**6. NEW BUSINESS**

**a. UNITY SCHOOL UPDATE**

Burns informed the commissioners 238 High Street is scheduled for a closing January 28<sup>th</sup> with Unity Schools Investors, LLC. The issue with the 6' of Unity School's building being located on City property will be resolved by the City vacating High Street. The vacated property will then be split 50/50, starting 15' South of where the building extended onto City property. Also the City is waiting for the DNR's approval on the land transfer. This will involve 7' by 263' of City property running north-south in front of Unity Schools in exchange for 10' x 50' of land NE of the boat launch. There will also be an easement documented for the issue regarding the buried electric wires south of High Street.

Beachum was concerned the land transfer was not of equal value. He also was concerned about a proposed fence and landscaping. He felt the fence would be helpful in distinguishing property lines and he would like to see the City continuing to maintain the landscaping.

**b. NEW BASEBALL TEAM**

Czarnecki presented a new baseball team, West Michigan Warriors that would like to practice Sunday afternoons and Thursday evenings at Recreation Park April through the first week of July.

IT WAS MOVED BY MUNDT and seconded by MEIRENDORF to present Council the new agreement for West Michigan Warriors for their approval.
