- ✓ Install compost bin

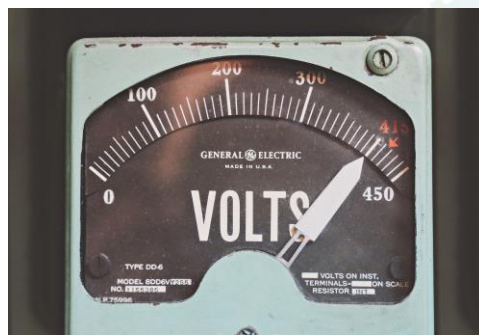

Happy Halloween! Just a reminder that candy wrappers can't go in the recycling bin because they are often made of mixed materials (plastic, aluminum and paper). However, you can recycle the plastic bags the candy came in wherever plastic bags are accepted for recycling.
