<u>Employee Spotlight</u> <u>Meet Charlie Bradford, Public Works Director</u>

<u>Charlie, can you tell us about your position and the</u> <u>services you provide to the community?</u>

In my position as Public Works Director, I plan, manage, and continually evaluate all public works/utilities functions. I perform administrative work which includes planning, organizing, and directing streets, parks, stormwater, utility water and wastewater utility, electrical utility, ice arena, and the cemetery.

What, in your opinion, is the most challenging part of being the Public Works Director?

The most challenging part of working as a Public Works Director is trying to please everyone, while managing the budget.

What, in your opinion, is the most rewarding part of being the Director of Public Works in Kasson?

The most rewarding part of being a Public Works Director is completing job tasks and projects, along with working with residents and finding solutions to issues. It is rewarding to leave work at the end of the day, knowing that you are working to make Kasson a better place.

<u>What do you consider the most important traits of being a</u> <u>successful Public Works Director?</u>

The most important traits are communication, delegation, respect, and flexibility. You must be able to communicate with residents and city staff on a variety of issues daily. You must delegate work and know the staff will complete the work. You need to respect your staff and residents of the community as well as remain flexible because no days are the same.

<u>Can you tell us about the path you took to become a</u> <u>Director for Public Works?</u>

<u>I worked in the City of Kasson in the Park Department for 6 summers while</u> <u>attending high school and college. After college, a full-time Street</u> <u>Department position opened in 2000 and I was hired for the position. I</u> <u>worked in the Street Department for 2 years and then a Water/Wastewater</u> <u>Department position opened. I moved to the Water/Wastewater</u> <u>Department for 15 years. I was promoted through the positions of</u>



Operator I, Operator II, Lead Operator and finally becoming the

Water/Wastewater Supervisor in 2012. Then in 2017 the Public Works

Director position opened, and I was promoted into the position.

Do you have any advice for students who are interested in getting into this field?

If you think you want to work as a Public Works Director or in the public works/utilities field, ask to shadow a city employee. We work with high school students regularly that need to job shadow for part of their class.
