Measles Case Reported in Madison County December 20, 2022

MADISON COUNTY- Madison County Public Health (MCPH) has been notified of a second individual testing positive for measles this week. Both cases are isolated and are linked to the current measles outbreak in Central Ohio.

MCPH has been working closely with our local healthcare providers to provide measles testing, case investigation, contact tracing, and prevention and treatment options. The best protection against measles is measles-mumps-rubella (MMR) vaccine.

Measles symptoms don't appear until 10 to 12 days after exposure. Symptoms can include cough, runny nose, fever, red/watery eyes, tiny white spots inside the mouth, and skin rash. Rash typically starts at the hairline and moves down, with the face breaking out first.
