The Meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Mayor DeVore and City Clerk Susan Ullery called roll.

4. OLD BUSINESS

a. Ware Road.

Police Chief Steve Bukala explained as stated by Joe Berlin at our last City Council meeting, we would need to have additional groundwater sampling and wells drilled as part of our work plan being filed with the Michigan Department of Environments, Great Lakes and Energy (EGLE). We have a proposal from BLDI that entails the additional groundwater sampling. Also, the proposal includes removal and disposal of soil cuttings and well development water that were generated during the monitoring well installation and need to be removed from the site. There are currently 26 drums onsite to be removed. Total cost of proposal is \$13,800 for this series of work. This work is necessary to fulfill our requirements with EGLE.

IT WAS MOVED BY YANKOVICH and seconded by CHAMBERS to approve the proposal from BLDI to conduct additional groundwater sampling and removal of soil cuttings and disposal at a cost not to exceed \$13,800.

b. Lowell Trail - Dave Austin.

Dave Austin with Williams and Works stated on April 1, 2020 both the City and the Lowell Area Recreation Authority will be submitting updated grant applications to the MDNRR Trust Fund program towards the project that will connect the regional River Valley Rail Trail legs from Belding and from Saranac through the City. At the March 16th meeting, a public hearing will be held and the Council will be asked to consider a resolution authorizing submittal of the revised application. (The applications that were submitted last year by the City and LARA were voluntarily withdrawn as all permits and matching funds were not secured by the October 1st deadline, so reapplication is necessary). The revised application will show a new proposed route for the portion of the trail east of Hudson St. The original route proposed going through Recreation Park, crossing the Flat River, going under or across the active King Milling railroad spur, then crossing the Grand River with a new pedestrian bridge parallel to the S. Jackson bridge. After review of the formal applications, the railroad concluded that they will not issue permits for the crossing of this spur due to safety and liability concerns. At a recent meeting with the railroad and MDOT, it was determined that the most feasible location to cross the tracks will be at the intersection of Grand River Drive Dr. and S. Hudson (Segwun). This route will require a new pedestrian bridge over the Grand River from the fairgrounds to the Grand River Drive. The trail will then proceed east to the connection point at S. Jackson. Conversations are being held with property owners along Grand River Drive and the railroad to develop the exact alignment. Since the necessary route has changed, we wanted to update Council before the March 16th meeting and invite any questions or concerns you may have.

MACP Accreditation.

Police Chief Steve Bukala stated City Council members requested an update on our accreditation project since we have signed up. Since April of 2019-December 2019, I have gone through and updated all of our policy and procedures for the Lowell Police Department (total of 55). We have also gone through all of our job descriptions and Field Training Program to meet the standards set by the Michigan Association of Chiefs of Police. A common theme began to come up in my conversations with MACP and the other agencies going through or just finishing the process is whether or not we are using the Power DMS software accreditation module. Right now we are not. The process is taking a very long time to develop proofs that we are following policies as we have to physically find proofs by hand, where Power DMS will do this for LPS automatically.

Bukala continued, Sgt. Hurst and I looked into this at the chief's conference in February and I completed a go to meeting webinar with the sales representative. What Power DMS does is pull each policy, develops a training module and a tracking system for each officer, and compiles the proofs we need for the accreditation process. This will cut my time by 50% or more trying to manage this accreditation process. Since we are a small agency, I was able to negotiate \$1000 off the base price and will be putting Power DMS into our 2020-2021 budget to continue using the system. I was also able to get a price for our last four months of this year's budget to get a jump on the program. Although this is not a budgeted item, I have money available to pay for this out of the equipment line item for the remainder of this year.

IT WAS MOVED BY CHAMBERS and seconded by YANKOVICH for City Council to authorize the expenditure of \$1624.90 and authorize Police Chief Steve Bukala to oversee the Power DMS Accreditation Module Program.

MANAGER'S REPORT.

Acting City Manager Police Chief Bukala reported on the following:

- Information came in over the weekend from the Chamber of Commerce, the farmers market will be moving from downtown to the Impact Church parking lot this year for better exposure, larger area and maybe some better luck.
- Something that came in this morning, of the 2020 CDBG Grant scoring results, Amity Street reconstruction came in number one out of the twenty-one projects that were submitted. Doesn't mean we are going to get money but it is a good sign.

