### PROCLAIMING THE MONTH OF MARCH 2023 AS COLORECTAL CANCER AWARENESS MONTH

WHEREAS, colorectal cancer is the second-leading cause of cancer deaths in the United States among men and women combined;

WHEREAS, colorectal cancer is one of the few cancers that can be prevented with timely screening, but 1 in 3 eligible Americans are not up to date on screening;

WHEREAS, colorectal cancer is estimated to be the number one cancer killer for those ages 20-49 by 2030;

WHEREAS, Black Americans are 20% more likely to be diagnosed with colorectal cancer and about 40% more likely to die from the disease than other groups;

WHEREAS, colorectal cancer is expected to account for 11% of cancer deaths among Hispanic men and 9% of cancer deaths for Hispanic women;

WHEREAS, screening colonoscopy rates have still not returned to pre-COVID-19 levels;

WHEREAS, the national goal established by the National Colorectal Cancer Roundtable is to strive to increase timely colorectal cancer screening rates to 80 percent in every community for all Americans eligible for screening;

WHEREAS, observing Colorectal Cancer Awareness Month during the month of March would provide a special opportunity to increase awareness and offer education on the importance of early detection and screening of colorectal cancer.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor, Township Council and Township Manager of the Township of Mount Laurel, County of Burlington, State of New Jersey do hereby proclaim March 2023 as Colorectal Cancer Awareness Month.

### PROCLAMATION RECOGNIZING RAMADAN AND EID AL-FITR

WHEREAS, Muslims worldwide observe the month of Ramadan through prayer, fasting, self-reflection and acts of charity to remember the first revelation of the Quran to the prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him); and

### ORDINANCE TO ACQUIRE BLOCK 204, LOT 1.06 FOR MUNICIPAL PURPOSES

WHEREAS, Mount Laurel Township seeks a new facility to house municipal services, functions and employees; and

WHEREAS, the Township has considered multiple options including purchasing properties around the existing municipal complex for construction or rehabilitation as well as renting and/or purchasing office space in the Township; and

WHEREAS, the land and building at Block 204, Lot 1.06, known as the 750 Centerton Road, is a vacant office building with approximately 70,000 square feet of office space; and

WHEREAS, Township official toured this building and believe its represents the most economical option to rehome municipal services with enough space for future growth; and

WHEREAS, the Township seeks to purchase the property for this purpose following due diligence; and

WHEREAS, the Township of Mount Laurel is duly authorized and empowered to acquire real property for public use by purchase, gift, condemnation or otherwise, pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution of the State of New Jersey and N.J.S.A. 20:3-1 et seq., the Local Lands and Buildings Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:12-1 et seq., as amended and supplemented, and other applicable statutes; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:12-3 specifically states a municipality may acquire, construct and maintain such buildings or other capital improvements as may be necessary and suitable for the performance of its functions, the accommodation of the courts required to be held in the municipality, the conduct of public business and the use of the municipal departments, officers, boards, commissions and agencies in charge of institutions and facilities and any other municipal public purposes, and from time to time as necessary, repair, alter, enlarge, rebuild, furnish, refurnish, refurnish or rehabilitate such buildings; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:12-4 further provides a municipality may acquire real property or any interest therein, including easements; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:12-5(a) (1) permits municipalities by Ordinance to acquire real property by traditional arms-length transaction acquisition or via condemnation; and

WHEREAS, the Township may purchase lands for public uses including, municipal roads and office spaces is traditionally held as a legitimate public purpose; and

WHEREAS, it is the Township's desire to acquire the property to utilize the same for municipal office and court purposes for the public's benefit; and

WHEREAS, the Township has determined that it has a sufficient funds available to undertake the acquisition after negotiations with the property owner; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED, by the Township Council of the Township of Mount Laurel, County of Burlington, State of New Jersey that Block 204, Lot 1.06 on the Tax Map of the Township of Mount Laurel, commonly known as 750 Center on Road, Mount Laurel, land and all remaining improvements, be and is hereby authorized to be acquired in fee simple by regular land sale or via eminent domain if necessary. Said acquisition is to be undertaken to foster additional office space for municipal and court services; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that said authorization shall include the right to acquire and execute any easements, cross-access agreements, maintenance agreement and the

#### **ORDINANCE 2023-5**

BOND ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ACQUISITION OF CERTAIN REAL PROPERTY IN AND FOR THE TOWNSHIP OF MOUNT LAUREL, COUNTY OF BURLINGTON, NEW JERSEY; APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF \$6,000,000 THEREFOR; AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS OR BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MOUNT LAUREL, COUNTY OF BURLINGTON, NEW JERSEY, IN THE AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF UP TO \$5,700,000; MAKING CERTAIN DETERMINATIONS AND COVENANTS; AND AUTHORIZING CERTAIN RELATED ACTIONS IN CONNECTION WITH THE FOREGOING

BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Council of the Township of Mount Laurel, County of Burlington, New Jersey (not less than two-thirds of all the members thereof affirmatively concurring), pursuant to the provisions of the Local Bond Law, Chapter 169 of the Laws of 1960 of the State of New Jersey, as amended and supplemented, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-1 et seq. ("Local Bond Law"), as follows:

Section 1. The purpose described in Section 7 hereof is hereby authorized as a general improvement to be made or acquired by the Township of Mount Laurel, County of Burlington, New Jersey ("Township").

