost.

Library Assistant – David Greenfield – <u>Motion to Approve the Library Board's Recommendation of Hiring David Greenfield at Grade 3, Step 2, \$16.63 per hour made by Mayor McKern, Second by Councilperson Burton with All Voting Aye.</u>

ATTORNEY

Escrow Agreement for Stone Ridge 2nd – Attorney Leth stated that the development agreement calls for a letter of credit and Mike Marti is asking for an escrow account. The City Attorney is concerned that, if the lender is going to hang onto those funds, the agreement needs to allow the City access to those funds. Engineer Theobald has concerns of a short turnaround of 3 business days for City approval. Attorney Leth stated that the City had been approached about accepting a performance bond; which presents a difficulty for the City, as well. Tom Monson, representing Citizens State Bank, stated the main concern is the issue of safety and soundness. The bank is allowed to release funds based on the current value of collateral at that time; the collateral value increases as the project proceeds. After further discussion the Attorney, Engineer, Mr. Marti and Mr. Monson reached an understanding. The matter will be brought back to a future meeting.

Pursuant to due call and notice thereof, a meeting of the Kasson Park Board was duly held at Kasson City Hall on the 21st day of May at 6:00 P.M.

THE FOLLOWING PARK BOARD MEMBERS WERE PRESENT: Liza Larsen, Chuck Coleman, Roger Franke, Greg Kuball, Janet Sinning and Dan Eggler THE FOLLOWING WERE ABSENT: Jason Farnsworth and Deputy Clerk Jan Naig ALSO PRESENT: Parks & Rec Supervisor Ron Unger

I. Call to Order: The meeting was called to order at 6:01 P.M. by Chairperson Larsen.

II. Approve minutes: Motion by Kuball and second by Franke, with all voting Aye, to approve the minutes of the April 2019 meeting.

III. New Business:

- A. Aquatic Center. The Aquatic Center will be open limited hours beginning this weekend. Start-up of the pool went smoothly. The heaters, pumps, filters and hot water heaters are working great. The backflow valve was rebuilt. New drain covers are installed. A lifeguard training class is going on this week. Food, pop and paper products have been ordered. The employee meeting was held on May 18th. The pool staff has been working on organizing the deck chairs and picnic tables and power-washing. Abby and Brayden Tjosaas have been entering registrations and memberships into the computer.
- **B.** Lions Park shelter. Cleary Buildings Corp. has had to dig around two posts to expose the footings for the shelter to allow C.M.S. to re- inspect the footings. Once the inspection is complete and approved, work can begin on the cement floor and electrical wiring.

C. Trees.

- 1. **Tree planting.** The Treehouse has completed planting the 20 boulevard trees. They also planted around 20 bare root trees for the 3rd, 4th and 5th Avenue NW project. There are still around 80 ball and burlap trees yet to be planted on this project. Gibbs Lawn Care has submitted a bid for that work.
- 2. **Stump grinding.** City crews will start stump grinding from last year's tree removals in June. There are approximately 30-40 stumps to be removed.

IV. Old Business:

A. Arbor Day follow up. Two trees were planted in Lions Park on Friday, April 26th. About 12 Lions members came to help with the planting. Unger

acknowledged Kuball and Coleman for representing the Park Board at the Arbor Day event.

- B. "Just Pick It Up" follow up. Two locations were picked up. There were two pickup loads of garbage collected. Unger thanked those who helped with the program. Sinning indicated we may need to drop the program next year if more people are not available to help. Kuball asked if it would be easier to get volunteers if the campaign was held in the fall. Unger will mention it at the next Joint Ventures Meeting to see if some support would be available from school organizations.
- **C. Movies in the Park update.** The June 21st date does not work for the Dodge County 4-H Federation so a sponsor is still needed on that date. July 12th will be sponsored by OCEAN Exchange program and August 9th will be sponsored by Kasson Chamber of Commerce as a Festival in the Park event. Once movies are selected, the information can be put in the City's newsletter and posters will be printed.

D. Park projects update.

- -Work continues on the Lions Park picnic shelter.
- -Unger is getting quotes to replace the ball field fencing for North 2 ball field in Veterans Memorial Park. Prices are more than he budgeted in Capital Improvements so he will approach the Joint Ventures for additional funding.
- -The three plastic entry slides on the Lions Park modular are cracked from weather and will need to be replaced. Unger has contacted the company.
- -A cement slab will be poured for a bleacher behind the backstop at J. Hyde Kasson Park.
- -New lids will be installed on the garbage cans around the parks to make them waterproof. Seventeen lids have been ordered.
- **V. Correspondence:** The 2nd Annual Tree Lighting Ceremony will be held on November 29, 2019 at 6:30 P.M. Sinning has started working on the details. She will contact Community Ed to get the information in their brochure.

