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PROCEEDINGS OF CITY COUNCIL MEETING OF THE CITY OF LOWELL MONDAY, MARCH 01, 2021, 7:00 P.M.

CALL TO ORDER; PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE; ROLL CALL.

The Virtual Meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Mayor DeVore and City Clerk Sue Ullery called roll.

Virtually present and attending from the City of Lowell: Councilmembers Cliff Yankovich, Jim Salzwedel Leah Groves, Marty Chambers and Mayor DeVore.

Absent:

None.

Also virtually present from Lowell, Michigan, City Manage Michael Burns, City Clerk, Susan Ullery, Chief of Police Chris Hurst, DPW Director Dan Cznarecki, City Attorney Jessica Wood, and Lowell Light & Power Manager Charlie West.

CONSENT AGENDA.

- Approval of the Agenda.
- Approve and place on file the minutes of the February 16, 2021 Regular City Council Meeting.
- Authorize payment of invoices in the amount of \$408,272.71.

IT WAS MOVED BY YANKOVICH and seconded by GROVES to approve the consent agenda as written.

YES: Councilmember Groves, Mayor DeVore, Councilmember Salzwedel, Councilmember Yankovich and Councilmember Chambers.

NO: None.

MOTION CARRIED.

3. CITIZEN COMMENTS FOR ITEMS NOT ON THE AGENDA.

There were no comments.

OLD BUSINESS.

a. Covid 19.

City Manager Michael Burns stated again not much has changed. Found a Kent County Website that he was able to sign the City up as an employer for the City employees to get vaccinated. Signup is complete and just waiting to hear back on that.

b. Showboat.

City Manager Michael Burns stated he updated the Showboat spreadsheet presented in the City Council packet regarding where we are at with contracts and what we have spent. Still good with Wolverine. Still need to get with Liz Baker at the Chamber on funding updates. Close to having enough funds for the

restrooms. Bids for the restrooms are being opened March 3, 2021, so hope to be coming back with a recommendation from those at the next City Council meeting.

Councilmember Salzwedel stated we have raised \$860,000 to date. A little over \$120,000 that needs to be collected from pledges promised and that is including the LCTV Grant. No tax dollars have been used.

c. Social District.

City Manager Michael Burns stated it opened a week ago. Turnout seems great, busier on Saturdays. Did reopen Monroe due to complaints. All warming areas are on the Riverwalk now. Need more trash cans out and dispensed all around. DDA is funding the officer on duty and the fireman manning the warming areas. May need to lower the well of the fire bins with rebar.

d. MERS.

Burns has been in touch with MERS and working on extending the 30-year period for the unfunded liability. Also, discussing Pension Bonding. MERS is currently running some figures for us and once reviewed, I will bring back to City Council. If interested in doing this, we will have to have an actuarial done.

e. Lowell Township MOU.

Burns read his memo explaining need for cost share agreement between City of Lowell and the Lowell Charter Township.

City Attorney Jessica Wood explained the cost share agreement and added only if we are able to reach an agreement with the Township then we are responsible for our share of the cost to reimburse the developer. Wood recommended the motion should allow the City Attorney to fill in blanks of the agreement and also recommending a "not to exceed \$ total".

IT WAS MOVED BY YANKOVICH and seconded by CHAMBERS that Lowell City Council approve PFM to conduct a valuation of the water and wastewater treatment facilities at a cost not to exceed \$40,000. I also recommend the Lowell City Council approve the cost sharing agreement with Lowell Township and to only pay our share of the valuation if we come to an agreement moving forward.

NEW BUSINESS.

a. LCTV Endowment Fund Recommendations.

Councilmember Salzwedel stated it was a good meeting, praised the team on a great job of putting everything together and trying to come up with a little bit of funding for everybody. Two applications did not qualify for funding. Funding would be dispensed as follows:

City of Lowell \$4,000.

Showboat \$50,000.

Kent County Youth Fair \$7488.60

Lowell Arts Council \$2,200.

Lowell Open Table \$5,790.50

Barn for Equine Indoor Learning & Riding Arena \$17,000.

Vergennes Township \$22,000.

Totaling \$108,479.10

IT WAS MOVED BY CHAMBERS and seconded by DEVORE that Lowell City Council approve the LCTV Endowment Fund Recommendations totaling \$108,479.10.

