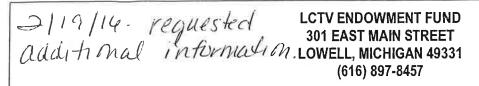
F. LCTV Endowment Board Recommendation.

Report of Grant Activities.

Review

Referring to your original proposal, briefly restate the purpose of the grant (goals and outcomes), the process you used to achieve them, and how the project addressed the evaluation questions you hoped to answer.

The Kent County Youth Agricultural Association wished to purchase three golf carts and a trailer for transport for use at the fairgrounds and other community events. This last year, we were awarded \$3,450 toward the initial request which would have purchased the cart for utility purposes. However, we decided to purchase another golf cart with seats and a grab bar since this type of cart is what fills the greatest need at the fair and in the community. We put the additional funds aside to put towards fulfilling the third cart purchase in 2015. During the first two summers of use, the golf carts were used by the West Michigan Bluegrass Music Association, the Lowell Chamber of Commerce, the Pink Arrow Project, LowellArts!, Lowell High School and the Kent County Youth Fair. These groups would have been charged a rental fee of at least \$125/day for one golf cart. We assessed a rental rate of \$25 for the cart so that we could begin to build a maintenance fund for the cart. We also let several other groups know that the cart was available for use if needed.

The most important outcomes and lessons learned from the project.

The most important outcome of this project is the strengthening of a community bond between organizations in Lowell. By sharing our resources, we build a closer, tight-knit community.

Are there any stories resulting from this project? If so, please share one or two.

We used the golf cart as a courtesy cart for senior citizens and people with handicaps. We offered rides to the restrooms, to and from their car and to any other place on the grounds that may have been difficult to get to We had so many grateful people! It was heart-warming to know how much they appreciated the rides.

How will the outcomes you accomplished in the short-term affect your efforts toward the long-term goals you identified in your proposals?

We advertised with signage in the parking lot and on the grounds – specifically in the handicapped parking areas – so that people knew that the service was available and what number to call to arrange a ride. We saw a significant increase in the number of rides given at the 2014 Kent County Youth Fair. We also will continue to let groups know that the cart is available for the community of Lowell to use.

How are you using and sharing your evaluation results and lessons learned, both internally and externally?

We are developing a plan to keep the cart staffed during the hours of operation for the fair. Having seen how effective this service was during the first two years, we are excited to keep it going and offer greater, more convenient service.

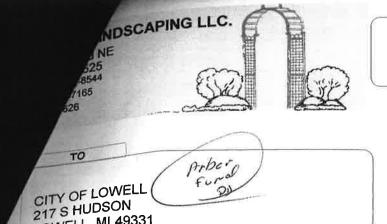

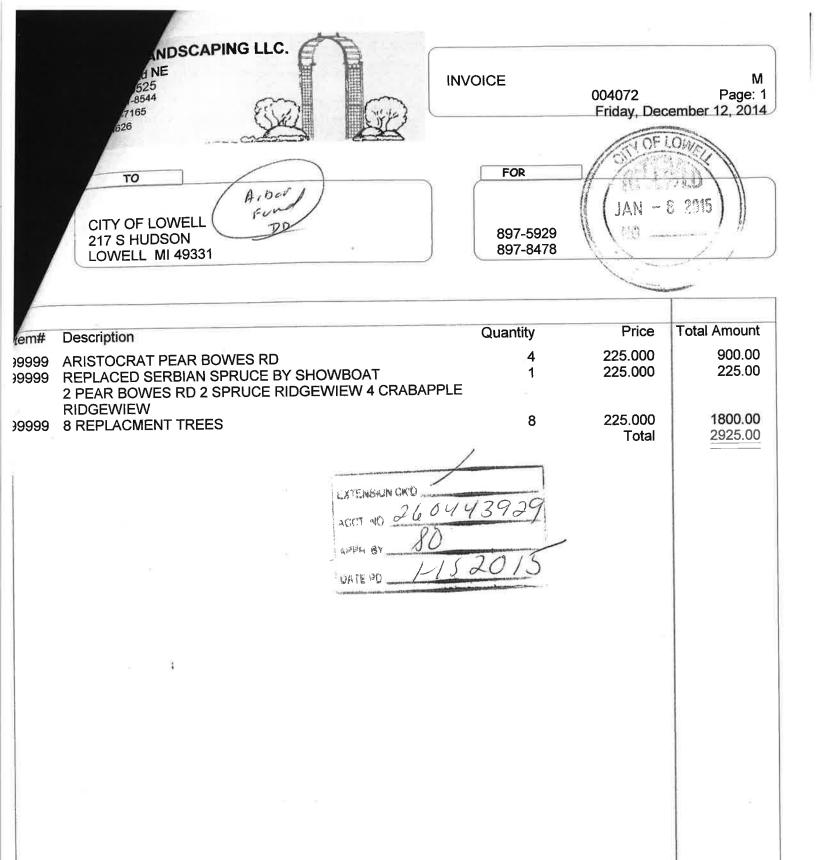
