 Resolution 10-15 - Contract with Hope Network West Michigan for Specialized Transportation Services.

With the decision to opt out of the CDBG Urban County program we have created an allocation in the General Fund to continue to the North Kent Transit transportation program for eligible city residents. The cost is typically \$3,000 to \$4,000 per year.

In order to continue the program we will need to contract directly with Hope Network to provide these services. The attached resolution approves and authorizes signatures on the contract with Hope Network.

b. Resolution 11-15 – License Agreement with Wendell L. Christoff Trust – Public Pedestrian Pathway.

We have an agreement with the Wendell L. Christoff Trust to utilize a portion of the property near Litehouse for a public pathway. That agreement has expired and a new agreement is recommended. Two changes in the agreement include the installation by the city of signs around the parking lot and near the retention ponds as well as language allowing termination with a six-month notice.

OLD BUSINESS.

a. <u>Strategic Goals Report</u>. City Manager Howe presented a new Strategic Goals report. This report has been divided into Tier One, Tier Two and Tier Three. He noted there has been further discussion on the street plan at a recent workshop. The Council is in the process of identifying community and high priority streets for repair within the next five years. Also, coordination is being done with future water and sewer work over the next five years.

The downtown banners are in the process of being installed.

b. <u>Pending Council Projects Report</u>. Howe stated the Council approved the removal of the downtown tower at the previous meeting. Updates will be provided.

The Lime Disposal project is closed and has been completed. By general consensus, the Council agreed to remove this item from the report.

8. **NEW BUSINESS**

KDL Annual Report.

Former Branch Manager of the Englehardt Public Library Josh Bernstein provided the 2015 annual report. There are many events happening at the library. KDL received a grant from the Steelcase Foundation to conduct a study to gage the impact of how story time affects kids. The Lowell branch will be participating in this study beginning in the fall.

Bernstein stated 84% of Lowell residents are library cardholders. This is the highest percentage out of all the KDL districts. Lowell residents appreciate the library and use it regularly. The summer reading club members increased by 20% last summer and this summer appears to be similar.

With the millage increase last year, KDL is bringing their services to other areas in town. The Lowell branch has struck a partnership with the senior center, baby time at the alpha center and FROM. They also have a great partnership with Friends of the Library.

KDL director Lance Werner and trustee Shirley Bruursema were also present. Bruursema stated KDL just approved a three year strategic plan with a special focus on senior citizens, creating young readers, support learning and cultivating creativity. She noted KDL is the second largest library in Michigan.

Werner stated the circulation in 2014 was down slightly. However, since the millage passed KDL has increased their collection. The electronic circulation was extremely high in 2014. He thanked the City for their partnership and being great friends to the library.

Mayor Hodges stated the City is very proud of the library.

b. <u>Lowell Youth Football Park Agreement</u>. The City has negotiated a Park Use Agreement with Lowell Youth Football to use Burch Field for its fall football program. The term of the agreement is through December 31, 2016, which now completes the alignment of all of our sports agreements to expire at the end of 2016. In addition, the rate is set at \$10 per participant which also aligns with the rest of the youth sports agreements.

c. <u>Tree Removal – 726 Lafayette</u>. The City had a request from a resident to remove a tree in the street right-of-way at 726 Lafayette Street. The neighbor across the street supports the request to remove the tree. Both attended a recent meeting of the Arbor Board which has recommended removal as well. It is estimated that the cost to remove the tree will be approximately \$2,000. There will be a sidewalk repair of approximately \$300 as well.

CONTRACT BETWEEN THE CITY OF LOWELL AND HOPE NETWORK WEST MICHIGAN

THIS CONTRACT is entered into on this _____ day of ______, effective from July 1, 2015, through June 30, 2016, by and between the City of Lowell (hereinafter called the "City"), and Hope Network West Michigan, (hereinafter called the "Agency").