8. APPOINTMENTS.

Only change in appointments is that the Building Authority vacancy is going to have to become a full vacancy because Charles Myers is no longer a City of Lowell resident.

By general consensus, City Councilmembers all agreed to appoint Jim Salzwedel to the full time building authority board vacancy.

COUNCIL COMMENTS.

Councilmember Chambers stated coffee with Council will be this Saturday at the Chamber and we were in Frankenmuth this past Friday and Saturday for our annual Michigan Municipal League classes. Received a lot of good information and met some really interesting people. Spoke with a gentleman from Benton Harbor about how they were able to get their city income tax to pass and how it is making a big difference for them.

Councilmember Yankovich stated it is Red Arrow time again. Yankovich was at the concert at the Lowell Arts Council when the Lowell wrestling team with police escorts came rolling by and it was great.

The Lowell Orchestra and Chamber Orchestra received straight ones at their district competition. This weekend is the Lowell High School Musical "Freaky Friday". The same lady that sang Mary Poppins last year has the lead this year so get your tickets; it is going to be great!

Mayor DeVore stated he was also at the Frankenmuth at the Michigan Municipal League (MML) classes and there is a movement going on right now through the league called "Save MI City". 8.6 billion dollars since 2002 has been funneled away from municipalities in the State of Michigan. Conflict between the Headley Amendment and Proposition A that doesn't allow us to do what both of those were originally intended to do. The City of Lowell on its own since 2002 has lost in state funding just short of 2.1 million dollars. There is a lot going on in Lansing right now with that and hopefully we will have someone here to speak about it from the MML at our first April meeting.

ORDINANCE NO. 20-01

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 10.04, "SITE DEVELOPMENT REQUIREMENTS," OF CHAPTER 10, **"C-1 NEIGHBORHOOD** BUSINESS DISTRICT," AND SECTIONS 11.01, 11.02, 11.03, 11.04, AND 11.05 OF CHAPTER 11, "C-2 CENTRAL BUSINESS DISTRICT," AND SECTIONS 12.04 AND 12.05 OF CHAPTER 12, "C-3 GENERAL BUSINESS DISTRICT," AND SECTION 12A.04, "SITE DEVELOPMENT REOUIREMENTS," OF CHAPTER 12A, "I-L LIGHT INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT," AND SECTION 13.02, "USES PERMITTED BY RIGHT," AND SECTION 13.04, "SITE DEVELOPMENT REQUIREMENTS," OF CHAPTER 13, "I INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT," OF APPENDIX A. "ZONING," OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF LOWELL

Councilmember <u>YANKOVICH</u> supported by Councilmember <u>SALZWEDEL</u> moved the adoption of the following ordinance:

THE CITY OF LOWELL ORDAINS:

Section 1. Amendment to Section 10.04 of Chapter 10. Section 10.04, 'Site development requirements," of Chapter 10, "C-1-Neighborhood Business District," of Appendix A, "Zoning," of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Lowell is amended in part as follows:

Minimum front yard	25 feet
Minimum side yard	Side abutting Residential Districts or Uses – 25 feet Side abutting other Districts – 0 or 10 feet Street side of a corner lot – 35 feet
Minimum rear yard	35 feet
Maximum building height	35 feet or 2 ½ stories

Section 2. Amendment to Section 11.01 of Chapter 11. Section 11.01, 'Intent," of Chapter 11, "C-2 Central Business District," of Appendix A, "Zoning," of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Lowell is amended to read as follows:

SECTION 11.01. - INTENT.

This district is intended to accommodate uses which can provide office, personal services, convenience (day-to-day), and comparison commercial goods for visitors to and residents of Lowell. Development in this district should be pedestrian-oriented and consistent with the established historic development pattern of downtown Lowell in terms of both building design and land use.