YES: Councilmember Salzwedel, Councilmember Yankovich, Councilmember Chambers, Councilmember Groves, and Mayor DeVore.

6. BOARD/COMMISSION REPORTS.

Councilmember Salzwedel stated you saw the results of the LCTV Fund and board; they will meet again December 2nd of this year. Light & Power meeting this Thursday March 4, 2021.

Councilmember Yankovich stated the Historical District asked for \$100,000 from the Community Fund. They gave us \$60,000. A little disappointed because the Historic District typically grants 25% to 30% of costs that would translate into work being done in the City of Lowell. Brent Slagel is moving ahead on the Serenity Building and was granted funds from the Community Fund.

MANAGER'S REPORT.

City Manager Michael Burns went over a couple items:

- Was notified Kent County Road Commission will be completing Alden Nash to Main Street to Foreman paving, sometime this spring and summer.
- At our March 15, 2021 City Council meeting, we will have a representative come to discuss the Re-Districting that was approved by the voters in 2018.
- We did put out in the newsletter information pertaining to Marihuana establishments in the City of Lowell.

8. APPOINTMENTS.

Martha Davis would like to join the Downtown Development Authority (DDA).

It was a general consensus that all City Councilmembers approve Martha Davis be appointed to the DDA.

9. COUNCIL COMMENTS

Councilmember Chambers thanked the DPW for opening Monroe street back up and dealing with moving all the items that needed to be moved. Thanked the Fire Department for their firemen doing their job for the social district and the Police Department for patrolling it and making it a safe environment.

Councilmember Salzwedel said he was happy to see the police woman get a hat the other night. He and his wife went down to the Social District Friday night and it was great. Crowds seem to be getting bigger. Along with Marty, thanked everyone involved for getting something new in the City started.

Councilmember Yankovich said Saturdays are great for people getting out and seeing what the Social District is all about. Lots of people visiting the shops. He believes it is going well.

Councilmember Groves stated she also wanted to thank everyone involved in getting the Social District up and running. Thinks it is going well and thinks it is great for the officers and firemen to interact with the public and that is it great to see.

Mayor DeVore thanked Marty Chambers for setting up an interview with the radio station WION. Both he and Marty were able to share all the good things happening in Lowell. DeVore also did a commercial for Lowell.

