DEPARTMENT SPONSORED EVENTS

During the month of July, Largo Fire participated in five public events that reached approximately 1393 people in the areas of fire safety programs, home safety preparedness programs and fall prevention. Seven smoke detectors were installed.

On Saturday July 21, Largo Fire Rescue held their fourth annual Hurricane Preparedness Event at the Largo Public Library. Over 100 citizens attended the event which included our keynote speaker, Bay News 9 Chief Meteorologist Mike Clay, business and agency table vendors, and a speakers panel of City and County representatives who presented valuable hurricane preparation information on evacuation planning, emergency kits, special needs shelters, and pet, home, and business preparedness. BUDGET UPDATE

For the month of July, Fire has experienced a total of 2,125 hours of overtime. Minimum manning accounted for 48.1% or 1,021.75 hours of the overtime at a cost of \$38,840. Special events, department committees, and training account for the remainder of the overtime assignments.