Section 2. It is hereby found, determined and declared as follows:

- (a) the estimated amount to be raised by the Township from all sources for the purposes stated in Section 7 hereof is \$6,000,000;
- (b) the estimated amount of bonds or bond anticipation notes to be issued for the purposes stated in Section 7 hereof is \$5,700,000; and
- (c) a down payment in the amount of \$300,000 for the purposes stated in Section 7 hereof is currently available in accordance with the requirements of Section 11 of the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-11.

Section 3. The sum of \$5,700,000, to be raised by the issuance of bonds or bond anticipation notes, together with the sum of \$300,000, which amount represents the required down payment, are hereby appropriated for the purposes stated in this bond ordinance ("Bond Ordinance").

Section 4. The issuance of negotiable bonds of the Township in an amount not to exceed \$5,700,000 to finance the costs of the purposes described in Section 7 hereof is hereby authorized. Said bonds shall be sold in accordance with the requirements of the Local Bond Law.

Section 5. In order to temporarily finance the purposes described in Section 7 hereof, the issuance of bond anticipation notes of the Township in an amount not to exceed \$5,700,000 is hereby authorized. Pursuant to the Local Bond Law, the Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the bond anticipation notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver the same to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their date to delivery thereof. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the bond anticipation notes pursuant to this Bond Ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the bond anticipation notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

Ordinance which may be used for the payment of interest on such obligations, accounting,

engineering, legal fees and other items as provided in Section 20 of the Local Bond Law, *N.J.S.A.* 40A 2-20, shall not exceed the sum of \$1,200,000.

Section 7. The improvements hereby authorized and the purposes for which said obligations are to be issued; the estimated costs of each said purpose; the maximum amount of obligations to be issued for each said purpose; the maximum rate of interest the obligations are to bear; and the period of usefulness of each said purpose within the limitations of the Local Bond Law are as follows:

Section 8. Grants or other monies received from any governmental entity, if any, will be applied to the payment of, or repayment of obligations issued to finance, the costs of the purposes described in Section 7 above.

Section 9. The average period of useful life of the purposes for the financing of which this Bond Ordinance authorizes the issuance of bonds or bond anticipation notes, taking into consideration the respective amounts of bonds or bond anticipation notes authorized for said several purposes is not less than 40 years.

Section 10. The supplemental debt statement provided for in Section 10 of the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-10, was duly filed in the office of the Municipal Clerk prior to the passage of this Bond Ordinance on first reading and a complete executed duplicate original thereof has been filed in the Office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. The supplemental debt statement shows that the gross debt of the Township, as defined in Section 43 of the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-43, is increased by this Bond Ordinance by \$5,700,000.

Section 11. The full faith and credit of the Township are irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on the bonds or bond anticipation notes authorized by this Bond Ordinance, and to the extent payment is not otherwise provided, the Township shall levy ad valorem taxes on all taxable real property without limitation as to rate or amount for the payment thereof.

Section 12. The applicable Capital Budget of the Township is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this Bond Ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith, and the resolution promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended applicable Capital Budget and Capital Program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Municipal Clerk and available for inspection.

Section 13. The Township hereby declares its intent to reimburse itself from the proceeds of the bonds or bond anticipation notes authorized by this Bond Ordinance pursuant to Income Tax Regulation Section 1.150-2(e), promulgated under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended ("Code"), for "original expenditures", as defined in Income Tax Regulation Section 1.150-2(c)(2), made by the Township prior to the issuance of such bonds or bond anticipation notes.

Section 14. To the extent that any bonds or bond anticipation notes authorized pursuant to this Bond Ordinance are issued as tax-exempt obligations, the Township hereby covenants as follows:

(a) it shall take all actions necessary to ensure that the interest paid on the bonds or bond anticipation notes authorized by the Bond Ordinance is exempt from the gross income of the owners thereof for federal income taxation purposes, and will not become a specific item of tax preference pursuant to Section 57(a)(5) of the Code;

(b) it will not make any use of the proceeds of the bonds or bond anticipation notes or do or suffer any other action that would cause the bonds or bond anticipation notes to be "arbitrage bonds" as such term is defined in Section 148(a) of the Code and the Regulations promulgated thereunder; it shall calculate or cause to be calculated and pay, when due, the rebatable arbitrage with respect to the "gross proceeds" (as such term is used in Section 148(f) of the Code) of the bonds or bond anticipation notes; it shall timely file with the Ogden, Utah Service Center of the Internal Revenue Service, such information report or reports as may be required by Sections 148(f) and 149(e) of the Code; and it shall take no action that would cause the bonds or bond anticipation notes to be referred guaranteed within the meaning of Section 149(b) of the Code. Section 15. The improvements authorized hereby are not current expenses and are improvements that the Township may lawfully make. No part of the cost of the improvements authorized hereby has been or shall be specially assessed on any property specially benefited thereby. Section 16. All ordinances, or parts of ordinances, inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency. Section 17. In accordance with the Local Bond Law, this Bond Ordinance shall take effed twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final passage.