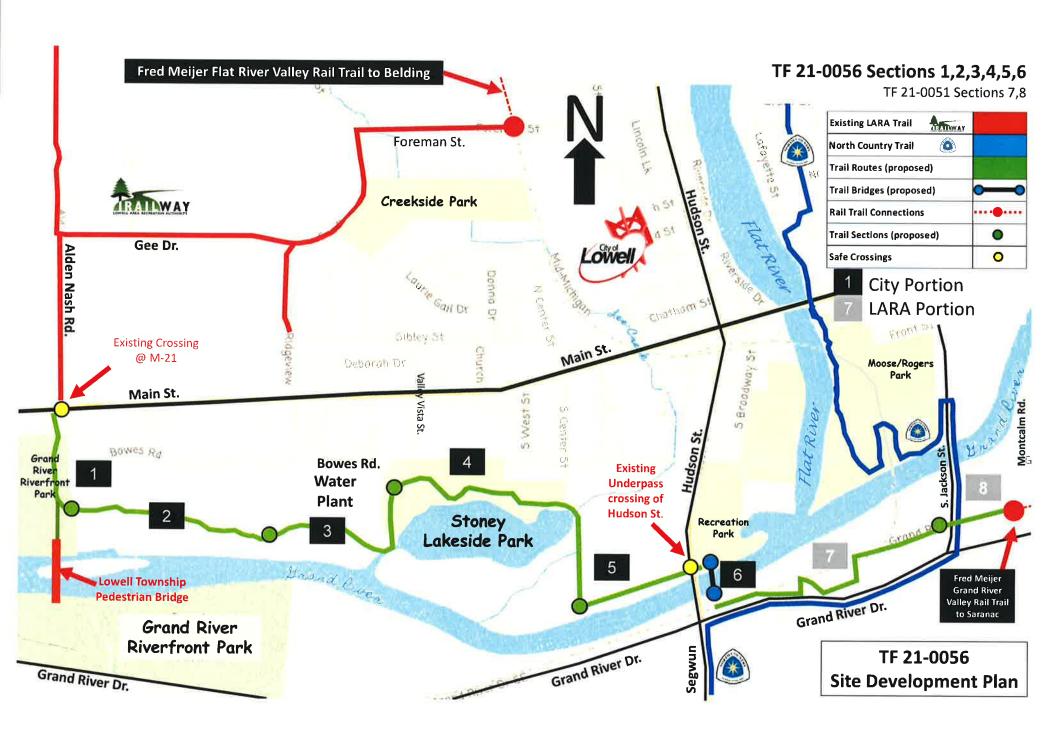

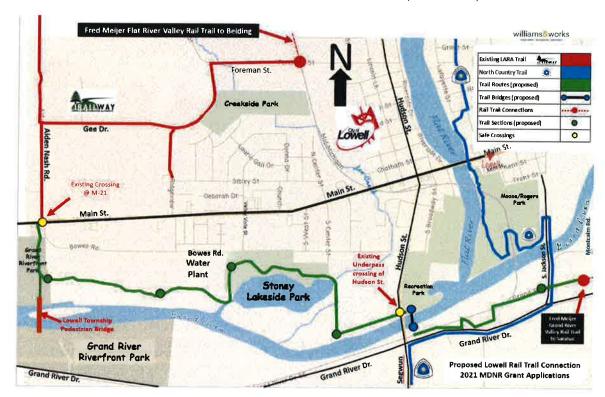






Frequently Asked Questions Proposed Rail Trail Connection Project Updated March, 2021

- What is the purpose of this proposed project? For the Lowell Community, this project extends the existing Lowell Area Recreation Authority (LARA) trail system and provides non-motorized connections to three existing park facilities, and allows for safer walking and cycling options for all types of users. This project will provide a connection of two dead-end rail trail sections that currently terminate on east and north ends of the City of Lowell. As a regional trail, this connection will complete the 125 mile Fred Meijer Mid West Michigan Trail network, allowing for uninterrupted use from Owosso to Ionia to Saranac to Lowell to Belding to Greenville to Alma. Lowell has been designated at as Trail Hub on the 125 mile network and will be a destination location for visiting trail users to the benefit of area businesses.
- What trails will this project connect to? The proposed trail segment connects to the Fred Meijer Flat
 River Valley Rail Trail that goes to Belding, Greenville and Alma, the Fred Meijer Grand River Valley Rail
 Trail that goes to Saranac, Ionia, St. Johns and Owosso, the North Country national hiking trail and the
 LARA Phase 1 Trail that goes from Cherry Creek Elementary to Lowell High School and connects to the
 Cooper Woodland hiking trails and the hiking trails at the Wittenbach-Wege Nature Center.
- What is the scope of the project? Here is a link to a map showing the proposed route. In order to connect the two rail trail end points through Lowell, we have to cross M-21 and Hudson St. as well as the Grand River. (Click on map for link to zoomable and downloadable pdf version).