City of Kasson Economic Development Authority Policy & Procedures Manual

BUSINESS SUBSIDY POLICY [AMENDMENT]

The following business subsidy criteria are intended to satisfy the requirements of Minnesota Statues 116J.993 through 116J.995, as amended (the "Act"). The term "City" means collectively the City of Kasson and the Kasson Economic Development Authority. The term "project" means the development or property with respect to which the business subsidy is provided. The term "business subsidy" means all financial assistance deemed to be a "business subsidy" pursuant to Section 116J.993 subdivision 3 of the Act.

Criteria

To broaden the tax base, encourage quality construction, develop an enhanced employment base, promote the highest and best use of the land and provide more and better services to the citizens of Kasson. It is the policy of the City of Kasson and the Kasson EDA to encourage strong, viable growth and development for the residential, commercial, and industrial areas of the city.

The City of Kasson has a broad range of powers to assist community development; including tax increment financing, tax abatement, various grant opportunities, and bonding. Therefore, when appropriate, the City will use its authority tor financially participate in a project to accomplish community goals.

Financing from the City of Kasson is not intended as a "first dollar" investment or as a bid in competing with another City, but as a gap financing tool designed to enhance the viability of strong businesses with a sound reason to be in Kasson.

The City of Kasson's participation in a project can benefit the community by attracting development, creating employment opportunities, providing housing opportunities, and assisting in financing redevelopment to remove blight.

The City will consider and give preference to the following criteria when considering the approval of business subsidies:

1. But-for Test.

The city in its sole discretion will determine whether or not there is substantial likelihood that the project would not move forward without the assistance requested. It is acceptable for this test to be supported solely upon the representations of the applicant.

Projects that do not meet the "But-for" test will not be granted business subsidies.

2. Redevelopment.

Projects that remove, prevent, or reduce blight or other adverse conditions of the property, thereby protecting the City's property values and the general public health, safety, and welfare.

3. Attraction of New Business.

Projects that attract or retain competitive and financially strong commercial and industrial companies, which offer the potential for significant growth in employment and tax base.

4. Highest and Best Land Use.

The use of the business subsidy will encourage quality construction and promote the highest and best use of land, consistent with the City of Kasson Comprehensive Plan.

5. Needed Services.

Projects that provide a needed service in the community, including health care, convenience, and social services.

6. Unmet Housing Needs.

Projects that provide housing needs not currently available in the community.

7. Economic Feasibility.

The applicant must demonstrate that they have the experience and financing necessary for the project and that the project can be completed in a timely manner.

8. <u>Impact on City Services and Infrastructure</u>.

Projects that do not significantly and adversely increase the demand for City services.

9. Job Creation.

Projects that create and/or retain jobs which pay at least the higher of the current Federal Minimum Wage or State of Minnesota Minimum Wage, plus appropriate benefits.

Whenever the City invests public funds or agrees to voluntarily forfeit tax or other revenue that benefits private development projects, those projects should create and/or retain the greatest number of Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) jobs that pay a livable wage possible for the residents of the City and the surrounding region. The City may take into account the special needs of small or growth-phase businesses with potential to create high paying jobs in the future.

10. Tax Base.

Projects that will directly and indirectly increase the City's tax base and generate new property tax revenue.

11. <u>Incentive for Additional Future Development</u>.

Projects will create potential for additional future development.

12. Compatibility with Development Plans and Neighborhood.

Proposed projects are compatible with the City's overall development plans and objectives and are compatible with the neighborhood in which they will be located.

Guidelines & Evaluation

- 1. Construction of a project shall not commence until the appropriate City approvals have been given to the application for financing.
- 2. The City will evaluate each request for a business subsidy on a case-by-case basis and reserves the right to deny any application at any stage of the proceedings prior to adoption of the final approval authorizing the financing.
- 3. For assistance, applicants shall complete an application form and supply all additional information requested by the City.
- 4. The City shall be reimbursed by the applicant for all costs incurred by the City in connection with the proposed or actual use of the financial assistance including, but not limited to, legal fees, filing fees, engineering fees, development consultation fees, administrative expenses, and/or tax increment financing consultation fees. At the time preliminary procedures are initiated, the applicant will deposit with the City and administrative fee to cover all anticipated costs to be incurred by the City in connection with the proposed project. The amount of the administrative fee will be based upon the type of financial assistance being requested.
 - a. The fact that the City accepts the applicant's deposit is not to be construed as a guarantee that the City will authorize the project that is under consideration.
 - b. The City may request and receive from the applicant additional administrative fees in an amount to be determined from time to time by the City should associated costs exceed the initial deposit.
- 5. At all times, procedures and policies related to the proposed or actual approval of the City's financial assistance will comply with the laws of the State.
- 6. All applications and supporting materials and documents shall become the property of the City and, as such, are public records.