WITNESSETH THAT:

WHEREAS, the City desires to engage the Agency to perform certain Services and Activities as specified herein; and

WHEREAS, the Agency agrees to perform such Services and Activities in a lawful, satisfactory, and proper manner, and in accordance with all policies, procedures, and requirements which have been or, from time to time, may be prescribed by the City;

NOW, THEREFORE, the City and the Agency do mutually agree as follows:

ARTICLE I - PROJECT OBJECTIVES

The project objectives of this Contract are herein established as the standards to be used by the City to determine the impact and effectiveness of the Services and Activities to be performed by the Agency under Article II below. The project objectives are:

The City desires to provide door-to-door and door-through-door specialized transportation service to the City senior citizens aged 60 years and above and individuals residing in the City with disabilities during the period covered by this Contract. The Agency shall arrange for the desired service to be provided to eligible City residents under the terms and conditions of this Contract. The City shall compensate the Agency for the desired Services and Activities as specified herein.

ARTICLE II- SCOPE OF SERVICES AND ACTIVITIES

In order to accomplish the project objectives defined in Article I above, the Agency shall perform in a lawful, satisfactory, and proper manner, the following Services and Activities:

a) Advance reservation door-to-door and door-through-door transportation service shall be furnished to individuals meeting the Agency's eligibility criteria. The service will be offered solely to eligible city residents in which the origin or destination is to or from the city. A resident of the city may utilize the service for a trip that

- does not originate or terminate within the City with the approval of the City.
- b) Eligible City residents may travel to and from any point within the Agency's North Kent Transit Services (NKTS) Primary Service Area provided no more than twenty (20) trips per month are taken by an individual, unless authorized by the City.
- c) These transportation services shall be furnished from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday. The beginning time of service is the earliest time at which passengers shall be scheduled to be picked up. The ending time of service is the latest time at which passengers shall be scheduled to be picked up for return trips. No transportation service shall be provided on New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving, and Christmas Day. Should the Agency change regular NKTS days and/or hours during the term of this Contract, the service days and/or hours for transportation service provided under this Contract shall change concurrently with the change in the Agency's regular NKTS days and/or hours.
- d) Passenger eligibility criteria shall be limited to City residents. Persons desiring to use the service shall be required to complete a registration procedure to verify eligibility as a non-disabled senior citizen aged 60 years or more or as a person with a disability requiring specialized transportation services. Registration of eligible individuals shall be carried out by the Agency using the Agency's procedures and operational requirements.
- e) A passenger fare of \$4.25 per one-way trip shall be charged to eligible persons who travel within the current NKTS boundaries, and a fare of \$7.25 per one-way trip shall be charged to eligible persons who travel outside of the current NKTS boundaries and within Kent County and utilizing Services provided under this Contract. Fare revenues shall be retained by the Agency as partial reimbursement for service operating expenses. If the regular NKTS fares be changed during the term of this Contract, the fares for City service shall be changed to remain equal to the regular NKTS fares.
- f) Wheelchair accessible vehicles with lifts or ramps plus wheelchair securement equipment shall be made available by the Agency and operated as needed to meet the travel needs of persons using wheelchairs who request service.
- g) The Agency shall provide, at no charge, copies of public information brochures and other materials developed for purposes of marketing Agency services. Agency personnel shall assist the City in developing appropriate public information for Services and Activities under this

- Contract. The Agency and the City shall coordinate an effective public information program.
- h) The Agency shall prepare and submit to the City a monthly report on the Services and Activities undertaken to fulfill its obligations under this Contract.

ARTICLE III - TIME OF PERFORMANCE

- a) On July 1, 2015, the Agency shall commence performance of the Services and Activities required under this Contract.
- b) The Agency shall continue to perform such Services and Activities until the expiration of this Contract on June 30, 2016, unless otherwise terminated earlier pursuant to the terms of this Contract.

