Tax Assessor

TOTALLY DISABLED VETERANS (100% PERMANENT AND TOTAL)

If you are a 100% permanently and totally disabled veteran (or their surviving spouse), and have a 100% rating issued by the office of Veteran's Affairs, you may be eligible for property tax exemption. The basic requirements are honorable discharge, a 100% permanent and total disability rating certification from the VA and primary residence in the property applied for. Along with the application form, applicants must supply a copy of the DDForm214 or discharge papers, a deed to the property showing applicant as owner, proof of residency in the home, and a copy of a current NJ Driver's License. The application is available on line at the Mount Laurel Township web site or contact Dennis DeKlerk, Assessor at ddeklerk@mountlaurel. com or 856- 234-0001 x1256 or x1257.

VETERAN TAX DEDUCTION

Veterans can apply for a yearly tax deduction of \$250.00. To qualify you must be a NJ resident, be on the deed as an owner of the property, have an honorable discharge and be able to provide a DDForm214 or discharge papers. Applications are available on the Mount Laurel Township web site or you can contact the Assessor's Office

SENIOR CITIZEN OR DISABLED PERSON TAX DEDUCTION

Any resident property owner who qualifies can receive an annual deduction from their property taxes if you are a Senior Citizen (65 or over) or Disabled Person. For approved applicants a \$250.00 per year deduction is applied to the property tax bill. NJ State guidelines limit household income to qualify. Social Security or government pensions can be excluded, but any income outside of that is capped at \$10,000.00 per year. Applications are available on the Township website or the Township Assessor's Office.

TAX ASSESSMENTS AND IMPROVEMENTS

If you have a construction permit for a new home, or improvement to your existing home, the Tax Assessor's Office is required to inspect the work to determine whether or not an added assessment is in order. Each new home, or completed improvement that is taxable is added to the township tax system by an added assessment. Added assessments are issued in October and are retroactive to the date of completion. Tax bills for that period are issued in October as well. Prior to billing, the Assessor's Office will send an Added Assessment notice informing you of the additional property value, description of work, number of months and estimated supplemental tax. Added assessment inspections commence the first week in May and will continue through September. The inspector will speak to you at the time of inspection or leave a contact number to verify the work.

■ Please note the 2023 2nd quarter property taxes will be due on May 1st, 2023. Any tax payments received after Wednesday, May 10th, 2023 will accrue interest back to May 1st, 2023.

**For those residents who are currently enrolled in the "Senior Freeze" Property Tax Reimbursement program and have received your booklet in the mail, you may stop by our office during business hours to have your application completed. They are to be returned to the State of New Jersey no later than October 31st, 2023. Please note the following require a zoning permit:

- Fences
- Decks
- Pools
- Dumpster (\$25 fee)

Note that pool permits are required for in-ground, above-ground and on-ground pools capable of containing over 24 inches of water.



WEEK: MAY 21st-27th, 2023

We would like to recognize the efforts of our emergency medical service personnel who have self-sacrificed and placed themselves in harm's way to answer our communities' needs under adverse conditions. These members were on the frontline in response to Covid 19, where they worked long hours, were exposed to many occupational hazards, and still carry the tragic memories of personal interactions. While we have become more accustomed to handling Covid 19, this crisis has led to another challenge in our industry with recruiting and retaining adequate staffing to provide emergency medical services 24/7/365. During these times, our members time and time again have stepped up and answered the call. To further recognize their efforts, following is information about EMS Week.

In 1974. President Gerald Ford authorized EMS Week to celebrate EMS practitioners and the important work they do in our nation's communities. National **Emergency Medical Services Week** brings together local communities and medical personnel to honor the dedication of those who provide the day-to-day lifesaving services of medicine's frontline. EMS Week is presented by the American College of Emergency Physicians (ACEP) in partnership with the National Associations of **Emergency Medical Technicians** (NAEMT). Together, NAEMT and ACEP lead annual EMS Week activities. These organizations are working to ensure that the important contributions of EMS practitioners in safeguarding the health, safety and well-being of their communities are fully celebrated and recognized.

During his tenure with the township, he helped to build a combination volunteer and career emergency medical services department and coordinated the effort to build a model emergency management program, including the design and construction of a local emergency operations center. Fran also served as the President of the Burlington County First Aid Council, as a Burlington County EMS Coordinator, and on various county Public Safety Committees. Prior to coming to Mount Laurel, Fran accumulated extensive work and leadership experience, where he worked EMS for both Camden City and Newark. He retired from public service after 36 years. NATIONAL POLICE WEEK OCCURS EVERY MAY. IN 1962, PRESIDENT KENNEDY PROCLAIMED MAY 15 AS NATIONAL PEACE OFFICERS MEMORIAL DAY AND THE CALENDAR WEEK IN WHICH MAY 15 FALLS, AS NATIONAL POLICE WEEK. ESTABLISHED BY A JOINT RESOLUTION OF CONGRESS IN 1962, NATIONAL POLICE WEEK PAYS SPECIAL RECOGNITION TO THOSE LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS WHO HAVE LOST THEIR LIVES IN THE LINE OF DUTY FOR THE SAFETY AND PROTECTION OF OTHERS.

Mount Laurel Office of Emergency Management

At the beginning of 2023, the Mount Laurel Office of Emergency Management (MLOEM) reorganized to appoint new Deputy Coordinators, and to modify the organizational structure of the Office to reflect compliance with directives issued by the New Jersey Office of Emergency Management.

Mount Laurel Police Chief JudyLynn Schiavone and Douglas Dickel were appointed by Township Council as MLOEM Deputy Coordinators. They join Emergency Management Coordinator Jay Appleton and Deputy Coordinator Christopher Burnett (Mount Laurel Fire/EMS Chief) as the leadership team responsible for all aspects of MLOEM operations. The primary responsibilities of the Emergency Management Coordinator and the MLOEM leadership team are established by state statute, and include the following:

- Planning, activating, and conducting emergency management operations within the Township
- Proclaiming a state of local disaster emergency when warranted

- Developing and maintaining a Township Hazard Mitigation Plan
- Implementing the relevant provisions of the Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act