Valuation of a Business Subsidy

The City will calculate the value of assistance provided to a business in the following manner:

- 1. If the Subsidy is a contribution or sale of real or personal property, the amount of the subsidy will be the fair market value of the property as determined by the City, less any amount paid.
- 2. If the subsidy is a loan, the amount of the subsidy will be the principal amount of the loan.

- 3. If the subsidy is a loan guarantee, the amount of the subsidy will be the principal amount of the loan guaranteed.
- 4. If the subsidy takes the form of payments over time, (e.g. pay-as-you-go tax increment financing), the amount of the subsidy will be the sum of projected payments, discounted to a present value using a discount factor determined by the City.

The following are <u>not</u> business subsidies: any assistance provided that meets a statutory exemption as defined by the Act.

Ms. Coleman:

I have been asked to give a legal opinion with regards to the above-referenced application to re-zone the southerly most 4.25 +/- acres of a 7.5 acre parcel from R-C, Residential - Commercial Mixed Use District to AG, Agricultural District, and for a conditional use permit to allow up to four horses on the property.

An application for a re-zoning is a request for an amendment to the zoning ordinance. The existing zoning ordinance is presumed to be constitutional, and an applicant is only entitled to a change if they can demonstrate that the existing zoning is unsupported by any rational basis related to the public health, safety and welfare. Therefore, amendments should not be issued indiscriminately, but should only be used as a means to reflect changes in the goals and policies of the city as reflected in the comprehensive plan or changes in conditions in the city.

The changes in the conditions in the City of Kasson and in the City's goals and policies are reflected in its recently-adopted comprehensive plan. The comprehensive plan indicates that the future land use of the subject property is as Open Space. See City of Kasson Comprehensive Plan, Figure 4.3 Future Land Use Map, p. 4-6. It is my opinion that the future land use designation as Open Space is most compatible with the City's AG

zoning district. Since the request is for the AG zoning district, I would recommend approval of the rezone application.

Although "general farming" is a permitted use in the AG zoning district, the owners' requested use is more accurately described as the "keeping of horses and livestock," a conditional use in the AG zoning district. Therefore, it is my opinion that the owners will also need to obtain a conditional use permit to use the southerly portion of the property as requested. The application includes such a request for a conditional use permit; therefore, if the rezone application is granted, I would also recommend approval of the application for conditional use permit.

Finally, if the City grants the applications as discussed above, I would also strongly recommend that the property be surveyed and split to ensure that the City can easily determine the boundary line between the remaining parcels. This is absolutely necessary to ensure the City can properly enforce its zoning ordinance on the entirety of both parcels. Furthermore, splitting the parcel will protect future owners of the parcels against disputes over the newly created boundary line.

AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is made this _____ day of _____ 2019, ('Effective Date") by and between City of Kasson Utilities, Minnesota, ("Licensor") and Minnesota Energy Resources, a Minnesota corporation ("Licensee").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS the Licensee, desires to erect antennae's and equipment and use certain poles owned by the Licensor to which they will attach their antennae's and equipment; and

WHEREAS Licensor desires to maintain good relations with the Licensee and make available certain of its poles to the Licensee; and

WHEREAS both parties have determined it is in their best interests to allow the use of Licensor's poles as above described under the conditions described in this Agreement,

NOW THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

Licensor enables and hereby grants a license to the Licensee, subject to the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth, to use certain poles of the Licensor for the purpose of attaching its facilities at such locations and such a manner as may from time to time be requested by the Licensee and approved by the Licensor, which approval shall be evidenced by a print marked Exhibit "A", executed by the parties hereto and showing the date of such approval, the pole numbers and the location of such poles. Such prints shall be attached hereto, and made a part hereof and identified by number. The Licensee agrees that its facilities and its use of the pole of poles described in the Exhibit "A" shall be at its, the Licensee's, own risk and at its own cost and expense, and shall be in conformity with the National Electrical Safety Code (NESC) including any amendments thereto.