ARTICLE IV - COMPENSATION AND METHOD OF PAYMENT

- a) As full compensation for the Agency's satisfactory performance under, and completion of, this Contract, the City hereby agrees to pay the Agency the amount of \$16.00 per one-way trip for all eligible trips performed under this Contract. It is agreed that the above-specified amounts shall be the maximum amounts to be charged by the Agency during the term of this Contract. Should the Agency's net cost of providing the specified Services and Activities be reduced due to an increase in the fare(s) paid by passengers, the \$16.00 sum per one-way trip shall be adjusted downward as of the effective date(s) of any such changes.
- b) It is expressly understood by and between the City, and the Agency that in no event shall the total compensation and reimbursement, if any, to be paid to the Agency pursuant to this Contract, exceed the maximum sum of \$3,000 (Three Thousand Dollars) unless prior approval has been given by the City.
- c) At the end of each calendar month of service, the Agency shall prepare and provide to the City a statement of charges due for service provided during the prior month, supported and accompanied by detailed documentation of the basis for the charges shown. The City shall determine whether or not the charges are acceptable for processing and payment. Invoices shall be due and payable within thirty (30) days of the date that the City receives the invoice.

ARTICLE V - CONTINUED FUNDING

The City makes no implied or explicit guarantee, offer, or representation of future funding from the City beyond the termination of this Contract.

ARTICLE VI - CONTRACT MODIFICATIONS

The City, from time to time, may expand, diminish, or otherwise modify the Project Objectives, the Scope of Services and Activities, or any other Contract provisions related thereto, which the Agency is required to perform pursuant to Articles I and II of this Contract; provided, however, such modifications are mutually agreed upon by the City, and the Agency. The City and the Agency agree that this Contract sets forth, in the entirety, all agreements between the parties hereto.

ARTICLE VII - TERMINATION OF CONTRACT

- a) The City may terminate this Contract at any time for any reason by giving written notice by United States certified mail to the Agency at least sixty (60) calendar days before the effective date of such termination and specifying the effective date.
- b) The Agency may terminate this Contract at any time for any reason by giving written notice by United States certified mail to the City at least sixty (60) calendar days before the effective date of such termination and specifying the effective date.
- c) In the event that this Contract is terminated, the Agency shall receive just and equitable compensation for any work which the Agency satisfactorily completed pursuant to this Contract before the effective termination date.

ARTICLE VIII- RECORDS AND DOCUMENTATION

- a) The Agency shall establish and maintain all necessary records concerning any matter covered by this Contract which, from time to time, may be required by the City.
- b) Unless otherwise expressly authorized by the City, the Agency shall maintain all records related to this Contract, including financial records and accounts, for a time period of at least six (6) years after receipt of final payment under this Contract.
- c) If any litigation, claim, or audit regarding the services described in this Contract is started before the expiration of the six (6) year time period, the records shall be retained by the Agency until all litigation (including appeals), claims, or audit findings involving the records have been resolved.

ARTICLE IX - AUDITS AND INSPECTIONS

At any time during normal business hours and as often as the City may deem necessary to ensure proper accounting for all project funds, the Agency shall:

- a) Make available to the City all checks, payrolls, time records, invoices, contracts, vouchers, orders and other data, information, and material concerning any matter covered by this Contract.
- b) Permit the City to audit, examine, excerpt, or transcribe all checks, payrolls, time records, invoices, contracts, vouchers, orders, or other data, information, and material concerning any matter covered by this Contract.
- c) Allow the City to review such documents that are considered as backup to the operation of the Agency, related to this Contract.

ARTICLE X - CONFLICT OF INTEREST

- a) The Agency covenants that no conflict of interest exists and no person having any conflicting interest in this Contract shall be employed for the purpose of performing the Services and Activities set forth in the Scope of Services and Activities (Article II) of this Contract or fulfilling the terms, conditions, obligations, covenants, agreements, or stipulations herein.
- b) The Agency shall establish safeguards to prohibit employees from using positions for a purpose that is or gives the appearance of being motivated by a desire for private gain for themselves or others, particularly those with whom they have family, business, or other relationships or ties.

ARTICLE XI - ASSIGNMENT AND TRANSFER OF INTEREST; SUBCONTRACTING

The Agency shall not assign or transfer, whether by assignment or novation, any interest in this Contract, or subcontract any performance or portion hereof pursuant to the Contract without the prior written consent of the City; provided, however, that claims for money due or to become due the Agency from the City pursuant to this Contract may be assigned or transferred to a bank, trust company, or other financial institution without such consent, and the Agency shall promptly notify the City of any such assignment or transfer.

