U.S. Environmental Protection Agency Reviews Cleanup at Johnson and Towers Superfund Site

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is conducting its **first** Five-Year Review of the **Johnson and Towers Superfund site** located in Mount Laurel Township, Burlington County, New Jersey. This review seeks to confirm the No Further Action remedy for soils and a No Action remedy, with monitoring, for groundwater selected in the 2008 Record of Decision (ROD), which was based upon EPA's and the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection's (NJDEP) determination that no remedial action was necessary to be protective of human health and the environment. In accordance with New Jersey regulations, an institutional control, in the form of a groundwater Classification Exception Area (CEA), was established for the site until contaminant concentrations are below drinking water standards.

A summary of these activities and evaluation of the protectiveness of the remedy will be included in the upcoming Five-Year Review report. **The report is scheduled to be completed by December 15, 2019.**

What is an EPA Five-Year Review?

EPA inspects Superfund sites every five years to ensure that cleanups conducted remain fully protective of human health and the environment. These regular reviews, which are required by federal law when contaminants remain at a site, include:

- Inspection of the site and cleanup technologies;
- Review of monitoring data, operating data, and maintenance records, and
- Determining if any new regulatory requirements have been established since EPA's original cleanup decision was finalized.