ARTICLE I

Attachments to Poles

Before attachments are made by Licensee, Licensor will inspect each pole and rearrange or replace its facilities as it deems is required in order to provide space for the Licensee at the expense (including the net cost of pole replacement) of the Licensee. The Licensee shall pay for all rearrangements and net replacement cost incurred by the Licensor prior to attachment by the Licensee. Licensee may also be liable for costs incurred by other licensees for rearranging their facilities. The costs referred to in this agreement shall be Licensor's fully loaded costs, as derived from their normal accounting and costing procedures. Throughout the Term of this Agreement, Licensor shall not intentionally disturb Licensee's authorized attachments, except as such disturbance may be necessary in an emergency or natural disaster situation.

ARTICLE II

Maintenance of Attachments

- (a) The Licensee or its agent agrees to make and maintain all attachments upon said poles in a proper, safe and workmanlike manner and in accordance with requirements of the National Electrical Safety Code (NESC).
- (b) Whenever a pole to which Licensee has attached facilities is replaced, Licensee shall transfer its facilities at its expense, within 10 days after notice that the pole has been replaced. Whenever such a pole must be of a size larger than that normally required at that location due solely to the requirement of Licensee, Licensee shall pay the incremental cost of such additional pole size, as determined by Licensor, within 10 days of the pole replacement in order to continue to maintain an attachment at that location.
- (c) Any strengthening of poles through the use of guying, required to accommodate the attachments of Licensee, shall be provided by and at the expense of Licensee and to the satisfaction of all other occupants of the poles.

ARTICLE III

Right-of-Way for Licensee's Attachments

Nothing herein contained shall be construed as a guarantee or permission from owners of private property or other authorities, to the Licensee to use said facilities, and upon notice that objection is made by such owners or authorities to such use, the Licensor may immediately declare the Exhibit "A" cancelled, and thereupon the Licensee shall remove all attachments and cease to use any or all said facilities.

ARTICLE IV

Hazards to Personnel

Licensee knows that Licensor is engaged in transmitting electric current and will warn its employees or its agent not to touch, move, manipulate or tamper with any attachments of Licensor. Licensee's employees or its agent may access poles to make and maintain attachments, but shall not access the poles where any defective condition is observable until Licensor has been notified and Licensor has made an inspection. Licensee's employees shall not climb Licensor's poles.

ARTICLE V

Liability and Damages

(a) Licensee shall indemnify, protect, defend and save harmless the Licensor, its agents,

employees and servants from and against any and all damages on account of damage to property, injury to or death to persons arising either directly or indirectly out of the erection, maintenance, repair, presence, use or removal of said attachments of Licensee.

- (b) At all times during which this Agreement is in effect, Licensee shall carry and keep in effect at its expense, the following types of insurance: Worker's compensation and comprehensive general liability.
- (c) Limitation on Damages. Unless otherwise expressly provided in this agreement, Licensor shall not be liable to licensee for consequential, incidental, punitive, exemplary or indirect damages suffered by licensee or by any subscriber, customer or purchaser of licensee for lost profits or other business interruption damages, whether by virtue of any statute, in tort or in contract, under any provision of indemnity, or otherwise, regardless of the theory of liability upon which any such claim may be based.

ARTICLE VI

Existing Rights of Other Parties

Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed as affecting the rights or privileges previously conferred by Licensor on others not parties to this Agreement including rights to use any poles or pole space; and Licensor shall have the right to continue and extend such rights or privileges. The license herein granted shall at all times be subject to such contracts and arrangements.

ARTICLE VII

Assignment of Rights

The rights hereby granted the Licensee are personal to it and cannot be assigned, transferred, or sublet without the consent in writing of the Licensor which shall not be unreasonably withheld.

ARTICLE VIII

Waiver of Terms and Conditions

Failure to enforce any of the terms or conditions of this Agreement shall not constitute a

waiver of any such terms or conditions.

ARTICLE IX

Rights of Licensee

- (a) No use under this Agreement however extended, of Licensor's poles shall create or vest in Licensee any ownership or property rights in said poles but Licensee's rights therein shall be and remain a mere license. Nothing herein contained shall be construed to compel Licensor to maintain any of said poles for a period longer than that demanded by its own service.
- (b) Should Licensee fail to comply with any provision of this Agreement or fail to remove its attachments on the termination of the Agreement, Licensor shall have the continuing right to immediately remove Licensee's attachments from Licensor's poles and charge Licensee the cost of such removal. Waiver of any default hereunder by the Licensor shall not act to waive or excuse any subsequent default by Licensee.
- (c) If at any time in the judgment of the Licensor, Licensee's attachments result in an impairment or hazard to Licensor's operation, maintenance or construction activities, Licensor may terminate this Agreement upon 60 days' written notice.