- When is the proposed schedule for completion? Grant applications are being submitted in March, 2021. The project is targeted to begin in the Fall of 2022 and to be completed in 2023.
- Why is this route different than the one presented in earlier plans? In prior years, the proposed route for the east end of the trail anticipated going through the fairgrounds, crossing the Flat River with a new bridge, going under an existing rail trestle that serves King Milling and then crossing the Grand River with a new pedestrian bridge on S. Jackson St. After formal application to the railroad was made, it was determined that crossing the active spur using the existing trestle could not be allowed for safety, security and liability reasons. Both MDOT and the railroad agreed that the only safe location to cross the rail would be south of the Hudson. St. bridge via an expansion of the existing at-grade crossing.
- How long will this new project be? This new trail project will start at the new Lowell Township park at Bowes and M-21 on the west end and go to the existing dead-end rail trail at Montcalm Avenue on the east end and will add approximately 3.9 miles to the system. The total length of existing and new trail between the two Rail Trail connection points is 5.5 miles.
- Will the trail connect to downtown? The route will include Recreation Park (the fairgrounds) that is a two block walk on existing sidewalks from Main Street and the downtown area.
- How much will it cost? The preliminary cost for all components of this project is \$5,750,000. This includes the design and construction of the trail, a new pedestrian crossing over the Grand River at S. Hudson St., benches, signs and landscaping.
- How will the project be funded? The LARA and the City of Lowell are applying for MDNR Trust Fund and MDOT Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) grants that will total approximately 66% of the costs. The other 34% is being contributed a variety of sources including the Lowell Area Community Fund, the City of Lowell DDA, the Meijer Foundation and other regional grants and private sources.
- Why are we building bike trails when our roads are falling apart? The federal and state funds available for non-motorized trails are separate from the funds available to communities for road maintenance. The MDNR Trust Funds are derived from royalties received on the sale and lease of State-owned minerals (primarily oil and gas) and are dedicated to recreational projects. The MDOT TAP grant uses federal transportation funds designated by Congress for specific activities that enhance the intermodal transportation system and provide safe alternative transportation options. These funds cannot be used for vehicular street projects.
- Why isn't the trail using the new Lowell Township park bridge, then continuing east on the shoulders of Grand River Dr. to the rail trail? This route was considered, but was not selected for several reasons. First, one of the desired goals for this trail requires the placement of a fully independent non-motorized trail that would provide the safest access to all types of users. Placing bicycle riders on a narrow road shoulder, while legal, was not considered to meet the safety goals for this trail and requires the construction of a separate walkway for non-cyclist. Second, the City of Lowell was named as one of the designated Trail Hubs by MDNR and the National Park Service in their 2012 masterplan for this 125 mile trail network. A Grand River Dr.. route totally bypasses the City of Lowell and access to the businesses and amenities in the downtown area. Last, the selected route provides access to the Township's North Grand River Riverfront Park as well as the City's Stoney Lakeside Park Recreation Park, all important features necessary to be considered for maximum scoring points with the MDNR grant programs.

The new Lowell Township bridge does provide an opportunity to someday allow for a trail connection to the Ada trail system to the west as well as being a nice stopping point for all trail users.

• If I live by the trail, will my taxes go up? - Property taxes are based on the value of your home. There will be no separate tax assignment or assessment to adjacent properties. No local taxes are being levied.

- Won't the trail get flooded in the fairgrounds area? The trail in that area will be impacted and unusable when the Grand River reaches flood stage. These are temporary situations and are unavoidable within the influence of the Grand River as demonstrated in our recent experience (February, 2018) that also impacted our other trail neighbors along the Grand River, including Ionia. This will require maintenance of the trail to remove debris and repair any impact to the trail. During the limited times of flooding, users will be directed to an alternate route via signs.
- Can't you just use the existing streets and sidewalks? The study that looked at options for this trail connection did consider directing cyclist to use existing City streets and walkers to use existing sidewalks as opposed to installing a new, separate 10 ft. trail. While this is an available and legal option for short portions of the trail, the desire to provide the safest alternative for non-motorized users required that a separate trail be proposed as opposed to using Main St .(M-21) or Bowes Rd. for example.
- Why does the trail have to be 10 ft. wide? The MDOT TAP grant identified earlier, uses federal funds and as such, must meet federal standards. For a non-motorized trail, that means a 10 ft. wide path with a 2 foot shoulder on both sides. In addition, both the MDOT and MDNR funding require the trail to be compliant with the Americans with Disabilities Act (A.D.A.)
- How are you going to cross Hudson Street? The proposed route is currently directed go under the Hudson St. Bridge near the river using an existing underpass.
- Who will maintain the trail and who's paying for that? Maintenance for the trail will be the responsibility of the LARA in cooperation with the City of Lowell. As members of the LARA, the City and both Vergennes and Lowell Townships contribute financially to the maintenance costs of the trial. As a part of the Fred Meijer Mid-Michigan Regional Trail Authority, this trail is also eligible to receive funds from the maintenance endowment established by the Meijer Foundation for this 125 mile trail network. In addition, the LARA organizes periodic volunteer trail maintenance activities.
- If it goes by my property, do I have to shovel it and patch it in the future? All maintenance will be performed at no expense to property owners.
- Will the trail be paved or gravel? The trail surface is planned to be a 10 ft. wide paved path with 3 inches of asphalt except for the east portion from S. Jackson St. to Montcalm Ave., which will be crushed asphalt. This is an approved surface for persons of all abilities to safely use in most conditions.
- Will the trail be located on public property or will you need to get easements from property owners? The majority of the trail will be located on property owned by the City of Lowell, Lowell Township and in City and County street right-of-way. There are portions of the proposed route where we will be seeking easements to allow the trail to be constructed entirely or partially on private property. In those areas, permission will be requested with those property owners and if allowed, just compensation would be provided to the property owner's satisfaction. This includes replacement of trees, landscaping, etc.