Section 3. Amendment to Section 11.02 of Chapter 11. Section 11.02, "Uses permitted by right," of Chapter 11, "C-2 Central Business District," of Appendix A, "Zoning," of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Lowell is amended in part as follows:

- D. Residential dwellings, in the same building with commercial uses.
- E. Mixed use developments
- F. Art galleries and museums
- G. Retail stores.
- H. Drug stores and pharmacies.
- I. Restaurants, without drive-through facilities.
- J. Private clubs, fraternal organizations, and lodge halls.
- K. Indoor recreational facilities, excluding bowling alleys.
- L. Child care centers.
- M. Accessory buildings, structures, and uses.
- N. Outdoor merchandise display.

Section 4. Amendment to Section 11.03 of Chapter 11. Section 11.03, "Special land uses," of Chapter 11, "C-2 Central Business District," of Appendix A, "Zoning," of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Lowell is amended in part as follows:

- E. Multiple-family dwellings
- F. Utility and public service buildings, without storage yards, but not including essential public services such as poles, wires, and underground utility systems.

- G. Off-street parking lots.
- H. Short-term rentals

Section 5. Amendment to Section 11.04 of Chapter 11. Section 11.04, 'Site development requirements," of Chapter 11, "C-2 Central Business District," of Appendix A, "Zoning," of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Lowell is amended to read as follows:

SECTION 11.04. - SITE DEVELOPMENT REQUIREMENTS.

No building or structure, nor the enlargement of any building or structure, shall be hereafter erected unless the following requirements are met and maintained in connection with such building, structure, or enlargement.

- A. There shall be no off-street parking located in the front yard of a lot; parking shall be located in the rear or side yard, or as otherwise permitted in Chapter 19.
- B. Buildings must have the primary entrance facing a public sidewalk.

Section 6. Amendment to Section 11.05 of Chapter 11. Section 11.05, "Outdoor merchandise display," of Chapter 11, "C-2 Central Business District," of Appendix A, "Zoning," of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Lowell is amended in part as follows:

- C. No merchandise and related displays shall be located so as to obstruct the sidewalk or otherwise impair the flow of pedestrians.
- D. All merchandise and related displays and fixtures shall be removed and stored indoors at all times when the related business is closed to the public.
- E. The area used for an outdoor merchandise display shall be maintained in a safe, clean, and sanitary manner.

Section 7. Amendment to Section 12.04 of Chapter 12. Section 12.04, 'Site development requirements," of Chapter 12, "C-3 General Business District," of Appendix A, "Zoning," of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Lowell is amended to read as follows:

SECTION 12.04. - SITE DEVELOPMENT REQUIREMENTS.

No building or structure, nor the enlargement of any building or structure, shall be hereafter erected unless the following requirements are met and maintained in connection with such building, structure, or enlargement.

- A. Landscaping shall be provided as required in Section 4.26.
- B. Entrance driveways shall be located as far as practicable from two (2) intersecting streets and shall be at least one hundred (100) feet from an intersection or from any other driveway.
- C. Only one (1) driveway per principal use, or collective principal use, per street shall be permitted. A second driveway may be permitted provided that such drive is constructed and permitted to share access with an abutting or adjacent principal use or existing lot. The planning commission may permit additional driveways, if justified by a professional traffic study indicating the need for such additional driveways.

Section 8. Amendment to Section 12.05 of Chapter 12. Subsection A. of Section 12.05, "Outdoor merchandise display," of Chapter 12, "C-3 General Business District," of Appendix A, "Zoning," of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Lowell is amended to read:

A. The outdoor storage or display of goods or materials shall be prohibited in the required front yard. Goods or materials stored in the side or rear yard shall be screened from the view from the street or from abutting properties.

Section 9. Amendment to Section 12A.04 of Chapter 12. Section 12A.04, 'Site development requirements," of Chapter 12A, "I-L Light Industrial District," of Appendix A, "Zoning," of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Lowell is amended in part as follows:

SECTION 12A.04. - SITE DEVELOPMENT REQUIREMENTS.

- E. No use permitted in this chapter shall create or cause to be created fire and explosion hazards, smoke, fumes, odors, gases, dust, liquid or solid waste, vibration, noise, or glare which shall affect adjoining properties adversely.
- F. Refuse and service areas shall be designed and used so as to maximize motor vehicle and pedestrian safety and convenience, promote ease of traffic flow and to minimize the effects, if any, of smoke, noise, dust, vibration, or odor on adjacent or nearby lands.