ARTICLE X

Term of Agreement

This Agreement, unless otherwise terminated as is herein provided, shall continue in force from the Effective Date until **December 31, 2020** and thereafter from year to year, unless terminated by either party hereto by giving notice of its intention to terminate to the other party at least six months prior to the end of any period.

ARTICLE XI

Applicable Law and Venue

This Agreement shall be governed by and construed under the laws of the State of Minnesota without regard to its conflict of laws principles. Any court proceeding regarding enforcement of this Agreement shall be commenced and heard in **Dodge County District Court**, Minnesota, and the Parties consent and submit to the jurisdiction and venue of that Court.

AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is made this _____ day of _____ 2019, ('Effective Date") by and between City of Kasson Utilities, Minnesota, ("Licensor") and Minnesota Energy Resources, a Minnesota corporation ("Licensee").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS the Licensee, desires to erect antennae's and equipment and use certain poles owned by the Licensor to which they will attach their antennae's and equipment; and

WHEREAS Licensor desires to maintain good relations with the Licensee and make available certain of its poles to the Licensee; and

WHEREAS both parties have determined it is in their best interests to allow the use of Licensor's poles as above described under the conditions described in this Agreement,

NOW THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

Licensor enables and hereby grants a license to the Licensee, subject to the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth, to use certain poles of the Licensor for the purpose of attaching its facilities at such locations and such a manner as may from time to time be requested by the Licensee and approved by the Licensor, which approval shall be evidenced by a print marked Exhibit "A", executed by the parties hereto and showing the date of such approval, the pole numbers and the location of such poles. Such prints shall be attached hereto, and made a part hereof and identified by number. The Licensee agrees that its facilities and its use of the pole of poles described in the Exhibit "A" shall be at its, the Licensee's, own risk and at its own cost and expense, and shall be in conformity with the National Electrical Safety Code (NESC) including any amendments thereto.

ARTICLE I

Attachments to Poles

Before attachments are made by Licensee, Licensor will inspect each pole and rearrange or replace its facilities as it deems is required in order to provide space for the Licensee at the expense (including the net cost of pole replacement) of the Licensee. The Licensee shall pay for all rearrangements and net replacement cost incurred by the Licensor prior to attachment by the Licensee. Licensee may also be liable for costs incurred by other licensees for rearranging their facilities. The costs referred to in this agreement shall be Licensor's fully loaded costs, as derived from their normal accounting and costing procedures. Throughout the Term of this Agreement, Licensor shall not intentionally disturb Licensee's authorized attachments, except as such disturbance may be necessary in an emergency or natural disaster situation.

ARTICLE II

Maintenance of Attachments

- (a) The Licensee or its agent agrees to make and maintain all attachments upon said poles in a proper, safe and workmanlike manner and in accordance with requirements of the National Electrical Safety Code (NESC).
- (b) Whenever a pole to which Licensee has attached facilities is replaced, Licensee shall transfer its facilities at its expense, within 10 days after notice that the pole has been replaced. Whenever such a pole must be of a size larger than that normally required at that location due solely to the requirement of Licensee, Licensee shall pay the incremental cost of such additional pole size, as determined by Licensor, within 10 days of the pole replacement in order to continue to maintain an attachment at that location.
- (c) Any strengthening of poles through the use of guying, required to accommodate the attachments of Licensee, shall be provided by and at the expense of Licensee and to the satisfaction of all other occupants of the poles.

ARTICLE III

Right-of-Way for Licensee's Attachments

ESCROW AGREEMENT FOR STONE RIDGE SECOND SUBDIVISION

This Escrow Agreement is made and entered into this _____day of June, 2019, by and between the City of Kasson, a Minnesota municipal corporation ("City"), Marti Land Development LLC, a Minnesota limited liability corporation ("Developer"), Citizens State Bank of Hayfield, a Minnesota state chartered bank ("Lender"), and Atypical Title, Inc., a Minnesota business corporation ("Escrow Agent"), for the purpose of providing the City of Kasson security for the completion of public improvements in Developer's subdivision entitled Stone Ridge Second ("the Project") in the City of Kasson, State of Minnesota.