RE: Lowell Little League Park Use Agreement

PUBLIC WORKS

A new season of Lowell Little League Baseball is just around the corner. Back in January, the City approved a new process and new fees for use of the available baseball fields on City property. The new process involves putting together a yearly schedule for use of the fields and allow Lowell Little League to work with other user groups to schedule field use and share the fields with them. The new fees to be charged will be \$8 per day per field. Lowell Little League will be charged \$5,200 for the yearly charge for all fields. For handling the scheduling with the other groups, Lowell Little League will be able to recoup some of their reservations costs back as they share field use with other baseball groups.

The City Attorney has put together a new Public Park Use Agreement to cover this new process and fees. Lowell Little League has seen this document, provided their input, and have indicated they are in agreement. This is ready for City Council approval.

Once approved we will schedule a meeting between the City, Lowell Little League, and the other baseball field users to go over the new process and fees. After that meeting final scheduling can be completed and the new baseball seasons can begin.

It is my recommendation: That the Lowell City Council approve the Public Park Use Agreement with Lowell Little League at a fee of \$8/field/day (total \$5,200).

PUBLIC PARKS USE AGREEMENT

THIS PUBIC PARK USE AGREEMENT (the "Agreement") dated as of _____, by and between the LOWELL LITTLE LEAGUE, a Michigan nonprofit corporation ("LLL"), PO Box 292, Lowell, Michigan 49331, and the CITY OF LOWELL, a Michigan municipal corporation (the "City"), of 301 E. Main Street, Lowell, Michigan 49331.

RECITALS

- A. The City owns Creekside and Recreation Park, public parks (the "Parks"), within the city that contain 5 baseball fields (the "Fields").
- B. LLL has requested permission to use the Parks for the purpose of youth baseball games and related activities including concession activities (the "Use").
- C. The City is willing to permit the LLL to use the Parks for the Use subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the respective representations, covenants and agreements contained herein, the parties hereto agree as follows:

- 1. Use of Fields. The City agrees, pursuant to the terms and conditions of this Agreement to permit LLL to use the Parks for the Use.
- 2. User Fee. LLL shall pay the City a user fee equal to \$5200.00. Such fee is regardless of the actual number of games played or number of participants. It is expected LLL will work with other past users of the Fields to share field time as outlined in paragraph #4: Scheduling of Activities, including reimbursement back to LLL by other users of the Fields. There shall be no refunds of any fees paid.
- **3.** Use of User Fees. The City intends to utilize the User Fee it receives from LLL for improvements and upgrades to the City park system. The City will make sole determination on all park improvements and upgrades that are performed with these funds.
- 4. Scheduling of Activities. LLL agrees to work cooperatively with other users of the Fields who may wish to utilize the ballfields for games, practices, tournaments, etc. LLL shall be responsible for coordinating the scheduling of all activities of LLL and other users of the Fields subject to the following procedures and conditions:

LLL and the City shall hold a kick-off meeting in mid-winter with all past ballfield users to go over the field use policy. All teams shall enter into user agreements with the City and shall have signed Covid-19 waivers submitted to the City for all participants prior to utilizing any Fields. Field usage charged to all users shall be at a maximum of \$8 per field per day of use. At a date set prior to the start of Field use, all teams shall provide to LLL their field usage schedule, along with any fees. Fees shall be paid PRIOR to scheduling any use of fields. LLL will schedule and coordinate all field usage and will be responsible for any and

all collection of fees from other users. At the start of Field usage, LLL will provide to the City a calendar showing all user and the days/times of their reserved Field use.