ARTICLE XII - INDEMNIFICATION; ENFORCEMENT; ATTORNEY FEES

a) To the extent permitted by law, the Agency will indemnify and save harmless the City for, from, and against any and all damages to property or injuries to or death of any person or persons, including the property and employees or agents of the City, and the Agency shall defend, indemnify and save harmless the City from any and all claims, demands, suits, liabilities and/or payments, actions or proceedings of any kind or nature, including workers compensation claims, of or by anyone whomsoever, in any way resulting from or arising out of the Agency's operations in connection with this Contract, including the operations of the Agency's subcontractors, and the acts or omissions of employees or agents of the

- Agency or its subcontractors. This paragraph shall benefit not only the City, but also the City's employees, officials, officers, and agents.
- b) In addition to the remedies specified in this Contract, the parties shall have such additional remedies as are provided by Michigan law and equity.
- c) In the event of a suit or action filed to enforce or interpret this Contract or with respect to this Contract, the prevailing party shall be reimbursed by the other party for all costs and expenses incurred in connection with the suit or action, including without limitation reasonable attorneys' fees and costs.

ARTICLE XIII - INSURANCE

The Agency will procure and maintain, at its own cost and expense, and as long as it is providing services to the City, the following insurance coverage:

- a) Commercial General Liability: per occurrence form, minimum limits of \$1,000,000 per occurrence.
- b) Automobile Liability: Michigan no-fault coverage, and residual Liability for bodily injury and property damage, minimum limits \$1,000,000.
- c) Worker's Compensation and Employer's Liability: Statutory coverage or proof acceptable to the City of approval as a self-insurer by the State of Michigan. Employer's Liability \$500,000.
- d) The Agency shall provide the City with written proof that the city has been added as an additional insured on the Agency's insurance coverage.

ARTICLE XIV- CIVIL RIGHTS

- a) The Agency agrees that it will not discriminate as to provision of Services and Activities pursuant to this Contract or as to hiring or terms or conditions of employment based on race, color, religion, national origin, sex, disability, marital status, height, weight, age or other protected class against whom discrimination is prohibited by law.
- b) The Agency shall, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the Agency, state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, color, religion, national origin, sex, disability, marital status, height, weight, age or other protected class against whom discrimination is prohibited by law.
- c) In the event of the Agency's noncompliance with the nondiscrimination clauses of this Contract or with any of such rules, regulations or orders, this Contract may be cancelled, terminated, or suspended in whole or in part.

ARTICLE XV - SEVERABILITY

If any clauses, sections, provisions, or parts of this Contract are held invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, or if any portion of any clause, section, provision or part of this Contract is held invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this Contract shall not be affected thereby, if such remainder of this Contract would then continue to conform to the terms and requirements of applicable law. Unless otherwise specified in this Contract, all notices, duties, or rights of the parties shall be exercised by and through this Contract as specified herein.

ARTICLE XVI - WAIVER

The failure of the City to demand compliance with any term of this Contract, or to take action when this Contract is breached in any way, shall not be considered a waiver of that contractual requirement thereafter, nor of the City's right of action for the breach of that term.

ARTICLE XVII – OPTIONAL RENEWAL

By mutual agreement of the parties, the City shall have the right to renew this Contract annually for an additional year and pursuant to the same terms and conditions of this Contract at a compensation mutually agreed upon by the City and the Agency.

ARTICLE XVIII - DISCLOSURE OF CONFIDENTIAL MATERIAL

The parties agree not to disclose any information regarding this Contract or the services provided pursuant to this Contract except as otherwise required by law (including, but not limited to, the Michigan Freedom of Information act) or regulation.

LICENSE AGREEMENT

THIS LICENSE AGREEMENT (the "Agreement") is made as of July 1, 2015, by the WENDELL L. CHRISTOFF TRUST, under agreement dated August 1, 1986, of 1400 Foreman Street, Lowell, Michigan 49331 (the "Licensor") and the CITY OF LOWELL, a Michigan municipal corporation, of 301 E. Main Street, Lowell, Michigan 49331 (the "City").