WHEREAS, the City requires security from Developer to ensure completion of the public improvements as specified in the approved building plans and specifications and in the Stone Ridge Second Subdivision Development Agreement ("Development Agreement").

WHEREAS, the Developer has asked to provide such security via escrowed funds provided by Lender (pursuant to a note and mortgage on the Project) and held by Escrow Agent, until released by the City.

NOW THEREFORE, the City agrees to allow for Developer to provide such security on the following terms and conditions:

- 1. The funds provided by Lender and/or held by Escrow Agent shall equal the total estimated construction costs for the Project, including the City Engineer's construction observation and inspection fees.
- 2. The funds provided by Lender and/or held by Escrow Agent shall guarantee performance of this Agreement and the Development Agreement.
- 3. The Developer shall be responsible for all charges or costs associated with the funds provided by Lender and/or held by Escrow Agent.
- 4. The funds provided by Lender and/or held by Escrow Agent shall remain available until reduced or released by written approval of the City's Engineer or his

designated agent. The City's Engineer or his designated agent shall respond to all written requests to reduce or release such funds within twenty (20) business days of receipt, or the request shall be deemed approved. The reduction of such funds shall be based upon the amount of work for the project that remains to be completed. The escrow cannot be cancelled by the Developer, Lender or Escrow Agent, without the City's written consent.

- 5. Notwithstanding any other provision of the Agreement, a minimum of ten percent (10%) of the funds provided by Lender and/or held by Escrow Agent shall remain available to the City until the expiration of the one-year (1 year) warranty period after the City's acceptance of the public improvements.
- The City shall notify the Lender and Escrow Agent of any known condition that in the City's opinion, as determined by City Council resolution, constitutes a breach of the Development Agreement and gives the City a lawful claim against the funds for the completion of the public improvements. Funds shall be released by the Escrow Agent and/or Lender to the City upon the written demand of an agent of the City authorized by City Council resolution, stating that the City has determined that the required work has not been performed within applicable time limits, or that the work has not been properly performed. Neither the Lender nor the Escrow Agent shall have the duty or right to, and shall not, evaluate the correctness or appropriateness of any such written demand, notice or determination by the City, and shall not interplead or in any manner delay payment of said funds to the City. Upon receipt of the City's notification, the Escrow Agent and/or Lender shall promptly pay said funds to the City. The City shall use said funds to complete the public improvements specified in the approved building plans, specifications and Development Agreement, and to reimburse itself for expenses incurred relating to the enforcement of this Agreement or the Development Agreement.
- 7. No party hereto shall assign its interest in this Agreement or any rights or obligations hereunder without the prior written consent of the other parties hereto

and any such attempted assignment without such prior written consent shall be void and of no force and effect. This Agreement shall inure to the benefit of and shall be binding upon the successors and permitted assigns of the parties hereto.

- 8. This Agreement shall be construed, performed, and enforced in accordance with, and governed by, the laws of the State of Minnesota. Each party hereby consents to the personal jurisdiction and venue of the district court in Dodge County, Minnesota.
- 9. In the event that any part of this Agreement is declared by any court or other judicial or administrative body to be null, void, or unenforceable, said provision shall survive to the extent it is not so declared, and all of the other provisions of this Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.
- 10. This Agreement may be amended or modified, and any of the terms, covenants, representations, warranties, or conditions hereof may be waived, only by a written instrument executed by the parties hereto, or in the case of a waiver, by the party waiving compliance. Any waiver by any party of any condition, or of the breach of any provision, term, covenant, representation, or warranty contained in this Agreement, in any one or more instances, shall not be deemed to be nor construed as further or continuing waiver of any such condition, or of the breach of any other provision, term, covenant, representation, or warranty of this Agreement.
- 11. This Agreement contains the entire understanding of the parties with respect to the funds and supersedes and replaces all prior and contemporaneous agreements and understandings, oral and written, with regard to such funds.
- 12. This Agreement may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which shall constitute the same instrument.

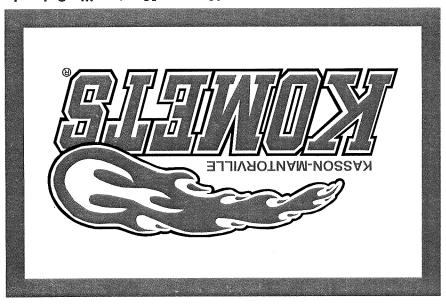