If LLL determines that LLL has days available for the other groups to use the fields, then LLL may schedule and charge the groups up to \$8/field/day to use the fields. Little League shall reasonably work with all the other users requesting to use a Field and cannot withhold sharing of the Fields. If LLL and other users cannot work out a schedule that is agreeable to all parties, then a meeting shall be held between all parties and a City representative. At the conclusion of this meeting the City shall make a decision on the schedule. Groups may appeal decision to City Manager, who will have final determination of Field use. All groups must then abide by the decision of the City. Under no circumstances shall such City decision result in any adjustment whatsoever to the User Fee, nor shall the City be liable for any damages or alleged damages whatsoever.

- **5. Maintenance.** During the time it has activities at the Fields, LLL will be responsible for keeping those portions of the Fields it is using including the restrooms, clean of litter and other debris and in an orderly and safe condition.
- 6. Utilities. To the extent determinable by the City, LLL will be responsible for the timely payment of the cost of utilities, i.e., water, sanitary sewer, electric, etc., directly related to facilities it is using at the Fields. The City and LLL shall mutually agree on the method of measuring utility usage and the cost thereof.
- 7. General Maintenance. The City will be responsible for mowing the athletic fields at the Fields used by LLL as needed during the time such fields are being used by LLL and for providing routine cleaning and maintenance of the Fields' restroom and other facilities. LLL shall be responsible to leave the Parks in the same condition, or better, than when they started their Use of such Parks. LLL shall be responsible, under the City's supervision, for repairing or restoring any damage or deterioration of such athletic fields or other facilities in the Parks caused by LLL's abnormal use.
- **8. Signage.** All signage at the Parks placed or caused to be placed by LLL shall have the prior written approval of the City Manager or his designee and shall be in compliance with the applicable provisions of the City Zoning Ordinance related to signs.
- 9. Concession Permits. If LLL operates a concession business during its use of the Fields, it shall be responsible for obtaining and keeping current any licenses and permits required by the Kent County Department of Public Health or other governmental body or agency. All concession proceeds shall be the responsibility and retained by the entity operating the concessions. LLL shall be responsible for any electrical costs of concession portion of the building.
- 10. Indemnification and Insurance. LLL shall indemnify and hold harmless the City and its officers, councilmembers, agents and employees from and against any and all losses, expenses (including attorney fees and costs), claims and demands sustained by reason of negligence of LLL and its members, volunteers, participants, guests and invitees while using the Parks. LLL shall obtain and continuously maintain in effect during the term of this

Agreement a policy of general liability insurance in the amount of \$2,000,000 per occurrence and in the annual aggregate with an insurance company licensed to do business in the State of Michigan. The City shall be named an additional insured on the policy and the policy shall provide a waiver of subrogation and at least 30 days written notice to the City of any cancellation, termination or material modification of the policy. LLL shall provide the City a current copy of the policy or certificate of insurance evidencing such coverage.

- 11. Coronavirus/COVID-19 Release of Liability and Assumption of Risk Agreement ("COVID Release"). As a condition of this Agreement, LLL shall additionally execute a COVID Release in the form attached hereto as Exhibit A and shall cause all users of the Park under the auspices of LLL to execute the same and where a user is a minor by such a parent or guardian of the user.
- **12. Term.** The term of the Agreement shall begin on March 31, 2021, and end on March 31, 2023. Thereafter, upon written approval of the City Council and LLL, this agreement may be renewed for successive one-year terms.
- **13. Annual Review.** LLL and the City agree to meet annually each year, within 30 days of the end of the LLL season to review this Agreement and the use of the Parks by LLL during the prior calendar year.
- 14. Early Termination. This Agreement may be terminated by either party upon written notice to the other party of failure to comply with the terms of this Agreement and continued non-compliance for 30 days after such notice is given. In addition, this Agreement may be terminated at any time with or without cause upon 180 days advance written notice by one party to the other party. Any notice given to the City shall be by first class mail or personal delivery to 310 East Main Street, Lowell, Michigan 49331, Attention: City Manager and to LLL by first class mail for personal delivery to PO Box 292, Lowell, Michigan 49331, Attention: President. Either party may notify the other of a change in the notice address by written notice in accordance with this paragraph.
- **15. Applicable Law.** This Agreement shall be interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of Michigan.
- 16. Entire Agreement. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties hereto related to the subject matter hereto and there are no other representations, promises or agreements, oral or written, expressed or implied between the parties hereto.
- 17. Amendment and Assignment. This Agreement may not be amended or assigned without the prior written consent of both parties hereto.

