Keep grease out of sinks and wipes out of pipes

This holiday season, do yourself and other taxpayers a favor by keeping grease from turkey and ham dinners out of sinks and other drains. And while you're at it, stop flushing disposable wipes down the toilet, even if the label claims "flushable." Sewer workers everywhere dread this time of year when the problem of "fatbergs" – clogs of fats, oil, grease, and wipes – worsens, leading to backups and costly repairs. Disposable wipes may flush down the toilet, but they fail to break down. Cities across Minnesota report costly repairs and upgrades after wipes clog their pumps and pipes.

Here's how you can help:

- Dispose of fat, oil and grease by pouring them onto newspaper or other paper items in the trash, or into a non-recyclable container and then into the trash.
- Another idea: Soak up grease with crusty bread pieces, and then put the bread on bird feeders for wild critters.
- Wipe greasy pans, pots and other dishes out with a paper towel before washing.
- Place disposable wipes in the trash too.

Ownership Guidelines for Your Home's Electrical System

When your home's exterior electrical system is damaged, it's important to understand which components are our responsibility and which are yours

If you receive overhead electric service, we are responsible for the following components:

- **1.** Service Drop The wires running from the utility pole to your home.
- **2. Electric Meter** Measures your electricity use in kilowatt-hours.

You own and are responsible for repairing the following:

- 3. Weatherhead and Insulator This is the point where our electric lines connect to your home.
- 4. Service Entrance Cable The wire that extends from your weatherhead to the meter and from the meter to your fuse box or circuit breaker box.
- 5. Meter Base Your meter is mounted in this box.
- Fuse Box or Circuit Breaker Box This is the main service panel that houses your fuses or circuit breakers.
- **7. Household Wiring** The interior wiring that distributes electricity through your home.

As a customer, it's also your responsibility to maintain open access to the meter and keep obstructions away from power lines that extend from the utility pole to your home. If trees on your property grow near power lines, don't prune or remove them yourself. Consult with a tree contractor who is qualified to work around electric equipment.

We all play an important part in making electricity safe and reliable. This fact sheet contains general ownership guidelines.

*This fact sheet applies to only overhead lines, all underground wire is the homeowners' responsibility.

Cold Weather Rule:

Helps protect your heat from Oct 1 through April 30 and is available for residential customers only. Disconnects will continue through winter as normal for non-payment if the primary heat source is not affected.
