REQUIREMENTS FOR CANDIDACY:

Candidates applying for office for the City of Lufkin must meet the requirements per Section 141 of the Texas Election Code as shown below: [Click here for the Texas Election Code: \(provide link to the document attached\)](#)

- Be a United States citizen
- Be at least eighteen (18) years of age
- Be a qualified voter of the City of Lufkin for at least six (6) months at the time of filing.
- Be a resident of Texas and the city for at least one (1) year immediately preceding the election.
- Not have been determined by a final judgment of a court to be totally mentally incapacitated, or partially mentally incapacitated without the right to vote. (Texas Election Code)
- Not have been finally convicted of a felony or if so convicted, have been pardoned or otherwise released from the resulting disabilities. (Texas Election Code)

Voter qualifications and registration

To be considered a qualified voter in a City election, a person must:

- Be 18 years of age or older on the day of the election
- Be a United States citizen
- Not have been determined mentally incompetent by a final judgment of a court
- Not have been finally convicted of a felony or, if so convicted, must have: been fully discharged of his sentence, including any term of incarceration, parole, or supervision, or completed a period of probation ordered by any court; or been pardoned or otherwise released from the resulting disability to vote
- Be a resident of the city on the day of the election
- Be a registered voter on the day of the election