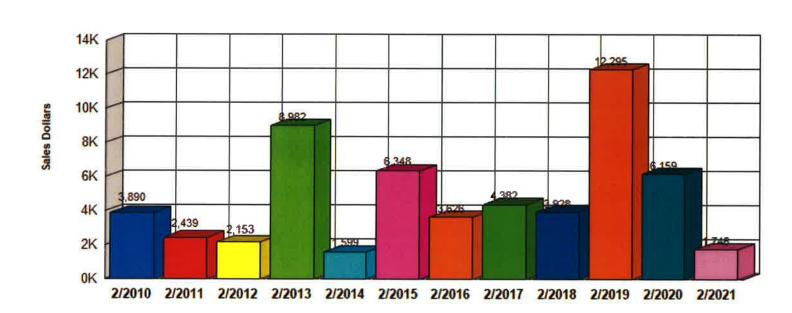

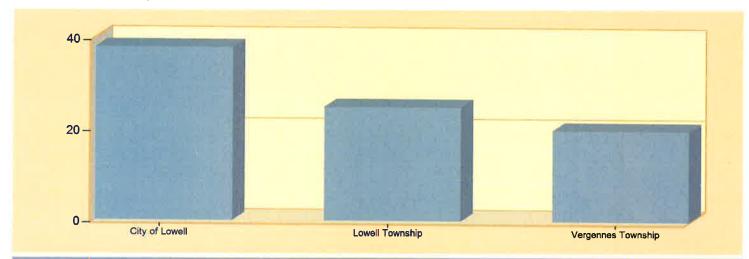

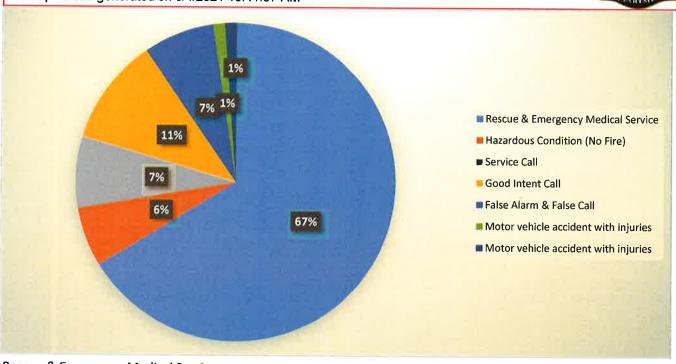

On behalf of Suez I am pleased to submit the February Monthly Operating Report for the Lowell Wastewater Treatment Plant. During the month 30.72 million gallons of wastewater were treated, down from 34.64 million gallons the month before.

All NPDES Permit requirements were satisfied. Copies of the Discharge Monitoring Report for the month can be seen in Appendix A. Appendix B contains graphs representing how the actual lab results compared to the limits in the NPDES Permit and how the actual plant flows compared to the design flow.

INDUSTRIAL PRETREATMENT PROGRAM

The Fullers Septic February surcharges were \$9.24 for the month. No operational problems were experienced at the plant from this discharge.

The Litehouse January surcharges were \$3,722.52, included in this was 4 fines for exceeding the upper limit for BOD and FOG. The February surcharges were not received at the time of this report. No operational problems were experienced at the plant from this discharge.

FEBRUARY EFFLUENT ANALYSIS OVERVIEW

The daily average for CBOD was 4 mg/l, 84% under the NPDES limit of 25 mg/l. The worst 7-day average was 6 mg/l, 85% under the NPDES limit of 40 mg/l.

The daily average for Suspended Solids was 5.7 mg/l, 81% under the NPDES limit of 30 mg/l. The worst 7-day average was 12.3 mg/l, 73% under the NPDES limit of 45 mg/l.

The monthly average for Phosphorus was 0.19 mg/l, the limit is 1.0 mg/l.

The average removal rate for BOD was 98%; a minimum of 85% is required. The average removal rate for Suspended Solids was 96%; a minimum of 85% is required.

The geometric average for fecal coliform bacteria was 78 colonies/100 mls, the limit is 200 colonies/100 mls. The worst 7-day average was 225 colonies/100 mls, the limit is 400 colonies/100 mls.