L. Vehicle towing service.

Section 11. Amendment to Section 13.04 of Chapter 13. Section 13.04, 'Site development requirements," of Chapter 13, "I Industrial District," of Appendix A, "Zoning," of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Lowell is amended in part to read as follows:

C. Any side yard or rear yard adjoining any lot or parcel of land abutting a residential district or residential use shall be screened by a compact hedge of deciduous or evergreen trees, having such minimum height as determined by the planning

- commission in its review and approval of the site plan under the terms of Chapter 18.
- D. Landscaping shall be provided as required in Section 4.26.
- E. No use permitted in this chapter shall create or cause to be created fire and explosion hazards, smoke, fumes, odors, gases, dust, fumes, liquid or solid waste, vibration, noise, or glare shall exist to affect adjoining residential properties adversely.

Section 12. Publication. After its adoption, the City Clerk shall publish this ordinance or a summary thereof, as permitted by law, along with its date of adoption in the *Lowell Ledger*, a newspaper of general circulation in the City, at least ten (10) days before its effective date.

Section 13. Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect ten (10) days after it, or a summary thereof, as permitted by law, along with the date of its adoption, is published in the Lowell Ledger, a newspaper of general circulation in the City.

RE: Suez Agreement

Our current agreement with Suez to manage our Wastewater Treatment facility is scheduled to expire on June 30, 2020. Suez has reached out to the City, to inquire if we would be interested in extending the current agreement for an additional five years. In November, I approached the Council and was directed to come back with a new agreement. Since that time, Suez's attorney and our attorney have been working on the contractual language.

The current agreement with Suez set the baseline monthly payment for services at \$35,925 per month and annually during the contract would be adjusted by a cost of living index to account for inflation. During the five years of the contract we saw the following increases:

2016: 1.01% 2017: 1.63% 2018: 2.87% 2019: 1.65%

The current amount in Fiscal Year for Suez's services is \$38,490 per month. In Fiscal Year 2021, the price will remain as it is currently. The first cost of living adjustment wouldn't take place until Fiscal Year 2022 (July 1, 2021). The increase for the remaining years of the contract would be the cost of living adjustment.

I am recommending the Lowell City Council approve Resolution 09-20 to renew are our Wastewater Treatment Facility agreement with Suez from July 1, 2020 until June 2025 as presented.

FIRST AMENDMENT TO THE AMENDED AND RESTATED OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN SUEZ WATER ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES INC. AND THE CITY OF LOWELL, MI

This First Amendment to the Amended and Restated Operation and Maintenance Agreement for the Lowell wastewater treatment facilities, (the "Agreement") is effective as of this 16th day of March, 2020 by and between SUEZ Water Environmental Services Inc. ("SUEZ"; formerly named United Water Environmental Services Inc.), with a corporate address at 461 From Road, Suite 400, Paramus, NJ 07652 and the City of Lowell, MI ("Client" and, together with SUEZ, the "Parties"), with an address at 301 E. Main Street Lowell, MI 49331.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, SUEZ and Client are parties to the Agreement, whereby SUEZ provides operation and maintenance services for the Client's wastewater treatment facilities; and

WHEREAS, the Agreement has a five (5) year term of July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the Parties wish to extend the Agreement for an additional term of five (5) years and make additional changes to the terms of the Agreement; and

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants herein contained, the Parties agree as follows:

- 1. Article I, Section 1.04 of the Agreement shall be amended to include:
 - "SUEZ shall notify Client whenever the annual cost of maintenance exceeds the \$12,000 yearly maximum."
- 2. Article I, Section 1.06 of the Agreement shall be amended to include:
 - "SUEZ shall replace any employee of SUEZ employed at the Facilities at the request of Client, provided that such request is provided for cause, is provided in writing, and allows a reasonable opportunity for corrective action. SUEZ shall not, however, be required to take any employment action that would violate any applicable law."
- 3. Article I, Section 1.08 of the Agreement shall be amended to delete the words "and financial transactions" from the first sentence thereof.
- 4. Article II, Section 2.03 of the Agreement shall be amended to read as follows:
 - "SUEZ will provide and maintain at all times during the term of this Agreement the following insurance and limits for losses caused by SUEZ:

- (a) Workers Compensation Insurance in compliance with Michigan law and Employers' Liability with a limit of ONE MILLION DOLLARS (\$1,000,000);
- (b) General Liability Insurance with a combined single limit of TWO MILLION DOLLARS (\$2,000,000), including the broad form property damage endorsement; and
- (c) Automobile Liability Insurance (owned, non-owned, or hired units) with a combined single limit of ONE MILLION DOLLARS (\$1,000,000).

