

Cabbage Worms Controlled By

Calcium Arsenate

The green worm that eats in the cabbage plants may be controlled very effectivly and the plants will in no way be injured for human consumption says R. J. Laughin, County Agent. One can use the calcium arsenate as a dust and it will give good control of the worms. The cabbage head grovs from the inside and since the other leaves are are cut away no exposed parts of the head are in contact with the arsenate, Cabbage plants should be watched carefully and dusted regularly if a severe infestation shows up.
