**MOUNT LAUREL ADOPTS BUDGET WITH NO MUNICIPAL TAX INCREASE**

*Mount Laurel, NJ* — The 2021 Mount Laurel Township Municipal Budget was adopted this past Monday with a zero municipal tax increase.

“Services will continue to be provided for residents despite last year’s unpredicted pandemic” stated Mayor Steglik. “The budget is fiscally responsible and keeps the tax payer in mind without increasing the financial burden of residents”.

The makeup of a resident’s tax bill includes 12% for Township services. These services include police and animal control services, EMS & the Office of Emergency Management, trash removal and disposal, and snow removal. Additional services include Public Works duties such as pot hole repairs, maintenance of parks, Township events, debt services, and newsletters for residents.

“While the Township did lose revenue from the tourism industry, Township council and management worked diligently to look for cost savings in the budget that would not impact cuts to services” stated Deputy Mayor Pritchett. “We are proud to continue to deliver these services to Mount Laurel residents”.