SUEZ will furnish the Client with Certificates of Insurance as evidence that policies providing the required coverages and limits are in full force and effect, and identifying the Client as an additional insured on the General Liability Insurance and Automobile Insurance. Such policies shall provide for no less than thirty (30) days notice of cancellation, termination, or material alteration and notices shall be sent directly to SUEZ and the Client.

SUEZ will maintain property insurance for SUEZ assets located at the Facilities. Such policy shall contain a waiver of subrogation in favor of the Client.

Liability of SUEZ to Client shall be limited to the Base Rate paid to SUEZ during the previous twenty-four (24) months plus the proceeds of applicable insurance required to be maintained by SUEZ pursuant to this Agreement. The foregoing limitation of liability shall not apply to claims of indemnification from third parties."

5. Article III, Section 3.02 of the Agreement shall be amended to read as follows:

"Client is responsible for providing all risk property insurance on the Facilities. Such as risk property insurance shall include a waiver of subrogation in favor of SUEZ. Client shall maintain in full force and effect automobile liability and collision coverage for Client owned, non-owned or hired vehicles. Client shall furnish SUEZ with Certificates of Insurance as evidence that such policies are in full force and effect. Such policies shall provide that no less than thirty (30) days advance notice of cancellation, termination, or material alteration shall be sent directly to SUEZ and the Client. Client may satisfy the requirements in this paragraph through self-insurance. If Client satisfies these requirements with self-insurance, Client shall provide SUEZ with written proof of such self-insurance."

- 6. The terms of Article IV, Section 4.02 notwithstanding, there shall be no annual cost of living adjustment to the monthly compensation due to SUEZ under the Agreement in 2020. Subsequent cost of living adjustments shall be made as described in Section 4.02.
- 7. Article IV, Section 4.09 of the Agreement shall be deleted in its entirety.
- 8. Article V, Section 5.01 of the Agreement shall be amended to read as follows:

"This Agreement shall remain in full force and effect until June 30, 2025 unless earlier terminated per the terms of this Agreement."

- 9. Article VII, Section 7.04 of the Agreement shall be amended to read as follows:
 - "No waiver, discharge or renunciation of any claim or right of either Party arising out of breach of this Agreement by the other Party shall be effective unless in writing signed by the Party waiving, discharging, or renouncing the claim or right."
- 10. The terms of the Agreement remain in full effect, except as explicitly stated herein.
- 11. This First Amendment shall be governed by the laws of the State of Michigan.
- 12. This First Amendment may be signed in any number of counterparts with the same effect as if the signatures thereto and hereto were upon the same instrument.

At this time, both LARA and the City are resubmitting the applications to MDNR for this current year's grant program. Dave Austin from Williams & Works will make a brief presentation after which we will invite public input.

After the public input period, the City will entertain a resolution authorizing the submittal of a grant application for \$300,000 to the 2020 MDNR Trust Fund Program, due April 1, 2020.

I am recommending the Lowell City Council accept the recommendations by the Lowell Area Recreation Authority regarding modifications to the trail plan and approve Resolution 10-20 as presented.

On April 1st, both the City and the Lowell Area Recreation Authority will be submitting updated grant applications to the MDNRR Trust Fund program towards the project that will connect the regional River Valley Rail Trail legs from Belding and from Saranac through the City. At the March 16th meeting, a public hearing will be held and the Council will be asked to consider a resolution authorizing submittal of the revised application. (The applications that were submitted last year by the City and LARA were voluntarily withdrawn as all permits and matching funds were not secured by the October 1st deadline, so reapplication is necessary).