The highest chlorine residual was 36 ug/l; the limit is 38 ug/l. The monthly average was 18 ug/l.

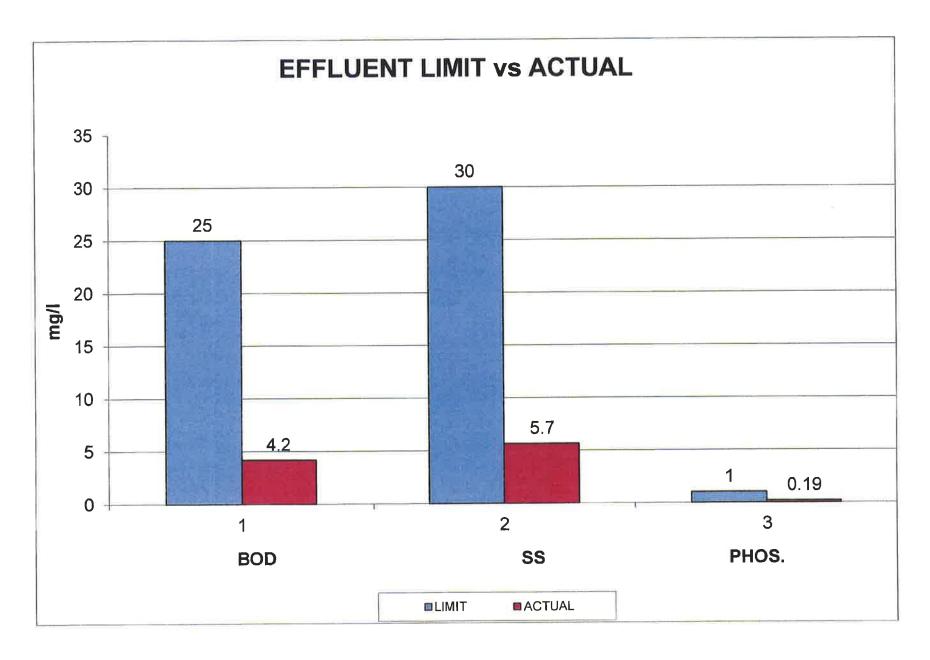

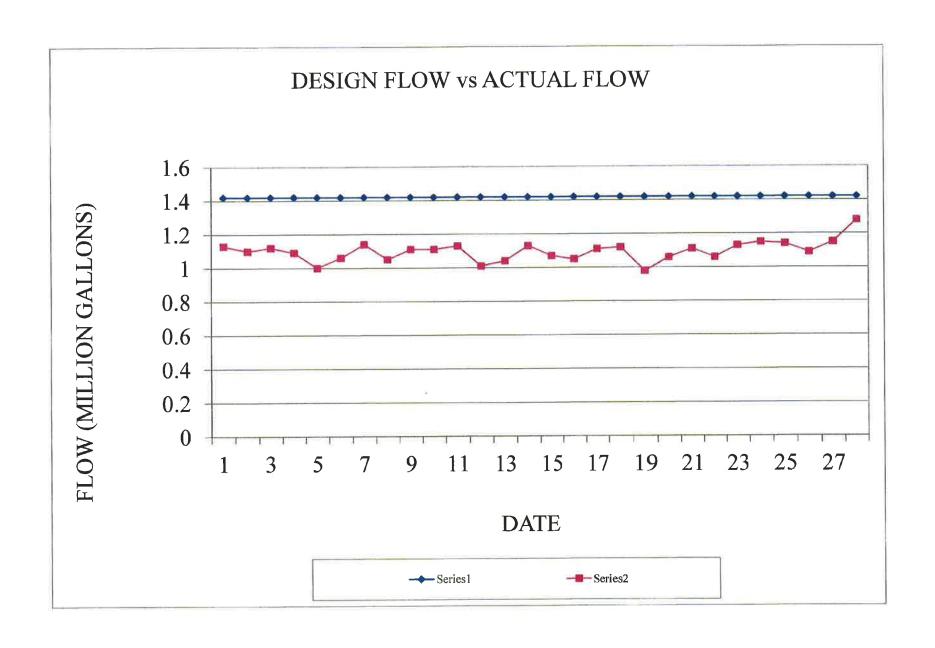