RECITALS

A. The Licensor owns certain real property located in the City of Lowell, Kent County, Michigan, and legally described as follows:

The East 15 feet of part of the South 1/2 Northeast 1/4 of Section 3, Township 6 North, Range 9 West, commencing 858.90 feet West along the North 1/8 line from the East section line; thence South 00°00'00" 638.0 feet to a point 24.25 feet North from the South line of the North 1/2 of the South 1/2 of the Northeast 1/4; thence Westerly parallel with the North 1/8 line 40.0 feet; thence South 00°00'00" 24.25 feet to the South line of the North 1/2 of the South 1/2 of the Northeast 1/4; thence East long the South line 527.30 feet; thence North parallel with the East section line 663.10 feet to the North 1/8 line; thence West along the North 1/8 line 482.0 feet to the point of beginning.

(the "Licensed Premises").

B. The City has requested Licensor's permission to use a five-foot wide pedestrian pathway on the Licensed Premises between Foreman Road and Creekside Park for use by the general public. The Licensor has agreed to grant a license to the City pursuant to the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

AGREEMENT

NOW, THEREFORE, in exchange for consideration in, or referred to by, this Agreement, the parties agree as follows:

1. License. The Licensor grants to the City, and the City accepts from the Licensor, a non-exclusive, non-transferable license to use a five foot wide pedestrian pathway on the Licensed Premises between Foreman Road and Creekside Park for use by the general public.

This is a license and the City understands and agrees that it is only permission to use the Licensed Premises and does not constitute any legal or possessory interest in the property.

- 2. Acceptance of Licensed Premises. The Licensor makes no warranties or representations to the City regarding the condition of the Licensed Premises for the use contemplated by this Agreement, and the City agrees to accept the Licensed Premises on an "as is" basis.
- 3. Maintenance. The City shall, at its sole cost, maintain the path in good repair and shall keep the path and the area immediately surrounding it in a clean and sanitary condition including the installation, maintenance and repair of all pathway signage.
- 4. **Insurance.** The City shall provide general liability insurance coverage for the Licensor, as an additional insured under the City's existing policy, with coverage for bodily injury (including death) and for property damage in a minimum amount of Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000) per occurrence and Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000) in the annual aggregate, for occurrences arising out of the use of the Licensed Premises by the general public.
- 5. Indemnification. To the extent permitted by law, the City agrees they will indemnify and save the Licensor harmless from any and all liability, damage, expense, causes of action, suits, claims or judgments resulting from injury of person or of others arising out of use of the Licensed Premises by the City, its employees, agents, contractors and subcontractors, or to general public. The Licensor agrees that in case any claim is asserted or any action brought to recover any such damage, the Licensor shall give prompt notice in writing to the City and cooperate in every way in the investigation and defense of any such claim or action, and in the handling of settlement of any such action shall be performed and concluded by the City or its insurer. Nothing in this paragraph shall be deemed to waive any statutory or common law immunity of the City pursuant to the laws of the State of Michigan.
- **6. Assignment.** Neither party may assign its rights, duties or obligations under this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other party.
- 7. Term; Early Termination. The term of this Agreement shall be for a period beginning on the date of this Agreement and ending at 11:59 p.m. on June 30, 2025. Either the Licensor or the City may terminate this Agreement earlier at anytime upon six months notice.

8. Miscellaneous.

- a. Successors and Assigns. This Agreement shall inure to the benefit of and be binding upon on the parties and their heirs, representatives, successors and assigns.
- b. Entire Agreement. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties as to its subject matter and it supersedes and replaces all prior or contemporaneous agreements. It may not be modified or amended except in writing signed by the parties.

- 1. The burned house at 318 Lincoln Lake has been removed. Special thanks should be given to Impact Church whose congregation worked with the City of Lowell to spread topsoil and plant grass seed on the property.
- 2. Impact Church also worked closely with the City of Lowell on a number of clean-up and beautification projects in city parks and public areas. This was part of their Love Week celebration July 13-17. This community is blessed with many caring individuals and churches who do so much to make this a great place to worship and raise a family. - 3. Draft plans have been completed for the South Monroe parking project and are currently being reviewed.
- 4. We are also considering repair of less than a mill and repave for one or two blocks of Avery Street.