The revised application will show a new proposed route for the portion of the trail east of Hudson St. The original route proposed going through Recreation Park, crossing the Flat River, going under or across the active King Milling railroad spur, then crossing the Grand River with a new pedestrian bridge parallel to the S. Jackson bridge. After review of the formal applications, the railroad concluded that they will not issue permits for the crossing of this spur due to safety and liability concerns. At a recent meeting with the railroad and MDOT, it was determined that the most feasible location to cross the tracks will be at the intersection of Grand River Dr. and S. Hudson (Segwun). This route will require a new pedestrian bridge over the Grand River form the fairgrounds to Gran River Dr. The trail will then proceed east to the connection point at S. Jackson. Conversations are being held with property owners along Grand River Dr. and the railroad to develop the exact alignment.

Since the necessary route has changed, we wanted to update Council before the March 16th meeting and invite any questions or concerns you may have.



Re: LL&P Amended MERS Defined Contribution Plan Adoption Agreement

As you may remember, at the January 21, 2020 City Council Meeting, the City Council approved a LL&P MERS Defined Contribution (DC) Plan Adoption Agreement for all LL&P non-union new hires. At that meeting I stated it was the LL&P Board's goal/intention for all LL&P new hires, not just non-union employees, to one day be enrolled in this DC Plan. I am happy to report that since the January Council Meeting, we have completed negotiations with the bargaining unit which included coming to the agreement that all LL&P union new hires will be enrolled in the same DC Plan (with the same benefit structure) that was approved by the LL&P Board and City Council this past January.

To finalize everything, the LL&P Board at their March 12th Meeting has recommended that the City Council adopt the Amended MERS Defined Contribution Plan Adoption Agreement, which is included in your packet.

It is expressly agreed and understood as an integral and non-severable part of this Agreement that Section 43 of the Plan Document shall not apply to this Agreement and its administration or interpretation. In the event any alteration of the terms or conditions of this Agreement is made or occurs, under Section 43 or other plan provision or law, MERS and the Retirement Board, as sole trustee and fiduciary of the MERS plan and its trust reserves, and whose authority is non-delegable, shall have no obligation or duty to administer (or to have administered) the MERS Defined Contribution Plan, to authorize the transfer of any defined benefit assets to the MERS Defined Contribution Plan, or to continue administration by MERS or any third-party administrator of the MERS Defined Contribution Plan.







Dear Mr. Burns:

On behalf of Suez I am pleased to submit the February Monthly Operating Report for the Lowell Wastewater Treatment Plant. During the month 48.16 million gallons of wastewater were treated, up from 71.38 million gallons the month before.

All NPDES Permit requirements were satisfied. Copies of the Monthly Operating Reports for the month can be seen in Appendix A. Appendix B contains graphs representing how the actual lab results compared to the limits in the NPDES Permit and how the actual plant flows compared to the design flow.

INDUSTRIAL PRETREATMENT PROGRAM

The Fullers Septic February surcharges were \$19.01. No operational problems were experienced at the plant from this discharge.

The Litehouse February surcharges were \$1203.21 for the month. They were assessed one fine for the month for an exceedance of BOD loading limit. No operational problems were experienced at the plant from their discharge.

FEBRUARY EFFLUENT ANALYSIS OVERVIEW

The daily average for CBOD was 6 mg/l, 76% under the NPDES limit of 25 mg/l. The worst 7-day average was 10 mg/l, 75% under the NPDES limit of 40 mg/l.

The daily average for Suspended Solids was 5.7 mg/l, 81% under the NPDES limit of 30 mg/l. The worst 7-day average was 7.9 mg/l, 82% under the NPDES limit of 45 mg/l.

The monthly average for Phosphorus was 0.35 mg/l, the limit is 1.0 mg/l.

The average removal rate for BOD was 96%; a minimum of 85% is required. The average removal rate for Suspended Solids was 94%; a minimum of 85% is required.

The geometric average for fecal coliform bacteria was 118 colonies/100 mls, the limit is 200 colonies/100 mls. The worst 7-day average was 303 colonies/100 mls, the limit is 400 colonies/100 mls.

The highest chlorine residual was 0.037 mg/l; the limit is 0.038 mg/l. The monthly average was 0.023 mg/l.
